



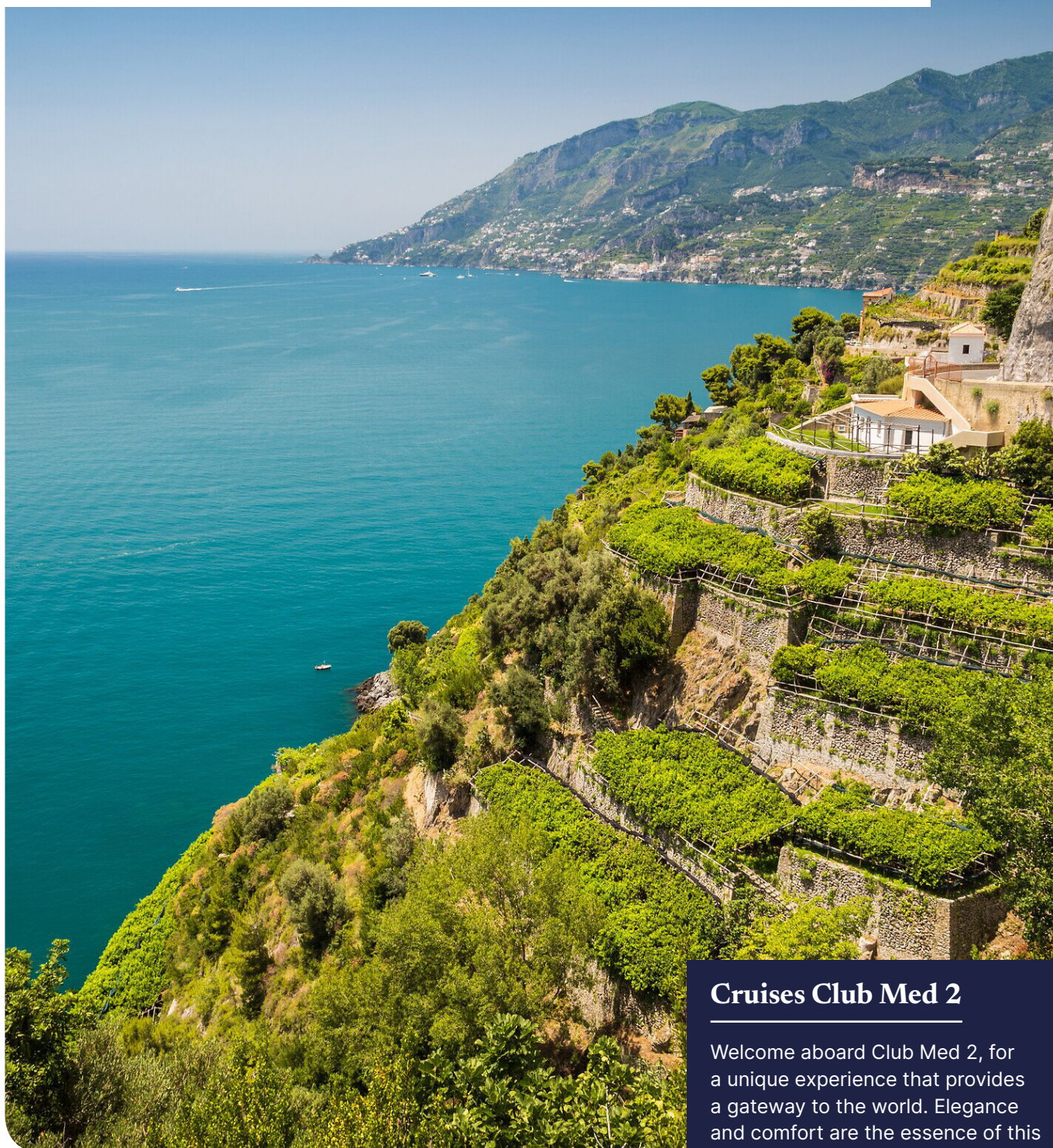

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Itinerary of your cruise

Day 1 - Saturday CIVITAVECCHIA/ROME	Located just outside Rome, the coast was originally edged with luxurious villas built by the emperors Tiberius and Marcus-Aurelius. You will transfer by bus from the port of Latium to the Eternal City, where you will be free to explore the wonders of the Italian capital at your own pace. Boat docked, dive locker closed, stopover without beach. Boarding and disembarkation port of call.
Day 2 - Sunday SANTA MANZA	The Gulf of Santa Manza has retained its untouched natural beauty. Its chalk cliffs soar above crystal clear waters while the colours of the scrub-covered hills contrast with the turquoise blue sea for a unique wild and unspoilt destination. Boat at anchor, beach, dive locker closed.
Day 3 - Monday PONZA	Whether for Circe the goddess of magic or for the sheer beauty of the island, Ulysees spent a full year here. This large volcanic rock poised on divine waters has a wild and intimate nature. Ship at anchor, water sports available, no direct access to a beach.
Day 4 - Tuesday NAPLES	One of the finest bays in the world, dominated by Vesuvius, an emblem of romanticism. The city centre is a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Ship docked.
Day 5 - Wednesday SORRENTE	Dazzlingly beautiful, from a strategic position dominating the coast, unique views of vineyards and terraced gardens of citrus trees along the jagged Bay of Naples. Ship docked, no water sports and no direct access to a beach.
Day 6 - Thursday AMALFI	A maritime republic with a splendid promenade and a cathedral with numerous secret, metaphysical symbols, Amalfi has a host of assets: wonderful nature and plenty of panoramic views of the fabulous coastline. Boat at anchor, no water sports and no direct access to a beach.
Day 7 - Friday LIPARI	The island's volcanic origins have forged the most astonishing landscapes. Invaded time and again, its citadel reveals the island's multi-faceted personality through the multiple influences of its architecture. Ship at anchor. No Water sports.
Day 8 - Saturday PALERME	The historic centre holds an irresistible fascination for visitors. The civilisations that helped weave its history have left their mark on the sun-scorched stones and the shady little streets. Boat docked, no water sports and no direct access to a beach. Passengers boarding and disembarking at this port of call.



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Excursions of your cruise

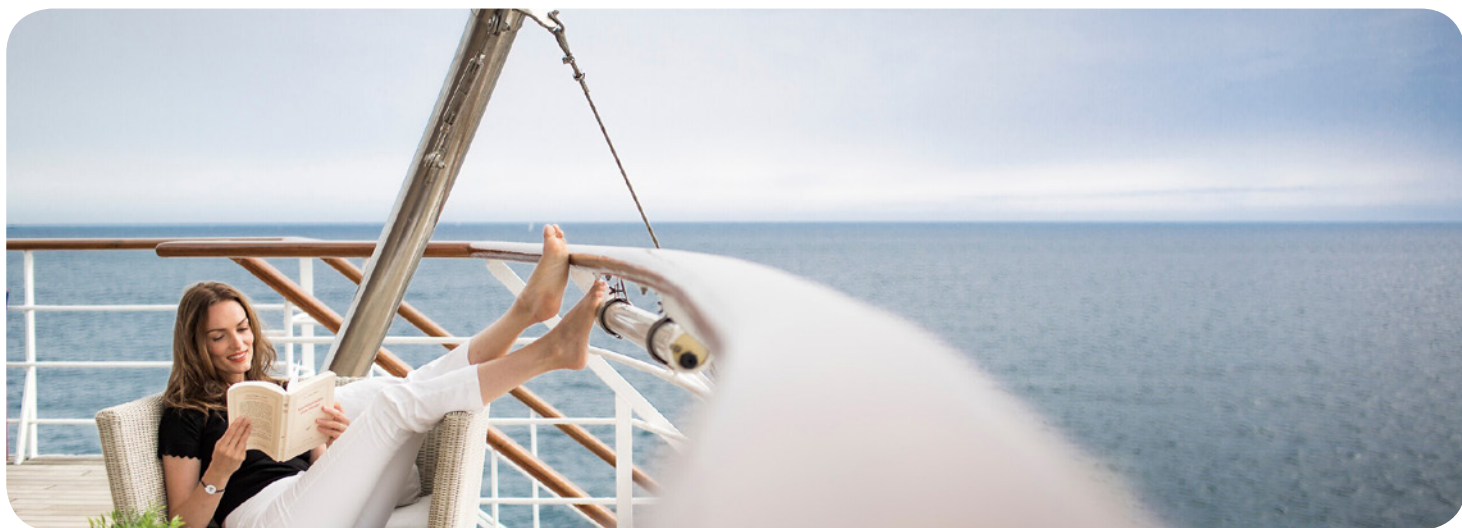
Day 4 - Tuesday NAPLES - HERCULANUM (1/2 day - morning)*	Despite its lack of facilities, the city of Herculaneum attracted rich people from Campania and Rome thanks to its location and amazing views over the Bay of Naples. Life there stopped in AD 79 following the eruption of Vesuvius which covered the city in a layer of ash. Here, you can see the public buildings such as the baths and the shops including the bakery whose oven and millstones were preserved, but above all the many Roman houses, some which still feature splendid decorations. Marble paving, mosaics and paintings bring the city back to life.
Day 4 - Tuesday NAPLES - PANORAMIC TOUR OF NAPLES (1/2 day, afternoon)*	You'll begin the tour at Mergellina and Posillipo Hill, famous for their panoramic view over the Gulf of Naples. You'll then go on to Castel Nuovo, symbol of the city's architecture. The bus will take you to the Royal Palace, the outside façade of which is studded with statues of the King of Naples. You'll pass via the Teatro San Carlo, one of the oldest opera houses in Europe, and have free time in the Piazza Plebiscito before going back to the ship.
Day 4 - Tuesday NAPLES - POMPEI (1/2 day)*	The town was a flourishing community with over 25,000 inhabitants when it met with catastrophe on 24 August in the year 79 CE. Its inhabitants were killed by the eruption of Vesuvius as they went about their everyday lives, and a shroud of cinders kept the site almost intact. As well as the incredible collection of monuments, homes, works of art and furnishings that the excavations have uncovered, the site reveals daily life in ancient times in stunning detail.
Day 5 - Wednesday SORRENTO - POSTCARD OF CAPRI (1/2 day, morning)*	Board a jetfoil to Capri, then board the funicular to enjoy some free time in the beautiful town of Capri. You will take advantage of these 2 hours on the rock to explore the city at your leisure; the Via Camerelle, a famous shopping street, or the central square known as Piazzetta. This excursion includes a 30-minute speedboat crossing of the Bay of Naples, as well as a return funicular ticket to access the upper town. Possibility of large queues at the funicular during the summer period.
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Day 6 - Thursday AMALFI / POSITANO BY BOAT AND AMALFI*	Embark on your cruise to Positano, the prettiest of the coastal towns where Moorish houses cling to the cliffs in front of a sparkling little bay. Formerly a forgotten fishing village, it is now a popular resort area. After some free time in the village, you will continue sailing towards Amalfi, a village with white houses leaning against the rocks and flanked by an ancient Saracen tower. Your guide will take you to admire the splendid 11th-century Cathedral of Saint Andrew, covered in colourful stones, before enjoying some free time to explore it on your own.
Day 6 - Thursday AMALFI / RAVELLO (1/2 day - morning)*	Let Ravello's charm sweep you off your feet. This little town is crammed full of ancient monuments and looks out onto the Gulf of Salerno, giving it a beauty that has inspired countless poets, painters and musicians. You can see the Duomo and main square, and visit the Villa Rufolo. Richard Wagner stayed there and admired the great beauty of the gardens - now it's your turn to enjoy them.
Day 8 - Saturday PALERMO/HIDDEN PALERMO (1/2 day)*	Your destination is Palermo, the city of contrasts. After travelling along the city's main streets, you'll discover the magnificent Baroque-Rococo church of Saint Catherine where almost every surface is covered with paintings, cherubim, decorative marbles and colors Martorana church, with its golden Byzantine mosaics and brightly coloured frescoes. Then you'll see the bustle of the old town as you wander through the local Ballar market. You'll really feel the contrasts as you pass noisy stalls laden down with produce before reaching a truly dignified palazzo. The owners themselves, descendants of an old noble family, will take you on a tour, guiding you through the reception rooms and corridors to show you the very best of Sicilian architecture and heritage. At the end of the tour, the owners we will invite you to try some of Palermo's specialities.
Day 8 - Saturday PALERMO / PALERMO AND MONTREALE (1/2 day)*	Visit the breathtaking city of Palermo. Founded by the Phoenicians, it was a Roman trade hub and a Muslim city before being conquered by the Normans. Later it became the capital of the Kingdom of the Two Sicilies until reunification with Italy. You'll visit the cathedral, dedicated to the Assumption and marked by the use of highly contrasting architectural styles, and wander through the old town to see its many churches and extravagant fountains. Then you'll head to Monreale to discover the jaw-dropping interior of its cathedral, with an incredible brightly coloured mosaic covering 6340 square metres, depicting scenes of Christ and the Apostles. (excursion requiring the European Covid/ Green Pass digital certificate)

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Formalities

CUSTOMS FORMALITIES

For all UK citizens, a valid passport is essential when you travel abroad. A full 10-year passport is required for holidays to all countries featured on our website. The passport must be valid for at least 6 months beyond your return date with one blank visa page. Make sure your passport is valid and check with the embassy or the consulate of your destination country if you need a visa for your chosen destination prior to travel. It is vital that the name given when booking your holiday (printed on the ticket and itinerary) is exactly the same as written on your passport. Any child, however old, must have his/her own passport. Please note Club Med cannot be held responsible for any issue with regards to passport or visas.

HEALTH FORMALITIES

Safe Together.

Club Med has implemented new hygiene and safety measures to offer you peace of mind and a most joyful experience.

As part of the fight against Covid-19, health measures at the borders are being reinforced and may in particular require a virological screening test (for example PCR test) depending on your country of origin, transit or destination before your departure and/or before your return.

We suggest you obtain more information from the consular services of the countries concerned or on the website of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of your nationality and/or place of residence.

Recommended vaccinations: diphtheria, polio, tetanus, hepatitis A and B and typhoid.

Pregnant women who do not need constant medical supervision may come aboard, upon presentation of a medical certificate showing their due date and certifying that their pregnancy is compatible with the cruise.

The final day of the cruise must be before the end of the 26th week of pregnancy.

A doctor and a nurse are present on board.
