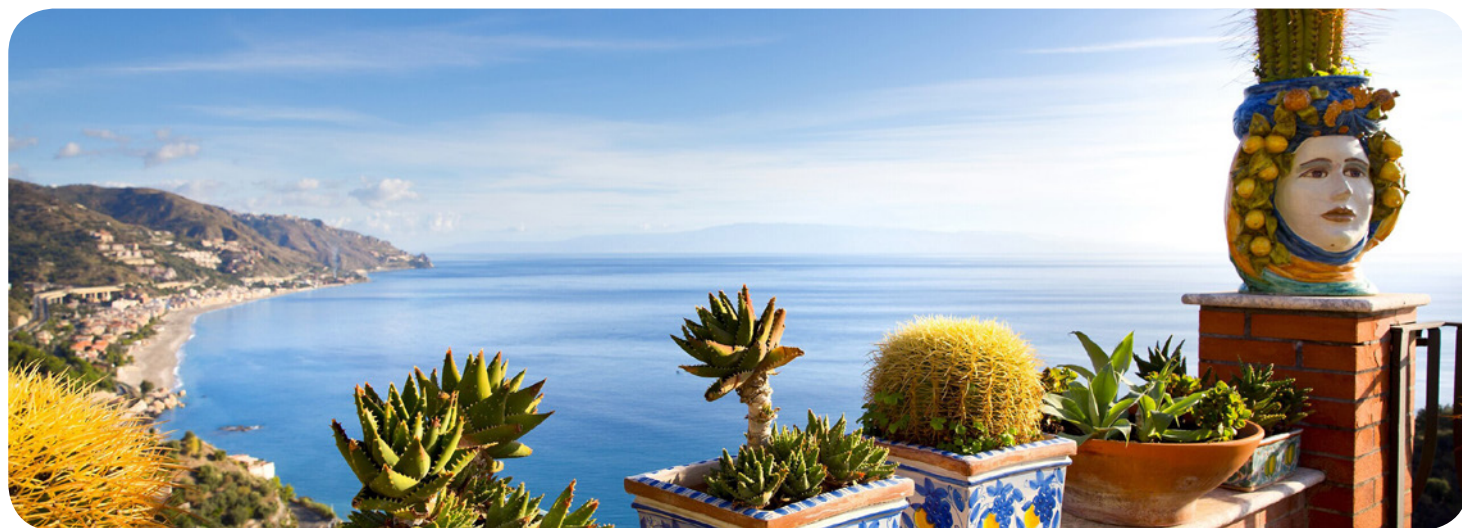

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Itinerary of your cruise

Day 1 - Saturday CORFOU	A coveted location at the gateway to the Adriatic, beautifully green mountains with creeks of white sand and a Venitian-style fortified town give it its own quite unique identity. Ship docked in port. Passengers boarding and disembarking at this port of call.
Day 2 - Sunday SAILING ON THE OPEN SEA	A restorative day at sea. Choose from the range of inviting possibilities on our remarkable sailing ship. Lounge on chaise longues, cool off in one of our two swimming pools, work out with a sea view in our Espace Fitness, find instant calm at the spa and enjoy the attentive company of our G.O® team and crew members.
Day 3 - Monday ZADAR	This peninsular city, known for its Roman and Venetian ruins, holds two thousand years of history within its walls: a Roman forum, baroque treasures, Romanesque churches as well as its ancient fortifications. Ship docked, no water sports.
Day 4 - Tuesday VENISE	The City of Water is a fascinating blend of architectural styles, its soul intimately woven into its labyrinth of narrow streets and canals, its palaces and bell towers, squares and churches. Ship docked.
Day 5 - Wednesday SIBENIK	Known as being the first city founded by the Croatian people, today, it is famous for the Cathedral of Saint James, a true work of art listed as a World Heritage site by UNESCO. The heart of the city with its little stone streets leads us straight to this picture postcard image. Ship docked, no water sports.
Day 6 - Thursday DUBROVNIK	The ramparts provide a fabulous view over the sublime city centre, where every stone tells a story. The marble pavements and city lights contribute to the animation of this museum-city. Ship at anchor. Beach.
Day 7 - Friday KOTOR	At the end of Europe's largest fjord, which stretches a full 30 kms (19 miles) inland, and towering some 300 yards over the sea, the fortifications of Kotor protect this city, marked by the stamp of Venetian architecture. Ship docked in port.
Day 8 - Saturday SAILING ON THE OPEN SEA	A restorative day at sea and choose from the range of inviting possibilities on our remarkable sailing ship.
Day 9 - Sunday TAORMINE	Perched on Mount Tauro, the town seems to gaze out over the magnificent bays and the majestic Mount Etna. It boasts a fascinating historical heritage including the ancient Greco-Roman theatre. Boats at anchor, water sports.
Day 10 - Monday POSITANO	Window onto the Tyrrhenian sea. A chic, mythical resort on the Amalfi coast, you can admire the colourful houses of this famous village, standing out on the cliff face as the ship approaches the coast.
Day 11 - Tuesday CIVITAVECCHIA/ROME	Located just outside Rome, the coast was originally edged with luxurious villas built by the emperors Tiberius and Marcus-Aurelius. You will transfer by bus from the port of Latium to the Eternal City, where you will be free to explore the wonders of the Italian capital at your own pace. Boat docked, dive locker closed, stopover without beach.
Day 12 - Thursday PORTO ERCOLE	This Italian fishing port is the refuge of some of Italy's most powerful families and Hollywood stars intent on keeping out of the public eye. With its imposing fortresses built by the Spaniards in the 15th century, ancient buildings in ochre hues and narrow streets decked with colourful flowers, this Italian village oozes with charm.
Day 13 - Thursday NICE	From markets to the uber famous Promenade, it cultivates a love of flowers and the arts. It is full of vitality with ambiances that range from neoclassical elegance to the up-beat tempo of the old quarter. Boat docked, no water sports. Boarding and disembarkation port of call.



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Excursions of your cruise

Day 1 - Saturday CORFU / VILLA ACHILLEION*	Discover Gasturi, a small village near the coast, in a region associated with Empress Sissi. Empress Elisabeth of Austria (Sissi) dedicated her Achilleion Villa to her favourite hero, Achilles, who, in Sissi's words: "represents the Greek soul, the beauty of the land". Achilleion was built between 1889 and 1891 by the Italian architects Carito and Landi. You can admire this luxurious two-storey villa's frescos, sculptures and superb gardens. The architecture is a mixture of Pompeian and Neo-Classical. Please note that the villa is closed for renovation, you will visit its beautiful garden. For the morning tour, return to the airport directly at 12.25pm. For the afternoon tour, from 3.30pm to 7.00pm.
Day 3 - Monday ZADAR - HISTORIC ZADAR (1/2 day, morning)*	1/2 day. Visit on foot. Shoulders and knees must be covered. The guided visit of the historic city centre of Zadar will introduce you to the cultural centre of former Dalmatia, with monuments such as the Church of St Donat, the Cathedral of St Anastasia and the famous "Gold and Silver of Zadar", a remarkable collection of sacred art and religious paintings. Plus free time to pursue the visit at your own pace.
Day 3 - Monday ZADAR - THE KRKA WATERFALLS (1/2 day, morning)*	A beautiful excursion in the heart of nature! A bus will take you to Krka National Park, one of the natural wonders of Croatia, with exceptional flora and fauna - 860 species of plants and 222 different bird species make it one of the most fascinating ornithological parks in Europe. The park has 7 spectacular waterfalls that the River Krka has hollowed out of the karstic plateau. The Skradinski Buk, the largest travertine waterfall in Europe, has an average rate of flow of 55 cubic metres/second. During the guided tour, you'll have a view over the falls from Stradinski Buk, before going on to visit a traditional watermill and museum of ethnology. You'll have free time for shopping or refreshments or to follow a narrow path that takes you closer to the falls. You'll be able to swim in the lower part of the falls, so don't forget to take a swimsuit and towel. The bus will take you back to the boat.
Day 3 - Monday ZADAR - THE PLITVICE LAKES NATIONAL PARK (day)*	1 day. Bus and walk. You must wear trainers or other comfortable footwear A natural wonder in the heart of Croatia, the famous Plitvice Lakes National Park is half way between Zadar and Zagreb. The park was declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1979. Stretching over 17 kms (10 miles), this string of 16 fabulously crystal clear blue-green lakes flow into each other amid a staggering concert of 92 waterfalls. The visit is done in two phases, each one a leisurely hour long allowing you to admire the beauty of this natural wonder. 20-minute boat transfer between the two visits. Late lunch.
Day 4 - Tuesday VENICE - BURANO AND TORCELLO (1/2 day, afternoon)*	1/2 day. Transfer by boat and visit on foot. Covering a surface area of 550 sq km, the Venice Lagoon, the largest in Italy, is part of the confluence of rivers flowing from the Alps and the Apennines. Venice and some 40 other islands occupy almost 4,000 hectares of the lagoon. You'll leave by boat to discover the largest islands in the northern sector. Torcello was a prosperous island in the 6th century, with a population of 20,000. Today it has 60 inhabitants and the Cathedral of Santa Maria Assunta as sole vestige of its former splendour. Founded in 639, the cathedral is the oldest building in the lagoon. You'll also visit Burano, the most colourful of Venice's islands, on which fishing and lace-making remain the main sources of revenue. In the 16th century, Burano lace was so fine it was known as "punto in aria" (open or guipure lace).
Day 4 - Tuesday VENICE - THE WONDERS OF VENICE (1/2 day, morning)*	Half day. Transfer by boat and walking tour. The guided tour focuses on the area around St Mark's Square, the heart of Venice - the Basilica, the bell tower and the Doges Palace are all miracles of architecture, colour and light. You'll visit the Doges Palace, with its Byzantine, Gothic and Renaissance styles, designed to impress foreign dignitaries by their splendour. You'll visit St Mark's, one of the finest churches in the world, with its mosaics, fabulously sculpted main portal, and famous bronze horses. It is an incomparable mix of Oriental and Western influences, a perfect illustration of the very close ties linking Venice and Byzance. We recommend you wear comfortable shoes. Shoulders and knees must be covered and large bags or rucksacks are not allowed inside.
Day 5 - Wednesday SIBENIK / ŠIBENIK HISTORICAL AND PANORAMIC (1/2 day, morning)*	You will start your visit with a beautiful view looking down on the city of Šibenik from the top of Barone Fortress. You will then continue your visit on foot through the narrow, paved streets of the old town and visit the monumental 15th century Cathedral of St. Jacob, a masterpiece of Gothic/Renaissance architecture.
Day 5 - Wednesday SIBENIK / ŠIBENIK AND THE KRKA FALLS (1/2 day, morning)*	You will travel by bus to Krka National Park, one of Croatia's natural wonders. The Park is exceptionally abundant in fauna and flora: 860 species and subspecies of plants have been identified and 222 species of birds live there, making it one of the richest reserves in Europe. In the Park you will get to see the series of 7 spectacular waterfalls that the Krka River has dug into the karst plateau. During the guided tour, you will take in the view of the Krka Falls from the great Skradinski Buk plateau and then visit a traditional watermill and the Ethnological Museum. At the end you will have some free time.
Day 6 - Thursday DUBROVNIK / DALMATIAN COASTAL DELICACIES*	Get a taste of Croatia by discovering the real delicacies of the Dalmatian coast: mussels, oysters and olive oil. After a pleasant bus ride along the Adriatic coast, your first stop is the village of Orasac. Here, olive oil is still produced the old-fashioned way. Continue on to the small town of Ston, the oyster capital of Croatia. This little town is often called "little Dubrovnik", as it too is surrounded by magnificent ramparts dating from 1317 and completed in the 16th century. Continue on to Mali Ston and board a local boat that will take you to oyster and mussel beds. Your host will welcome you on board and introduce you to the local oyster and mussel industry. You'll have the opportunity to taste freshly harvested shellfish.
Day 6 - Thursday DUBROVNIK / DUBROVNIK AND CAVTAT (1 day)*	You'll visit this "only city in the world made of stone and light" on foot. Afterwards, you'll head for the Zupa coast and continue into the hinterland. A typical lunch awaits you in Konavle. Then you'll discover Cavtat, an ancient coastal town founded by the Greeks, which has retained all the charm of an old-fashioned Côte d'Azur port. Enjoy a stroll along the seafront or a swim before returning to Dubrovnik. Comfortable shoes. Bathing suit and towel weather permitting.

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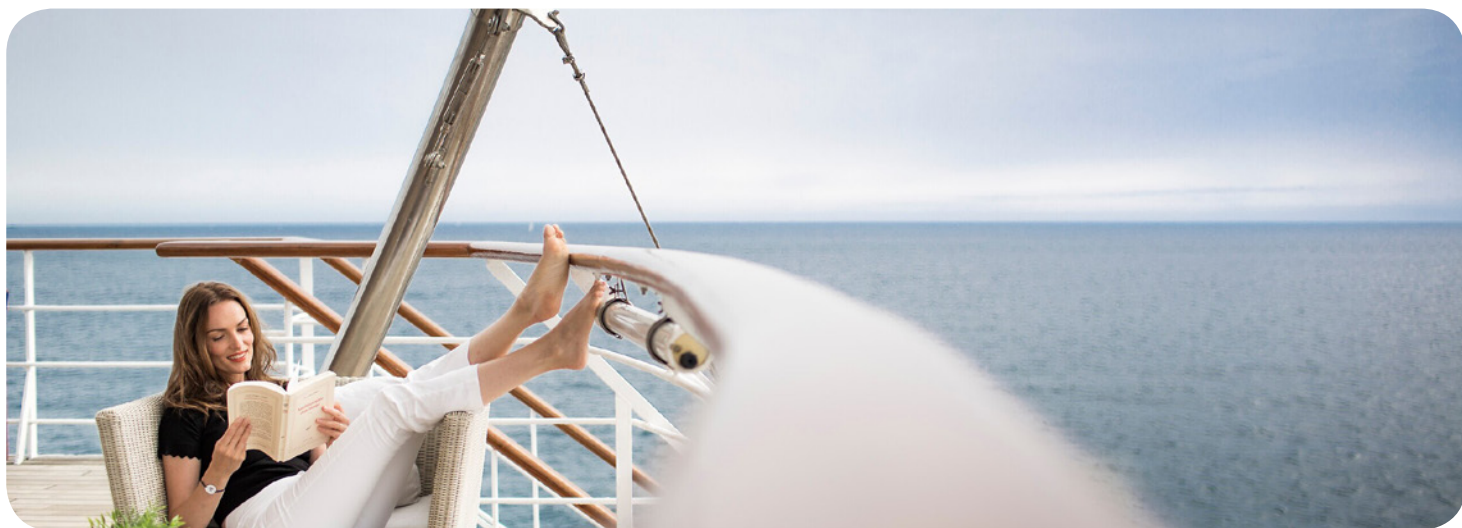
Day 6 - Thursday DUBROVNIK - MEDIAEVAL CITY (1/2 day, morning)*	The excursion begins with a panoramic bus tour to a spot where you'll have a wonderful view of the city, followed by a walking tour of "the only city in the world made of stone and light". You'll feel the vibrations of History at every step: the 17th century Baroque cathedral, the Franciscan monastery with its cloister - a masterpiece of 14th century architecture that houses the oldest pharmacy in Europe, dating from the Middle Ages and still in operation -, and the magnificent Palace of the Rectors. You'll walk down the Placa (or Stradun), the main street of the historic city centre, where the 4-storey houses and archways are also made of the same light-coloured stone.
Day 6 - Thursday DUBROVNIK - THE ROOFTOPS OF DUBROVNIK (1/2 day - morning)*	Your tour begins with a walking through the main street Stradun to the entrance to the city walls. Heading up high you'll cover a distance of over 1½ miles as you circumnavigate the walls that completely encircle the old town. Along the way your guide will enlighten you with the interesting history of the city and provide plenty of facts and figures about the construction of the walls. Discover the true beauty of old Dubrovnik as you see towers, forts and bastions, along with far reaching views of the countryside, the coast and the charming red rooftops below. Afterwards, enjoy some free time for independent sightseeing and shopping, before the return back to the ship. NOTE: This tour involves many steps some of which may be slippery. There are no handrails. Sunscreen, hats and flat comfortable walking shoes are recommended.
Day 7 - Friday KOTOR AND PERAST (1/2 day, morning)*	A bus will take you to Perast, a venerable maritime city on the Bay of Kotor. From there, you will board a boat to the charming little baroque church on the islet of Gospa od Skrpjela. Then you will return to Kotor's old town, where you will visit the St-Tryphon cathedral and the maritime museum
Day 9 - Sunday GIARDINI NAXOS / ETNA AND TAORMINA (1 day - lunch not included)*	You'll drive through Giardini Naxos, founded by the Greeks in the 8th century BC, before going on to Etna. From the slopes of the famous volcano you'll have a wonderful view over the Gulf of Catania. You can admire the profusion of plants that thrive on the slopes of the volcano (vines, orchids, etc) before going on to Taormina, where you'll be free to enjoy lunch and stroll at your own pace.
Day 9 - Sunday GIARDINI NAXOS / IN THE FOOTSTEPS OF GODFATHER FILM*	You will take the coastal road to reach Savoca, a village saddled between two hills. Its scenic beauty and its historical and artistic heritage make it one of the most attractive - although unknown - places around Taormina. You will end up in the village of Forza d'Agro a charming little village where in 1990 Al Pacino and Sophia Coppola came here when they shot some scenes for the movie "The Godfather III". Walking with stairs - traffic/road restrictions, limited participation.
Day 11 - Tuesday CIVITAVECCHIA - BAROQUE ROME (1 day - lunch not included)*	Accompanied by a guide, you'll admire the famous Fontana di Trevi and Piazza di Spagna, from which you have a wonderful view of the Chiesa della Trinita dei Monti. Piazza Navona is another must, which gets its unusual shape from its origin as the Domiziano stadium. Free time for lunch and a stroll through the city, or more sightseeing. This excursion includes 3 hours drive round trip and 3km of walking tour. Please note that for the 29th June and 6th July, return directly to airport.
Day 11 - Tuesday CIVITAVECCHIA / IMPERIAL ROME (1 day- free lunch)*	This guided tour offers you the unique opportunity to discover one of the oldest buildings in Rome, symbol of the Eternal City: the Colosseum! After a tour through the Roman remains of the capital, visiting the Arch of Titus and the Roman Forum, you will visit the interior of the Colosseum, heart of the Imperial City during the time of Augustus! Then you have a free afternoon to have lunch and stroll through the alleys or choose to visit somewhere else, perhaps Santa Maria Maggiore? One of the four patriarchal basilicas. PLACES LIMITED. (Entrances to the Colosseum subject to quota, subject to confirmation by the local authorities 90 days in advance). This excursion involves a 3-hour drive.
Day 11 - Tuesday CIVITAVECCHIA / ROME VATICAN (1 day - free lunch)*	Follow your guide through this labyrinth of chambers and galleries that make up the famous Vatican Museums, admire a selection of art treasures collected by the Popes over the centuries, and marvel at Michelangelo's impressive Last Judgment adorning the ceiling of the Sistine Chapel. Then discover the largest church in the world: Saint Peter's Basilica and its splendid square and surrounding columns. A free afternoon in the Vatican district allows for lunch and a stroll through the alleys, or to visit another site of your choice. PLACES LIMITED. (Entrances to the Vatican Museums subject to quota, subject to confirmation by the local authorities 60 days in advance). This excursion involves a 3-hour drive and the guided tour is entirely on foot with many stairs. For information : restoration works started in St. Peter Basilica due to the 2025 Jubilee. For this reason "La Pietà" and "Il Baldacchino" are now covered with pannels. Works are expected to be finished by November.
Day 12 - Thursday PORTO ERCOLE / WALKING TOUR*	Discover the old part of the city center on foot, including a few steps to reach the church of Sant'Erasmo, the local Patron Saint. Follow your guide through the fishing port to the ancient borgo, one of the best preserved in Italy. Discover its noble palaces and walk in the footsteps of Caravaggio. The artist, whose real name was Michelangelo Merisi, went to Porto Ercole and died there, which is why he is honored by the town hall of Monte Argentario. End your visit with a tasting of typical Tuscan biscuits, Tozzetti toscani.

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Formalities

CUSTOMS FORMALITIES

For all UK citizens, a valid passport is essential when you travel abroad. A full 10-year passport is required for holidays to all countries featured on our website. The passport must be valid for at least 6 months beyond your return date with one blank visa page. Make sure your passport is valid and check with the embassy or the consulate of your destination country if you need a visa for your chosen destination prior to travel. It is vital that the name given when booking your holiday (printed on the ticket and itinerary) is exactly the same as written on your passport. Any child, however old, must have his/her own passport. Please note Club Med cannot be held responsible for any issue with regards to passport or visas.

HEALTH FORMALITIES

Safe Together.

Club Med has implemented new hygiene and safety measures to offer you peace of mind and a most joyful experience.

As part of the fight against Covid-19, health measures at the borders are being reinforced and may in particular require a virological screening test (for example PCR test) depending on your country of origin, transit or destination before your departure and/or before your return.

We suggest you obtain more information from the consular services of the countries concerned or on the website of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of your nationality and/or place of residence.

Recommended vaccinations: diphtheria, polio, tetanus, hepatitis A and B and typhoid.

Pregnant women who do not need constant medical supervision may come aboard, upon presentation of a medical certificate showing their due date and certifying that their pregnancy is compatible with the cruise.

The final day of the cruise must be before the end of the 26th week of pregnancy.

A doctor and a nurse are present on board.
