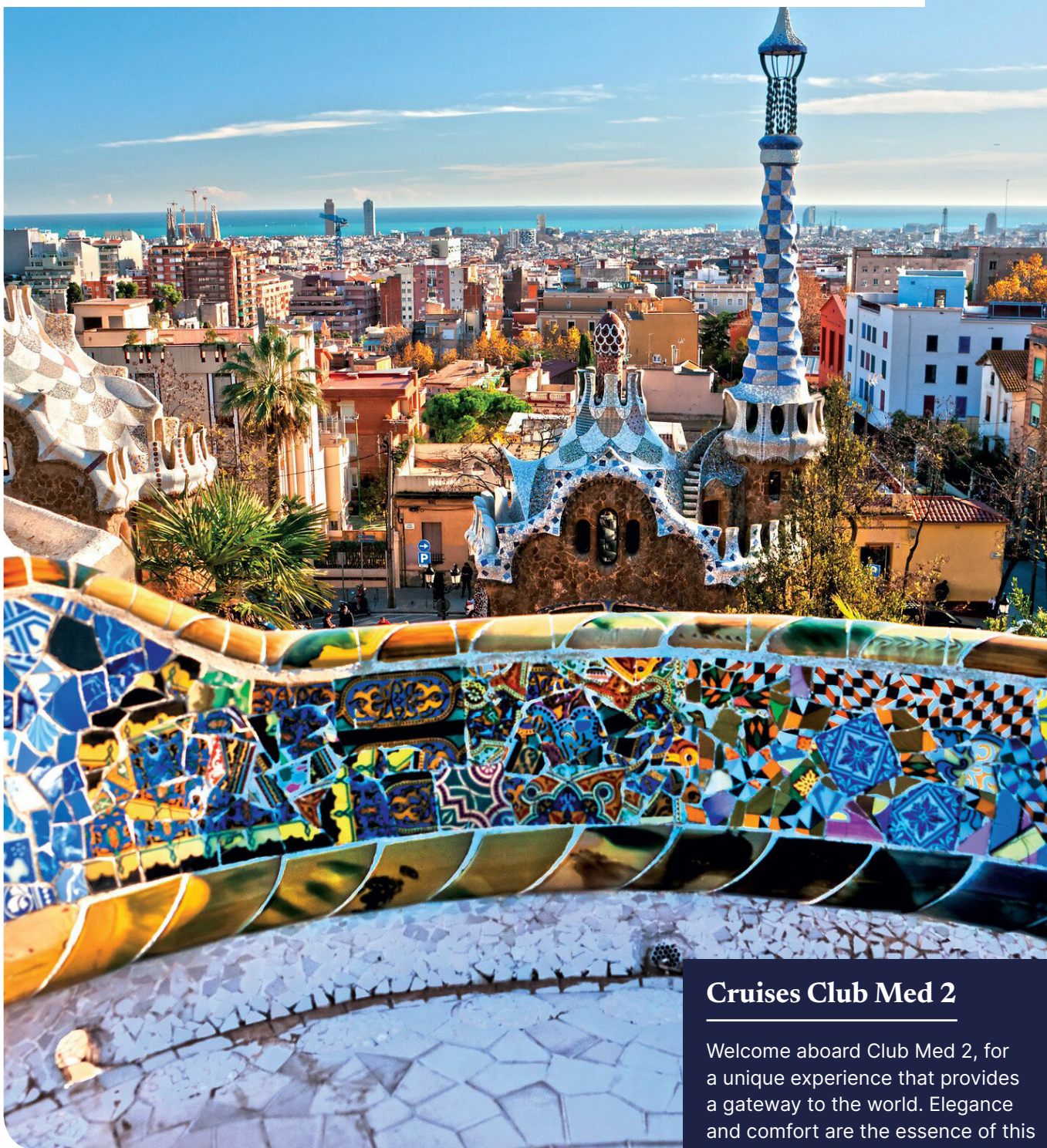

| <b>Day 1 - Monday</b><br>NICE         | From markets to the uber famous Promenade, it cultivates a love of flowers and the arts. It is full of vitality with ambiances that range from neoclassical elegance to the up-beat tempo of the old quarter. Boat docked, no water sports. Boarding and disembarkation port of call.                                     |
| <b>Day 2 - Tuesday</b><br>SÈTE        | Located between the Mediterranean and the Étang de Thau, famous for its oysters, Sète is also known as the "Venice of the Languedoc" because of its network of canals. It has retained its old world charm thanks to the ports located in the heart of the city. Boat docked, dive locker closed, stopover without beach. |
| <b>Day 3 - Wednesday</b><br>BARCELONE | Barcelona is a vibrant cocktail of tradition and avant-garde, where culture and fun combine to ensure a fabulous stay. By night or day, the Ramblas and the barrios are a feast for the senses. Ship docked, no water sports and no direct access to a beach.   |
| <b>Day 4 - Thursday</b><br>IBIZA      | The world's disco capital is also a moving testimony to the civilisations that took inspiration from the incredible beauty of the light and landscapes, to leave the most fabulous architectural heritage. Ship docked.   |
| <b>Day 5 - Friday</b><br>CARTHAGÈNE   | Brightly coloured Andalusian houses enliven Cartagena, an arid former mining city with a special Mediterranean charm. Many cultures have made Cartagena home over the centuries, leaving behind a rich artistic history that is still visible today.  |
| <b>Day 6 - Saturday</b><br>MALAGA     | Cosmopolitan Andalusia has 300 days of sunshine a year. It's also a major landmark in the history of Cubism - you can visit the house where Picasso was born and the museum with over 200 of his works. Ship docked in port.  |
| <b>Day 7 - Sunday</b><br>CADIZ        | The oldest city in the West, boasting more than 3,000 years of history and prosperity, witnessed Christopher Columbus leave for the New World. Always cheerful and full of Andalusian character. Boat docked, dive locker closed, no direct access to the beach.  |

| <b>Day 2 - Tuesday</b><br><b>SETE / THAU CANALS</b><br><b>AND POND (2 hours)*</b>   | <p>Come and see the city of Sète from another angle! Navigate the calm waters of the canals to the characteristic district of Pointe Courte and admire the different styles of facades that give the city its charm.</p> <p>This crossing via the maritime canal and the fixed and swing bridges will take you to the lake of Thau, a real inland sea of over 20 kilometres, to learn about the breeding of oysters and mussels.</p>  |
| <b>Day 2 - Tuesday</b><br><b>SETE / BAL.XBOAT ET</b><br><b>DEGUSTATION*</b>   | <p>Embark aboard your RIB to visit the rocky coast, the Mediterranean Sea, the city's canals with passage under bridges, the Pointe Courte district and the Bassin de Thau with its shellfish parks. Fully commented ride by the Sète captain (only in French) in a 12-seater speed boat, stop in an authentic shellfish farm with tasting of oysters and white wine at the Saint Pierre by Tarbouriech farmhouse. Not recommended for people with back pain and pregnant women.</p>  |
| <b>Day 3 - Wednesday</b><br><b>BARCELONA /</b><br><b>BARCELONA: GOTHIC</b><br><b>AND GASTRONOMIC</b><br><b>(1/2 day - morning)*</b> | <p>The Gothic Quarter of Barcelona combines many ancient Roman and medieval buildings; in the centre of this old city, on Plaça Sant Jaume, you will find the palace of the presidency.</p> <p>Crossing Las Ramblas, you will then head to the La Boqueria market, a traditional local market with special charm where you will get to taste a local specialty.</p> <p>You will pass by the well-known Plaça Real, or Royal Square, then continue your walk to the El Born district, considered the new city centre during the 13th and 14th centuries, and visit one of the most symbolic churches of the Gothic era: Santa Maria del Mar.</p>   |
| <b>Day 3 - Wednesday</b><br><b>BARCELONA /</b><br><b>BARCELONA: GUELL'S</b><br><b>LEGACY (1/2 day</b><br><b>- afternoon)*</b>       | <p>This half-day tour will give you the opportunity to explore the architectural heritage of one of Barcelona's most famous architects: Antoni Gaudí (1852 - 1926).</p> <p>A visit to Paseo de Gràcia, this lively and trendy boulevard considered the centre of modernist Barcelona, is a visit to a real open-air museum, with architectural treasures from the 19th century that includes two of Gaudí's masterpieces: Casa Batlló (built in 1877) and La Pedrera (built between 1906 and 1910).</p> <p>You will marvel at the magnificence and originality of La Sagrada Família (Church of the Holy Family/ exterior visit) before finishing your tour in the heart of Guell Park overlooking the capital.</p> |
| <b>Day 4 - Thursday</b><br><b>IBIZA / HISTORICAL</b><br><b>IBIZA (1/2 day, morning)*</b>  | <p>With your local guide, discover the old city of Ibiza. From its rock, the city dominates the port with the Fort and Cathedral. You will enjoy the beautiful wall from the 16th century, the elegant houses and steep stairs. (the Cathedral is closed on Mondays and may be closed without notice if services)</p>   |
| <b>Day 5 - Friday</b><br><b>CARTAGENA / MURCIA</b><br><b>(1/2 day, morning)*</b>  | <p>After a panoramic tour of the city of Murcia, discover the Francisco Salzillo museum and examine the incredible detail of his terracotta religious artworks. After a walking into historical Murcia, discover El Real Casino de Murcia (Royal Casino of Murcia) is an emblematic building in the city of Murcia. Its unique architecture combines modernist and eclectic artistic styles, and the beauty of the building awakes the admiration of all visitors.</p>  |
| <b>Day 5 - Friday</b><br><b>CARTAGENA /</b><br><b>CARTAGENA (1/2 day,</b><br><b>morning)*</b>                                       | <p>in progress</p>  |
| <b>Day 6 - Saturday</b><br><b>MALAGA / MALAGA</b><br><b>AND PICASSO (1/2 day)*</b>  | <p>You will take a trip around the historic and modern centre of Malaga. You will pass by the Cathedral, a very beautiful example of Spanish Renaissance architecture, before going to the Picasso museum which tells the story of 80 years the artist's work, who was a native of Malaga. Your guide will teach you how to understand his works, from the most famous to the most obscure.</p>   |
| <b>Day 6 - Saturday</b><br><b>MALAGA / GRANADA</b><br><b>(1 day)*</b>   | <p>Granada's Islamic history has bequeathed a marvel of Muslim art, the Alhambra. Dominating the modern city, Andalusia's most emblematic monument is at once a royal city, a fortress and a palace dating back to the 13th century. Near the palace, you'll also discover the marvellous Andalusian gardens of the Generalife, former country residence of the emirs (2h30 drive one way). This excursion will take place from 12.30 pm to 8.30 pm. Passport number required for registration and PI required for entry to the Alhambra. Places limited to 20 people and non-refundable. French guide. Sold out.</p>   |
| <b>Day 7 - Sunday</b><br><b>CADIZ ON FOOT (1/2 day,</b><br><b>morning)*</b>   | <p>Discover the oldest city in Europe and its fabulous historic monuments including the Piazza d'Espana and Calle Antonio Lopez, full of interesting architectural features. After a panoramic bus tour, you will visit the cathedral overlooking Campo del Sur. To conclude this guided tour, you will access Tavira Tower where a panoramic and amazing view of the city of Cadiz will reward you for your efforts.</p>   |
| <b>Day 8 - Monday</b><br><b>LISBON / SECRETS</b><br><b>OF ALFAMA (1/2 day,</b><br><b>morning)*</b>                                  | <p>Your guided tour will lead you through Alfama's little streets to discover the history of this very old neighbourhood. You will see Lisbon cathedral, built in the 12th century, the Moorish walls of the Castle of São Jorge, and enjoy the best views of the city. (Entry to sites mentioned in the programme is included).</p>  |
| <b>Day 8 - Monday</b><br><b>LISBON / DO RE MI</b><br><b>FADO (1 evening)*</b>   | <p>Indulge your senses with dinner in one of the most popular Casas de Fado in Lisbon. Step inside a palatial former Renaissance home, and discover the melancholy folk songs with plucked string accompaniment that make up this traditional Portuguese genre.</p>   |

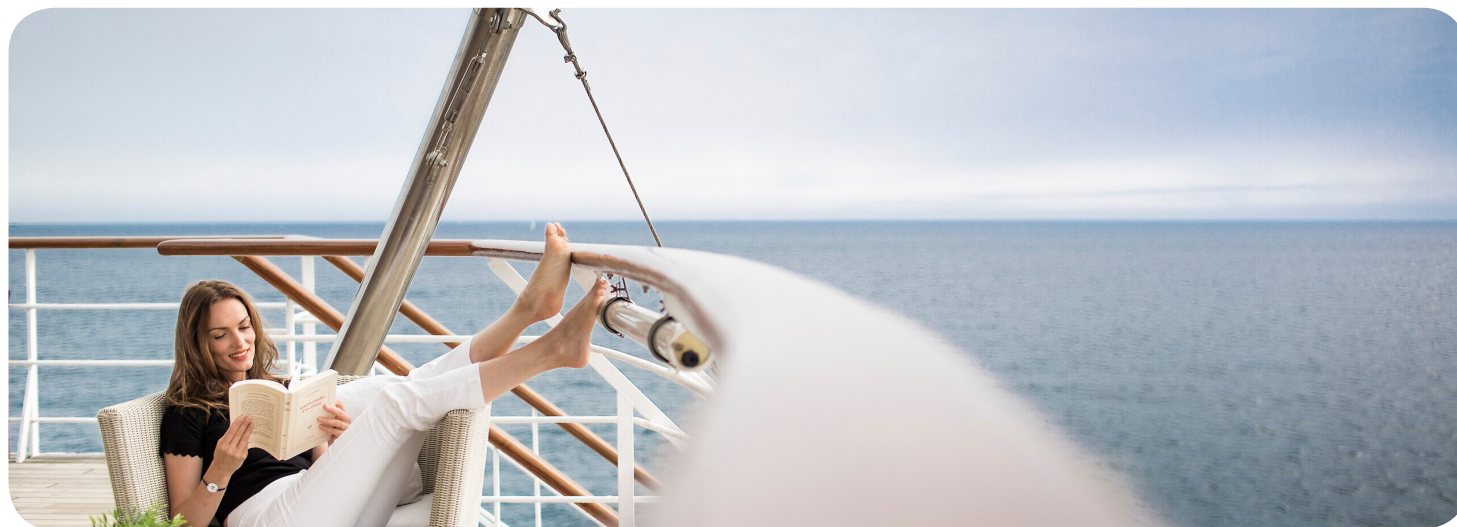

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## Formalities

### CUSTOMS FORMALITIES

For all UK citizens, a valid passport is essential when you travel abroad. A full 10-year passport is required for holidays to all countries featured on our website. The passport must be valid for at least 6 months beyond your return date with one blank visa page. Make sure your passport is valid and check with the embassy or the consulate of your destination country if you need a visa for your chosen destination prior to travel. It is vital that the name given when booking your holiday (printed on the ticket and itinerary) is exactly the same as written on your passport. Any child, however old, must have his/her own passport. Please note Club Med cannot be held responsible for any issue with regards to passport or visas.

### HEALTH FORMALITIES

Safe Together.

Club Med has implemented new hygiene and safety measures to offer you peace of mind and a most joyful experience.

As part of the fight against Covid-19, health measures at the borders are being reinforced and may in particular require a virological screening test (for example PCR test) depending on your country of origin, transit or destination before your departure and/or before your return.

We suggest you obtain more information from the consular services of the countries concerned or on the website of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of your nationality and/or place of residence.

Recommended vaccinations: diphtheria, polio, tetanus, hepatitis A and B and typhoid.

Pregnant women who do not need constant medical supervision may come aboard, upon presentation of a medical certificate showing their due date and certifying that their pregnancy is compatible with the cruise.

The final day of the cruise must be before the end of the 26th week of pregnancy.

A doctor and a nurse are present on board.
