





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Itinerary of your cruise

Day 1 - Thursday POINTE À PITRE	Spices, flowers, fish and fruit, the local markets abound with colour and exotic produce from this generous island paradise. Passengers boarding and disembarking at this port of call. Ship docked in port.
Day 2 - Friday LA DOMINIQUE	This lush volcanic island, home to the last Caribbean Indians, has almost as many rivers as there are days in the year. Mother Nature reigns supreme. At anchor. Water sports, no beach.
Day 3 - Saturday ST LUCIA	This proud volcanic island is a pillar of ecology, with its two majestic rocky peaks swathed in green and its lovingly preserved surroundings. Ship at anchor, water sports available (no snorkelling), beach.
Day 4 - Sunday LA BARBADE	The Atlantic Ocean and the Caribbean Sea make for a fascinating contrast on this small coral island: Its wild, green northern face contrasts with the azure blue waters of the south and their specific fauna and flora. Ship docked, no water sports and no direct access to a beach.
Day 5 - Monday GRENADE	This small island territory is home to fragrant nutmeg, cinnamon and vanilla. A succession of colonial influences has left a fascinating heritage of architectural curiosities. Ship at anchor, no water sports, no direct access to a beach.
Day 6 - Tuesday TRINIDAD	Trinidad has a strong identity, due to a unique human mix of Indians, Africans, Spaniards, British, Chinese, Persians and even French, and is considered to be the birthplace of calypso, soca and steel band, whose influence on world music has been considerable. Boats docked, nautical hall closed.
Day 7 - Wednesday TOBAGO CAYS	A dazzling array of blues on the most beautiful coral reef in the Grenadines. Tropical fish sport the most fascinating colours in these crystal clear waters. Ship at anchor, water sports available (no water skiing), beach.
Day 8 - Thursday MAYREAU	The smallest of the Grenadine Islands has just one little village, surrounded by idyllic beaches with the finest sand, crystal clear waters and multicoloured tropical fish. Ship at anchor, water sports available (no water skiing), beach. Private beach for the Caribbean Beach Club.
Day 9 - Friday BEQUIA	The largest of the Grenadine islands boasts a surface area of 18 sq kms, and a major role in the history of whaling. Its winding roads reveal stunning views of the surrounding islands and tropical forest. Ship at anchor, water sports available (no water skiing), beach.
Day 10 - Saturday FORT-DE-FRANCE	The largest of the French West Indian towns blends cosmopolitan style and local colour, with its urban lifestyle, colourful markets, metal architecture and charming old houses. Stopover for boarding and disembarking. Ship docked in port.



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Excursions of your cruise

Day 2 - Friday DOMINICA / INDIAN RIVER (1/2 day)*	Dominica has many springs and waterfalls. A rowing boat will take you through tree ferns, wild hibiscus and kapok trees with fabulous roots, to a small bar where you'll be served a "Dynamite", the most explosive cocktail in Dominica.
Day 3 - Saturday ST LUCIA / ISLAND TOUR (1/2 day - afternoon)*	You'll discover the island's colonial past when we stop at St Mark's House in Castries. You'll have some amazing views of the island's lush vegetation as we drive along the Caribbean coast. We'll visit a former plantation, Morne Coubaril Estate, a gift from Louis XIV to the Deveaux family. To the present day the family's descendants produce sugar cane, copra, coconuts and manioc. And you'll discover La Soufrière with its fascinating geological activity, before getting back onto the boat in Soufrière Bay. CM2 will sail in the afternoon without guest on tour and will pick them up at La Soufriere after 5.00pm.
Day 4 - Sunday BARBADOS / LITTLE ENGLAND (1/2 day)*	Don't miss this opportunity to discover the treasures of what we call "Little England" in the West Indies. First Farley Hill, a popular meeting place for Barbadians, then Bathsheba, a small fishing village beaten by the waves of the Atlantic and known to surfers from all over the world. Treat yourself to a refreshing drink at the new Hillcrest Community Center and finish with Codrington College. Long way by bus.
Day 4 - Sunday BARBADOS / REMOTE BARBADOS IN A 4X4 (1/2 day)*	From sugar cane fields to tropical forest via the village of Bathsheba, you'll drive over dirt tracks through the most inaccessible parts of the island and see the finest views of the Atlantic coast. (bumpy road)
Day 4 - Sunday BARBADOS / SUBMARINE (1/2 day - morning)*	A unique opportunity to admire the splendour of the tropical sea. Venture into this realm of silence, 50 metres down, on a high-tech submarine. Discover the coral reefs (sea fans, sponges) and fish (angel, butterfly, surgeon and boxfish, to name but a few). Visibility depending on weather.
Day 5 - Monday GRENADA / LA CAPIJE (1/2 day - morning)*	You'll start this magnificent forest trekking at "Grand Etang". It'll take you through a plantation where you'll see cocoa, nutmeg and bananas, and then on to the bamboo waterfalls where you can enjoy a refreshing swim. Crossing the river : so wet sneakers
Day 5 - Monday GRENADA / WATERFALLS AND CHOCOLATE (1/2 day)*	This aromatic island tour will allow you to get to know everything about the "Jouvay" organic chocolate production at the Diamond Chocolate Factory nestled in the village of Victoria on the west coast of Grenada. You'll find it in an 18th-century converted rum distillery, which was built by French monks. Nowadays, the factory's responsible for making 'Jouvay' – one of the world's top 10 chocolates, according to National Geographic. This chocolate's completely organic and you'll learn how it's made – from the harvest of the cocoa beans, to watching them dry on trays under the Caribbean sun. A visit to the garden of cocoa trees to see, cocoa, cloves, chili, nutmeg, flowers, fruits, followed by a delicious chocolate tasting, will conclude this pleasant visit to one of the most amazing sites in the Caribbean. On your way back, you make a detour to enjoy a swim (conditions permitting) in the natural lovely pool at the Concord Falls. Here the nutmeg and cocoa trees grow along the flanks of the hills in the tropical forest that is forever near. Please note: guests are advised to wear a swimsuit under a cover-up, bring sunscreen, a hat, sunglasses, and a towel. The order of the stops may vary. Guests must be at least 5 years old to participate. Long way by bus to discover the magnificence of the island.
Day 5 - Monday GRENADA / FORT AND BEACHE BY LOCAL BUS (1/2 day - afternoon)*	You'll discover St Georges - the charming capital, known as the Little San Francisco of the West Indies - in a vintage truck. You'll stop at the Frederick Fort that look out over the town, and after a detour in the nearby hills, where you'll have a great view of the interior of the island, you'll have the chance to swim from one of Grenada's most beautiful beaches.
Day 5 - Monday GRENADA / ISLAND TOUR (day)*	The Spice Island is as rich in aromas as in landscapes. You will visit the famous Diamond Chocolate factory in Victoria, which produces Jouvay chocolate, ranked among the best chocolates in the world. In addition, Different stops will allow you to discover the luxuriant nature of this authentic island Finally, you will enjoy a local lunch at the Belmont Estate in an 18th century cocoa plantation.
Day 6 - Tuesday TRINIDAD / PANORAMA AND BEACH IN 4X4 (1/2 day, afternoon)*	Join a small group to uncover some of Trinidad's best kept secrets, visiting places that even lots of locals don't know about. Your day of adventure begins with a climb of the Paramin Hills to experience the most mountainous, and still very rural, part of the island. You will travel through villages and see how traditional agriculture is still thriving, and see local herbs and spices on sale in the market. You will then travel to the more rolling countryside of the northern coast, where you can enjoy a walk on the fine white sand and swim in the sea at Maracas Bay.
Day 6 - Tuesday TRINIDAD / THE CITY AND THE WILD SIDE OF TRINIDAD*	Having toured Port of Spain and seen the city's most famous monuments; the parliament, Queen's Park Savannah and enjoyed a short stroll in the botanic gardens, you will return with a climb of the Paramin Hills to experience the most mountainous, and still very rural, part of the island. The reserve is home to numerous species of animals, but especially to birds, including the species that is one of the national birds of Trinidad and Tobago, the scarlet ibis. Around 15,000 ibis use the swamp as their nesting ground. You will climb aboard a large flat-bottomed boat and travel across the peaceful lagoon where you will be able to enjoy this watery landscape that shelters a rich variety of flora and fauna. This aquatic trip offers you the chance to observe close-up the sight of thousands of scarlet birds nesting in the heart of this mangrove swamp.
Day 7 - Wednesday TOBAGO CAYS / CATAMARAN MORPION ISLAND (1/2 day)*	Morpion - also known as Mopio - will make your paradise island dream come true! A tiny white sand island with a straw hut and palm tree leaf roof, the main function of this speck of paradise is to indicate the way to sailors. This highly photogenic spot has featured in magazines worldwide: today, it's all yours!

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Day 8 - Thursday MAYREAU / CATAMARAN, THE HEART OF THE GRENADINES (1/2 day)*	<p>his postcard morning accompanied by an atmosphere and a purely Caribbean cocktail on board will take you to the translucent anchorages around the island of Mayreau. The climate, always suitable for swimming, will encourage you to refresh yourself in the turquoise waters of the Grenadines unless you prefer to tread on the sparkling sand.</p>
Day 9 - Friday BEQUIA - CATAMARAN (1/2 day)*	<p>You won't believe your eyes when you see the architectural curiosities of the Ile à Quatre. As you come alongside the coast, troglodyte-style buildings seem to spring forth from the rocks and tropical vegetation. This rock creation is called Moonhole, and is made up of a collection of homes created during the hippy era. The beautiful natural beach and the dives down to the corals beneath are simply heavenly.</p>
Day 10 - Saturday FORT DE FRANCE / CLUB MED BOUCANIER (1journée)*	<p>Relax in your Club Med Les Boucaniers village before heading to the airport for your return home. Established in this idyllic setting since 1969, the Village exudes the Creole spirit. Imagine succumbing to the charm of one of the most beautiful beaches in Martinique facing the Diamond Rock... strolling in the tropical garden or in the coconut grove... Water sports are reserved for hotel guests. Day Pass from 10am to 2.30pm</p>
Day 10 - Saturday FORT DE FRANCE / HABITATION CLÉMENT (1/2 journée)*	<p>Discover Habitation Clément, an exceptional rum distillery in many ways. It includes a colonial mansion that welcomed presidents Mitterrand and Bush after the Gulf War, botanical gardens, as well as a distillery that produces the most famous rums in the French Antilles. Your tour will end with a tasting of old rum. For reasons of airport security, all purchases of bottles of rum made at the plantation must be packed in a suitcase destined for the baggage hold before checking in for your flight.</p>
Day 10 - Saturday FORT DE FRANCE / FROM THE CELLAR TO THE BOTTLE (DISTILLERIE A 1710)*	<p>Learn about the rum making process at the rum distillery Habitation A1710 located in Le François. Bottling and cellar work will no longer hold any secrets for you. Take advantage of these moments with the cellar master who will be happy to share with you his most beautiful creations.</p>

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Formalities

HEALTH FORMALITIES

Recommended vaccinations: diphtheria, polio, tetanus, hepatitis A and B and typhoid. Some parasitic or viral diseases can be carried by mosquitoes during certain stopovers. The use of skin and clothing repellents is therefore recommended. Pregnant women who do not need constant medical supervision may come aboard, upon presentation of a medical certificate showing their due date and certifying that their pregnancy is compatible with the cruise. The final day of the cruise must be before the end of the 26th week of pregnancy. A doctor and a nurse are present on board.
