

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## Itinerary of your cruise

Day 1 - Monday LA ROMANA	A little port, built in 1851 to ease maritime traffic, the town was only officially founded in 1897. The city itself only began to grow 20 years later, when Italian immigrants built a large mill to grind the sugar cane. Ship docked, no water sports. Boarding and disembarkation port of call.	
Day 2 - Tuesday SAILING ON THE OPEN SEA	A restorative day at sea. Choose from the range of inviting possibilities on our remarkable sailing ship. Lounge on chaise longues, cool off in one of o two swimming pools, work out with a sea view in our Espace Fitness, find instant calm at the spa and enjoy the attentive company of our G.O® team and crew members.	
Day 3 - Wednesday BONAIRE	This Dutch island is a real ecological sanctuary. It owes its reputation to its coral reef, amazing diving, and its flights of pink flamingoes. Ship docked i port.	
Day 4 - Thursday CURAÇAO	On the largest of the ABC islands (Aruba, Bonaire and Curaçao), Willemstad is a a little Caribbean Amsterdam vibrant with colour, blending Dutch and Spanish influences in its own original way. Ship docked at port.	
Day 5 - Friday ARUBA	Aruba is one of the Little West Indies islands, off the coast of Venezuela. Since it separated from the Dutch West Indies in 1986, it has been a State of the Kingdom of the Netherlands. It has little tropical vegetation, and white sand beaches that make it a hit with tourists. It is as flat as the Netherlands the highest point on the island being Mount Jamanota, 18 metres high.

On 7 June 1692, the city was destroyed by an earthquake, followed by a tsunami that caused the city to vanish beneath the waves in just a few minutes. Ship docked, no water sports.

Day 21 - Sunday ÎLE CATALINA	The small island of Catalina, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, is known for its coral reefs and pristine beaches rich in white sand. Its turquoise waters make it easy to see coral, multicoloured fish and all the richness of this region. Private beach for the Caribbean Beach Club. Boats at anchor, no water sports.

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#### **Excursions of your cruise**

Day 3 - Wednesday BONAIRE / SAIL AND SNORKEL (1/2 day)*	A unique opportunity to experience the joys of sailing as a small group. Take to the waves on a 13 metre single-hull boat, and see the underwater wonders of Bonaire's sparkling clear waters. After your swim, a refreshing aperitif rounds off the boat trip wonderfully.
Day 3 - Wednesday BONAIRE / ISLAND TOUR*	The island of Bonaire is one of the most charming of the former Dutch Antilles!  After travelling through the capital Kralendijk, a pretty little pastel-coloured town, you'll take the coast road north. You'll see Lake Goto, a natural saltwater lake that's popular with flamingos. Then you'll continue on to Rincon village, founded by the Spanish in the 14th century, and then head South to see the saltpans and former slave houses.
Day 4 - Thursday CURAÇAO / ARTWORK AND L'ALDEA (1/2 day - morning)*	Visit an aloe vera plantation to find out about all the uses and benefits of this plant that you will often come across in Curaçao. Next, head for the artist's studio where Serena makes her Chichi, figurines representing a typical West Indian older sister. On the way back, stop off at L'Aldea, a park that brings together replicas of Amazonian cities, a tropical forest and more than a hundred species of animals such as monkeys, parrots and iguanas.
Day 4 - Thursday CURAÇAO / JEWISH HERITAGE TOUR*	Curacao has a fascinating Jewish history and boasts the oldest synagogue in the Americas. Also see the oldest cemetery in the Western Hemisphere, visit the Rooi Catoot Plantation House, and walk through the Old Jewish Quarter. the guided tour will be done in english.
Day 4 - Thursday CURACAO / THE COLORS OF CURACAO*	Discover Willemstad, the capital of Curacao by trolley train. Feast your eyes on the brightly coloured architecture of the UNESCO World Heritage Site city centre. Return to the ship at your own pace.
Day 5 - Friday ARUBA / BEST OF ARUBA (1/2 day)*	This stunning tour of the island shows you the very best of Aruba, appreciating both its natural wonders and its architecture through its most iconic sights.  You will pass through the island's capital, Oranjestad, and admire the brightly coloured buildings, before setting off for the Casigari rock formations and the coral bridge. You'll finish your tour at the California Lighthouse, so you can enjoy the panoramic view that encompasses most of the island.
Day 5 - Friday ARUBA/SUBMARINE*	A unique opportunity to appreciate the wonders of the tropical waters. Dive as far as 50 metres below the surface of the deep blue sea in a high-tech submarine. Discover coral reefs (sea fans, sponges and more) and a whole host of different fish (angelfish, cofferfish, butterflyfish, surgeonfish and many others). The large portholes provide great views. If you tend to feel claustrophobic, rest assured that there is plenty of room, excellent lighting and good ventilation.
Day 6 - Saturday SANTA MARTA / SANTA MARTA CITY TOUR (1/2 day, morning)*	Come and explore the jewels of Santa Marta, the oldest city in Colombia, founded by the conquistadors in their search for El Dorado. You will go the Custom's House which houses the Tairona Gold Museum where you can marvel at its small but priceless collection. You will visit the cathedral built in 1529 and see some of the stunning monuments that most represent the city, before heading to the Quinta de San Pedro, where the great liberator Simon Bolivar lived, which dates back to the 17th century. You will also get a chance to discover Colombian culture with a presentation of traditional songs and dances.

Day 7 - Sunday CARTAGENA / CARTAGENA AND GETHSEMANE\*

Your guide will introduce you to the scenic neighbourhood of Gethsemane, a popular area known for its colourful houses and murals. You will then make your way to the Old Town to admire a few monuments which are most representative of its long history, and enjoy a bit of free time to shop or visit the home of Rafael Nuñez.

Day 7 - Sunday CARTAGENA / VISIT THE HISTORICAL CITY CENTRE (1/2 day)\* Come and explore the magnificent city of Cartagena, a frequent target of pirates with an impressive fortress that has been a prosperous urban centre since the 16th century. You will begin your tour at the 17th-century Fort San Felipe de Barajas, a symbol of Spain's military genius in South America. Next, you will head to the old town and stroll through its streets and patios, passing by Simón Bolivar Square and the Church of San Pedro Claver to admire its splendid "Republican" architecture. The trip includes a stop at Las Bovedas, a former prison now devoted to handicraft, and a bus tour of the Boca Grande residential neighbourhood before returning to the ship.

Day 7 - Sunday CARTAGENA / OLD TOWN AND COLOMBIAN COFFEE (half-day)\*

Discover Columbia's heritage as you learn to taste a Colombian coffee. Enjoy a bit of free time to choose your cafe, then explore the charming plazas and narrow streets of the Old Town. A panoramic tour of Cartagena and a visit to the home of Rafael Nűnez round out the itinerary.

Day 8 - Monday CARTAGENA / CARTAGENA AND GETHSEMANE\*

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Day 10 - Wednesday PORTOBELO / CITY TOUR*	Experience an epic adventure along the legendary Gold Route in Portobelo. Discover the historic ruins where the Spanish conquistadores hunted for gold, and relive the naval battles between Spaniards and pirates. Explore the Royal Customs House, once the heart of the gold and silver trade. Relax with an exotic cocktail and enjoy a vibrant Congo show, celebrating the culture of African slave descendants. Book now for an immersion in Portobelo's history and cultural riches.	
Day 10 - Wednesday PORTOBELO / EL TUNNEL DEL AMOR*	Discover Panama's Caribbean coast, where wild landscapes and crystal-clear waters await you. Start your day aboard a Diablo Rojo, Panama's iconic colorful bus. En route, admire the secluded beaches and turquoise waves. The lush mangroves are home to a diverse range of wildlife. Next, hop aboard a boat to explore El Tunnel del Amor, secret waterways hidden in the heart of the mangroves. Sail through these enchanting channels where nature reigns supreme End your adventure at Isla Mamey, an idyllic beach with calm waters. Relax, swim and enjoy a refreshing cocktail on the warm sands of this island paradise.	
Day 11 - Thursday COLON / GAMBOA (Lac Gatún) (journée complète)*	Set off on an unforgettable adventure in Gamboa, where nature and engineering meet in harmony. Start your day with a stroll along the Panama Cana Admire the lush flora and fauna: exotic birds, capuchin monkeys, and other animals hidden in the dense foliage. Then hop aboard a local cable car for a unique aerial experience above the jungle. Admire the spectacular panorama of rainforest, sparkling rivers and verdant hills. Discover the grandeur and diverse biodiversity of this unique region. Local buffet lunch included.	
Day 11 - Thursday COLON / NEW LOCKS AND SAN LORENZO*	Come and see the Agua Clara locks. The watchtower, which stands 60 m above sea level, offers an unbeatable view over Lake Gatún and the new Panama Canal locks. Passing over the Canal via the recent Atlantic Bridge to reach San Lorenzo. Visit by the forts of the time of pirates. There in the middle of the exuberant nature, between old stones and cannons you will find the atmosphere of pirates, filibusters and other privateers of the Old Continent! This tour is a 2 hours of driving.	
Day 11 - Thursday COLON / THE EMBERA INDIANS (1/2 day)*	Just a short distance from "civilisation" lies the Embera community, who still live entirely by tradition, building with natural fiber and palm leaves, wearing multicolored loinclothes and painting their bodies. You will travel by bus to the river, then take a 45-minute ride in a pirogue up a river that leads to their village. As you sit on the ground, you will observe their daily routiens and learn about their way of life and culture, which mesh perfectly and sustainably with their environment.	
Day 11 - Thursday COLON / PANAMA, BRIDGE OVER AMERICA (1 day)*	After an hour's drive, you'll arrive at the Miraflores Locks, where a visitor centre helps you to understand the impressive 20th century engineering. Then you'll explore Panama's colonial quarter, Casco Antiguo, and have lunch there. This lovely area was awarded Unesco World Heritage status in 1997. In the afternoon, wander the side streets of this stunning district, and discover the various colonial era churches, the Plaza de Francia and Plaza Bolivar. Take a look at the shops and craft stalls. This tour involves 3 hours of driving. The ship passage schedule is subject to last minute changes due to Panama Canal operations. The excursion itinerary may be changed	
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Day 13 - Saturday BOCA DEL TORO / DOLFIN BAY (1/2 day)*	Cross the turquoise waters towards Bahia de los Delfines. Observe wild dolphins in their natural habitat and relax in this heavenly bay.	
Day 13 - Saturday BOCAS DEL TORO / PLANTS AND WILDLIFE ABOARD A LANCHA (1/2 day)*	Set out to explore this archipelago in a typical lancha boat. Explore one of the top tourist destinations in Panama: BOCAS DEL TORO! From your boat, you will observe flora and fauna; with a little luck you will see a sloth, and admire untouched mangroves, corals, starfish through the transparent waters of the Caribbean Sea. Stop swimming and cocktail break from a bar on stilts that has become an institution, you will succumb to the charm of Bocas!	
Day 13 - Saturday BOCAS DEL TORO / MONKEY SANCTUARY (1/2 day)*	Explore the lush gardens of Finca Los Monos. Stroll through paths lined with tropical plants and admire orchids, heliconias, and bromeliads. Observe local wildlife, including monkeys and colorful birds. Guides share their knowledge about plants and the local ecosystem, making this tour an enriching and relaxing experience.	
Day 13 - Saturday BOCA DEL TORO / RED FROG BEACH (1/2 day)*	Treat yourself to a half-day of absolute relaxation on the Caribbean beaches at Red Frog Beach.  Discover a tropical paradise where golden sand meets turquoise waters. Bask in the sun and let yourself be lulled by the gentle sound of the waves.	
Day 13 - Saturday BOCA DEL TORO / CACAO AND LANCHAS (1/2 day)*	Set out with your guide to discover the archipelago, in particular its cocoa production. Travel in a lancha boat to the plantation and wander through the paths to find out where fermentation, drying and roasting take place. You will also learn about the history of cocoa and of course taste some of Bocas' black gold!	
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Day 15 - Monday LIMÓN / HIKING IN CAHUITA NATIONAL PARK (1/2 day)*	Cahuita National Park, located on Costa Rica's Caribbean coast, is a natural gem offering visitors a unique experience. The park is famous for its pristine beaches and coral reefs, perfect for snorkeling and scuba diving. The lush rainforest is home to a wide variety of wildlife, including monkeys, sloths and a host of exotic birds. Hiking trails allow you to explore the diverse landscape, from mangroves to palm-fringed beaches. When you visit Cahuita, you'll discover not only the natural beauty but also the cultural richness of the region, with its strong Afro-Caribbean influences. It's an ideal place for nature lovers, marine enthusiasts and those seeking an authentic immersion in local culture. Lunch included. This tour involves 1 hour 30 min of driving.
Day 15 - Monday LIMÓN / WILDLIFE LEGENDS: TALES OF ANIMALS THROUGH TIME (JRC) (1/2 day)*	The Jaguar Rescue Animal Rehabilitation Center, located on the Caribbean coast of Costa Rica, is a sanctuary dedicated to the rehabilitation and protection of wildlife. The center offers a unique opportunity to get up close and personal with local wildlife, learn about the history of each resident and learn more about conservation efforts in the region. Founded with the aim of rescuing, rehabilitating and reintroducing wild animals, the center is home to a variety of species. The Jaguar Rescue Center is a must-see destination for nature lovers and those interested in supporting wildlife protection. As the center receives no government support, entrance fees charged for visits, as well as income from the small souvenir store, are its only source of revenue.  PS: The diversity of animals varies according to the vulnerable fauna brought to the center by conservation organizations or local residents. Local Lunch included. This tour involves 1 hour 30 min of driving.
Day 15 - Monday LIMON / THE CANALS OF TORTUGUERO (1/2 day)*	This 2-hour tour by local boat through the canals linking the Tortuguero area, is filled with incredible scenery, wildlife and greenery in all its authentic diversity. The trip starts at the Moin wharf and takes you to one of the country's most beautiful regions: the canals of Tortuguero. You'll have the chance to discover the rainforest and all its biodiversity directly from the aquatic environment, which is home to numerous birds, reptiles, insects and mammals. If you love photography or immersing yourself in nature, this is the tour for you!
Day 16 - Tuesday SAN ANDRES - PANORAMA DE SAN ANDRES (1/2 day)*	Enjoy a beautiful sunny day in the most recognized island of Colombia, known by its beautiful beaches and white sand. With your english driver, you will discover the must of this island during the panoramic tour of the island.
Day 17 - Wednesday PROVIDENCIA / ENCHANTED WALK IN SANTA CATALINA*	Starting your adventure at Lovers' Lane Bridge and making your way to Fort Warwick while hearing tales of Puritans, pirates, and filibusters must be fascinating! It's a wonderful way to connect with the island's rich history. Plus, the chance to walk along the island trail and swim in those crystal-clear waters sounds like the perfect way to immerse yourself in the natural beauty of Santa Catalina. It truly seems like a unique experience that combines culture, history, and relaxation
Day 19 - Friday PORT ROYAL / BOB MARLEY & DEVON HOUSE (1/2 day, morning)*	Your chance to learn about two of the capital's most illustrious people. Surround yourself with reggae culture with a stroll through the Bob Marley Museum, housed in the last placed he lived, and admire the statue of the man himself erected near the National Stadium. Then take a step back in time to the 1890s with a visit to Devon House, a magnificent blend of Caribbean and Georgian architecture, home of Jamaica's first black millionaire.
Day 22 - Monday LA ROMANA / CAVE OF WONDERS (1/2 day, morning)*	Explore the amazing 240 square metres of the Cave of Wonders. In the midst of stalactites, columns and other rock formations, you will discover ancient drawings left behind by the first indigenous people of the Caribbean. On your way back, you will stop off at La Romana where you can do a spot of shopping at the village market.
Day 22 - Monday LA ROMANA / ONE DAY TO PUNTA CANA RESORT (1day)*	Before your flight, enjoy a wonderful day at the Punta Cana Resort, relax on its magnificent coconut palm beach and enjoy the Dominican atmosphere. Day pass from 10.30am to 4pm. Return directly to the airport of Punta Cana.





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#### **Formalities**

#### **HEALTH FORMALITIES**

Recommended vaccinations: diphtheria, polio, tetanus, hepatitis A and B and typhoid. Some parasitic or viral diseases can be carried by mosquitoes during certain stopovers. The use of skin and clothing repellents is therefore recommended. Pregnant women who do not need constant medical supervision may come aboard, upon presentation of a medical certificate showing their due date and certifying that their pregnancy is compatible with the cruise. The final day of the cruise must be before the end of the 26th week of pregnancy. A doctor and a nurse are present on board.
