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## Itinerary of your cruise

<b>Day 1 - Wednesday</b> MALAGA	Cosmopolitan Andalusia has 300 days of sunshine a year. It's also a major landmark in the history of Cubism - you can visit the house where Picasso was born and the museum with over 200 of his works. Ship docked in port.
<b>Day 2 - Thursday</b> SAILING ON THE OPEN SEA	A restorative day at sea. Choose from the range of inviting possibilities on our remarkable sailing ship. Lounge on chaise longues, cool off in one of our two swimming pools, work out with a sea view in our Espace Fitness, find instant calm at the spa and enjoy the attentive company of our G.O® team and crew members.
<b>Day 3 - Friday</b> CARTHAGÈNE	Brightly coloured Andalusian houses enliven Cartagena, an arid former mining city with a special Mediterranean charm. Many cultures have made Cartagena home over the centuries, leaving behind a rich artistic history that is still visible today.
<b>Day 4 - Saturday</b> ALICANTE	The Greeks called it the white citadel and the Romans the city of light. Closely linked, the old town, the port and the beach make this a city with its face turned resolutely towards the sea. Ship docked, no water sports.
<b>Day 5 - Sunday</b> VALENCE	Covering 2,000 m², the gothic architecture of the Lonja de la Seda (Silk Exchange) has Unesco World Heritage status. It faces the Mercado Centrale, one of the most beautiful covered markets in Europe. Ship docked, no water sports and no direct access to a beach.
<b>Day 6 - Monday</b> TARRAGONA	The town's many ancient ruins bear witness to the historic past of this former Roman colony. Its 2nd-century amphitheatre faces the sea, and the ramparts surrounding the remains of the medieval town offer uninterrupted views of Tarragona.
<b>Day 7 - Tuesday</b> PALMA DE MALLORCA	Dominated by its imposing cathedral, considered to be one of the most beautiful Gothic structures in Spain, the capital of the Balearic Islands has a twin identity, combining modernism and traditions. Ship docked, no water sports.
<b>Day 8 - Wednesday</b> MAHÓN	Menorca's port invites you in to discover the unspoilt charms of the "blue and white island". Its cliffs and inlets hide reminders of megalithic times: navetes, taulas, and talaiots. Ship docked, no water sports and no direct access to a beach.
<b>Day 9 - Thursday</b> COLLIOURE	Lapped by the waters of the Mediterranean, at the foot of the Pyrenees, Collioure has inspired painters such as Matisse and Chagall. Its narrow cobbled streets wind between two harbours, where brightly painted Catalan rowing boats bob on the waves. Ship at anchor, water sports available.
<b>Day 10 - Friday</b> SÈTE	Located between the Mediterranean and the Étang de Thau, famous for its oysters, Sète is also known as the "Venice of the Languedoc" because of its network of canals. It has retained its old world charm thanks to the ports located in the heart of the city. Boat docked, dive locker closed, stopover without beach.
<b>Day 11 - Saturday</b> MARSEILLE	Founded in 600 BCE by Greek sailors from Phocaea, the Old Port and its historic neighbourhoods, the Byzantine-style Notre-Dame-de-la-Garde basilica, its sunny corniche facing the sea and its wild rocky inlets make it a city of great contrasts. Ship docked, no water sports. Boarding and disembarkation port of call.





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## Excursions of your cruise

<b>Day 3 - Friday</b> CARTAGENA / MURCIA*	After a panoramic tour of the city of Murcia, discover the Francisco Salzillo museum and examine the incredible detail of his terracotta religious artworks. After a walking into historical Murcia, discover El Real Casino de Murcia (Royal Casino of Murcia) is an emblematic building in the city of Murcia. Its unique architecture combines modernist and eclectic artistic styles, and the beauty of the building awakes the admiration of all visitors.
<b>Day 3 - Friday</b> CARTAGENA / CARTAGENA (1/2 day, morning)*	in progress
<b>Day 4 - Saturday</b> ALICANTE / ALICANTE PANORAMIC AND GASTRONOMIC*	Discover the enchanting hinterland with a guided vineyard tour, where you'll taste some of the region's most renowned wines. You will enjoy, also, a scenic tour of Alicante. 1h by bus until the vineyard.
<b>Day 5 - Sunday</b> VALENCE - HISTORICAL VALENCE (1/2 day)*	Come and discover the heart and soul of Valencia, one of the most dynamic and lively cities in Spain. We will guide you through its different neighbourhoods to explore the iconic monuments of Valencia: the Serrano Towers, the central market and Valencia's magnificent Gothic cathedral, symbol of its Moorish past.
<b>Day 7 - Tuesday</b> PALMA DE MALLORCA / VALDEMOSSA, SOLLER (half day - morning)*	Come and explore the lovely village of Valdemossa, made famous by George Sand and Frédéric Chopin who stayed there in the winter of 1839. It is characterised by its traditional Majorcan houses and narrow streets, not wide enough for cars, decorated with pots of colourful flowers hanging everywhere and filling the village with fragrance. Next, you will discover the town of Soller that sits in the bottom of a deep valley. Its name comes from the main industry in the area, the growing of citrus fruit. For many years, the town was only accessible on foot, until the tramway was built to link it to the outside world.
<b>Day 8 - Wednesday</b> MAHON / MAHON AND THE MONTE TORO (1/2 day, morning)*	After a tour of the best views in the bustling centre of Mahon, the capital of Menorca since the 17th century, you'll travel to Monte Toro. As this is the highest peak, you can enjoy panoramic views of the entire island.
<b>Day 9 - Thursday</b> COLLIOURE - PANORAMA OF COLLIOURE*	Travel through the Collioure vineyards to Fort Saint-Elme, which dominates the Côte Vermeille from the crest of a ridge. Explore the fort and its history (outside discovery) before taking the coastal route back to Collioure. Then take a guided walk around the town, spotting copies of works by Matisse and Derain positioned where the originals were painted.
<b>Day 10 - Friday</b> SETE / THAU CANALS AND POND (2 hours)*	Come and see the city of Sète from another angle! Navigate the calm waters of the canals to the characteristic district of Pointe Courte and admire the different styles of facades that give the city its charm. This crossing via the maritime canal and the fixed and swing bridges will take you to the lake of Thau, a real inland sea of over 20 kilometres, to learn about the breeding of oysters and mussels.
<b>Day 10 - Friday</b> SETE / BALXBOAT ET DEGUSTATION*	Embark aboard your RIB to visit the rocky coast, the Mediterranean Sea, the city's canals with passage under bridges, the Pointe Courte district and the Bassin de Thau with its shellfish parks. Fully commented ride by the Sète captain (only in French) in a 12-seater speed boat, stop in an authentic shellfish farm with tasting of oysters and white wine at the Saint Pierre by Tarbouriech farmhouse. Not recommended for people with back pain and pregnant women.
<b>Day 11 - Saturday</b> MARSEILLE / AIX EN PROVENCE, HOMETLAND OF CÉZANNE (1/2 day, morning)*	Let's go to Aix en Provence, former capital of Provence and homeland of the famous painter Paul Cézanne. Stroll along the Cours Mirabeau, built on the site of the medieval ramparts, admire the elegant facades of its mansions, explore the old Mazarin district and discover the magnificent Saint-Sauveur Cathedral with contrasting architectural styles. You will also enjoy some free time to shop or relax on the terrace of a café.
<b>Day 11 - Saturday</b> MARSEILLE / CASSIS*	Take the Route des Crêtes to reach this little fishing port, a genuine natural gem, nestled between two incredible sites: Cap Canaille and the famous Massif des Calanques. The imposing cliffs and the sea stretching out as far as the eye can see constitute the breathtaking scenery. You will discover the secret charm of this charming village by walking through the narrow alleys and squares lined with colourful fishermen's houses, a postcard landscape!
<b>Day 11 - Saturday</b> MARSEILLE / VIEWS AND HISTORY OF MARSEILLE (1/2 day, morning)*	Travel across the centuries, firstly by bus and then on foot with your guide, exploring Greek and then Roman Marseille. Explore its history via its most ancient buildings, discover the emblematic neighbourhoods: The Old Port, Le Panier and Belsunce, and admire the historic monuments: Notre-dame de la garde, Mucem.

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## Formalities

### CUSTOMS FORMALITIES

For all UK citizens, a valid passport is essential when you travel abroad. A full 10-year passport is required for holidays to all countries featured on our website. The passport must be valid for at least 6 months beyond your return date with one blank visa page. Make sure your passport is valid and check with the embassy or the consulate of your destination country if you need a visa for your chosen destination prior to travel. It is vital that the name given when booking your holiday (printed on the ticket and itinerary) is exactly the same as written on your passport. Any child, however old, must have his/her own passport. Please note Club Med cannot be held responsible for any issue with regards to passport or visas.

### HEALTH FORMALITIES

Safe Together.

Club Med has implemented new hygiene and safety measures to offer you peace of mind and a most joyful experience.

As part of the fight against Covid-19, health measures at the borders are being reinforced and may in particular require a virological screening test (for example PCR test) depending on your country of origin, transit or destination before your departure and/or before your return.

We suggest you obtain more information from the consular services of the countries concerned or on the website of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of your nationality and/or place of residence.

Recommended vaccinations: diphtheria, polio, tetanus, hepatitis A and B and typhoid.

Pregnant women who do not need constant medical supervision may come aboard, upon presentation of a medical certificate showing their due date and certifying that their pregnancy is compatible with the cruise.

The final day of the cruise must be before the end of the 26th week of pregnancy.

A doctor and a nurse are present on board.
