



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Itinerary of your cruise

Day 1 - Saturday MARSEILLE	Founded in 600 BCE by Greek sailors from Phocaea, the Old Port and its historic neighbourhoods, the Byzantine-style Notre-Dame-de-la-Garde basilica, its sunny corniche facing the sea and its wild rocky inlets make it a city of great contrasts. Ship docked, no water sports. Boarding and disembarkation port of call.		
Day 2 - Sunday SÈTE	Located between the Mediterranean and the Étang de Thau, famous for its oysters, Sète is also known as the "Venice of the Languedoc" because of its network of canals. It has retained its old world charm thanks to the ports located in the heart of the city. Boat docked, dive locker closed, stopover without beach.		
Day 3 - Monday ROSES	The Catalan citadel is an ancient Greek colony founded in the 4th century BC by settlers from Marseille, and sits in a picturesque bay that is home to 16th-century fortifications and megalithic tombs. Boat at dock, nautical hall closed.		
Day 4 - Tuesday BARCELONA	Barcelona is a vibrant cocktail of tradition and avant-garde, where culture and fun combine to ensure a fabulous stay. By night or day, the Ramblas and the barrios are a feast for the senses. Ship docked in port,		
Day 5 - Wednesday TARRAGONA	The town's many ancient ruins bear witness to the historic past of this former Roman colony. Its 2nd-century amphitheatre faces the sea, and the ramparts surrounding the remains of the medieval town offer uninterrupted views of Tarragona. Boat docked, no water sports.		
Day 6 - Thursday PALMA DE MALLORCA	Dominated by its imposing cathedral, considered to be one of the most beautiful Gothic structures in Spain, the capital of the Balearic Islands has a twin identity, combining modernism and traditions. Ship docked, no water sports.		
Day 7 - Friday MAHÓN	Menorca's port invites you in to discover the unspoilt charms of the "blue and white island". Its cliffs and inlets hide reminders of megalithic times navetes, taulas, and talaiots. Ship docked, no water sports and no direct access to a beach.

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Excursions of your cruise

Day 2 - Sunday SETE/THAU CANALS AND POND (2 hours)*

Come and see the city of Sète from another angle!

Navigate the calm waters of the canals to the characteristic district of Pointe Courte and admire the different styles of facades that give the city its

This crossing via the maritime canal and the fixed and swing bridges will take you to the lake of Thau, a real inland sea of over 20 kilometres, to learn about the breeding of oysters and mussels.

Day 2 - Sunday SETE / BAL.XBOAT ET **DEGUSTATION***

Embark aboard your RIB to visit the rocky coast, the Mediterranean Sea, the city's canals with passage under bridges, the Pointe Courte district and the Bassin de Thau with its shellfish parks. Fully commented ride by the Sète captain (only in French) in a 12-seater speed boat, stop in an authentic shellfish farm with tasting of oysters and white wine at the Saint

Pierre by Tarbouriech farmhouse. Not recommended for people with back pain and pregnant women.

Day 3 - Monday ROSES / MAISON-MUSÉE SALVADOR DALÍ À FIGARES*

A charming Catalan town, Figueres is most famous for being the birthplace of Salvador Dalí. Right in the heart of the town is a veritable work of art designed by Dalí himself: the Dalí Theatre-Museum. It offers total immersion in the artist's surrealist universe, where every room, every work, every detail exudes the spirit of Dalí. Here you'll discover a vast collection of his creations, from paintings and drawings to sculptures and installations. A visit to this museum offers a fascinating insight into Salvador Dalí's boundless imagination and his lasting impact on the art world.

Day 3 - Monday ROSES / SANT PERE DE RODES*

Discover the majestic Monastery of Sant Pere de Rodes, a true medieval treasure offering a fascinating immersion in history, art and breathtaking panoramas. Perched on the heights, it invites you to a unique exploration.

Day 3 - Monday TARRAGONE / BEST OF TARRAGONE*

Enjoy history in capital letters, discovering Roman civilization on a guided tour through the streets and monuments of one of the Empire's most important cities. From Itinere, we offer you an exciting tour in which you'll be surprised by the coexistence of Tarragona's inhabitants with the city's imperial past. We'll visit the oldest Roman walls (on the outside) on the peninsula and discover, among the present-day streets, the provincial forum and the recently excavated circus. We'll also wander inside the spectacular vaults that underpin part of the Forum and support the tiers of the Circus a stadium where thousands of spectators attended the ludi circensis or chariot races. Finally, we'll end our visit at the Amphitheatre (outside), located near the beach.

Day 4 - Tuesday BARCELONA/ BARCELONA: GOTHIC AND GASTRONOMIC (1/2 day - morning)*

The Gothic Quarter of Barcelona combines many ancient Roman and medieval buildings; in the centre of this old city, on Plaça Sant Jaume, you will find the palace of the presidency.

Crossing Las Ramblas, you will then head to the La Boqueria market, a traditional local market with special charm where you will get to taste a local specialty.

You will pass by the well-known Placa Real, or Royal Square, then continue your walk to the El Born district, considered the new city centre during the 13th and 14th centuries, and visit one of the most symbolic churches of the Gothic era: Santa Maria del Mar.

Day 4 - Tuesday BARCELONA BARCELONA: GUELL'S LEGACY (1/2 day - afternoon)*

This half-day tour will give you the opportunity to explore the architectural heritage of one of Barcelona's most famous architects: Antoni Gaudi (1852 - 1926)

A visit to Paseo de Gràcia, this lively and trendy boulevard considered the centre of modernist Barcelona, is a visit to a real open-air museum, with architectural treasures from the 19th century that includes two of Gaudi's masterpieces: Casa Batllô (built in 1877) and La Pedrera (built between 1906 and 1910).

You will marvel at the magnificence and originality of La Sagrada Familia (Church of the Holy Family/exterior visit) before finishing your tour in the heart of Guell Park overlooking the capital.

Day 6 - Thursday PALMA DE MALLORCA VALDEMOSSA, SOLLER (half day - morning)*

Come and explore the lovely village of Valdemossa, made famous by George Sand and Frédéric Chopin who stayed there in the winter of 1839. It is characterised by its traditional Majorcan houses and narrow streets, not wide enough for cars, decorated with pots of colourful flowers hanging everywhere and filling the village with fragrance.

Next, you will discover the town of Soller that sits in the bottom of a deep valley. Its name comes from the main industry in the area, the growing of

citrus fruit. For many years, the town was only accessible on foot, until the tramway was built to link it to the outside world.

Day 7 - Friday MAHON / MAHON AND THE MONTE TORO (1/2 day, morning)*

After a tour of the best views in the bustling centre of Mahon, the capital of Menorca since the 17th century, you'll travel to Monte Toro. As this is the highest peak, you can enjoy panoramic views of the entire island.

Day 8 - Saturday MARSEILLE /AIX EN PROVENCE, HOMELAND OF CÉZANNE (1/2 day, morning)*

Let's go to Aix en Provence, former capital of Provence and homeland of the famous painter Paul Cézanne. Stroll along the Cours Mirabeau, built on the site of the medieval ramparts, admire the elegant facades of its mansions, explore the old Mazarin district and discover the magnificent Saint-Sauveur Cathedral with contrasting architectural styles. You will also enjoy some free time to shop or relax on the terrace of a café.

Day 8 - Saturday MARSEILLE / CASSIS*

Take the Route des Crêtes to reach this little fishing port, a genuine natural gem, nestled between two incredible sites: Cap Canaille and the famous Massif des Calanques. The imposing cliffs and the sea stretching out as far as the eye can see constitute the breathtaking scenery. You will discover the secret charm if this charming village by walking through the narrow alleys and squares lined with colourfoul fishermen's houses, a postcard landscape!

Day 8 - Saturday MARSEILLE / VIEWS AND HISTORY OF MARSEILLE (1/2 day, morning)*

Travel across the centuries, firstly by bus and then on foot with your guide, exploring Greek and then Roman Marseille. Explore its history via its most ancient buildings, discover the emblematic neighbourhoods: The Old Port, Le Panier and Belsunce, and admire the historic monuments: Notre-dame de la garde, Mucem.

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Formalities

CUSTOMS FORMALITIES

For all UK citizens, a valid passport is essential when you travel abroad. A full 10-year passport is required for holidays to all countries featured on our website. The passport must be valid for at least 6 months beyond your return date with one blank visa page. Make sure your passport is valid and check with the embassy or the consulate of your destination country if you need a visa for your chosen destination prior to travel. It is vital that the name given when booking your holiday (printed on the ticket and itinerary) is exactly the same as written on your passport. Any child, however old, must have his/her own passport. Please note Club Med cannot be held responsible for any issue with regards to passport or visas.

HEALTH FORMALITIES

Safe Together.

Club Med has implemented new hygiene and safety measures to offer you peace of mind and a most joyful experience.

As part of the fight against Covid-19, health measures at the borders are being reinforced and may in particular require a virological screening test (for example PCR test) depending on your country of origin, transit or destination before your departure and/or before your return.

We suggest you obtain more information from the consular services of the countries concerned or on the website of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of your nationality

and/or place of residence.

Recommended vaccinations: diphtheria, polio, tetanus, hepatitis A and B and typhoid.

Pregnant women who do not need constant medical supervision may come aboard, upon presentation of a medical certificate

showing their due date and certifying that their pregnancy is compatible with the cruise.

The final day of the cruise must be before the end of the 26th week of pregnancy.

A doctor and a nurse are present on board.
