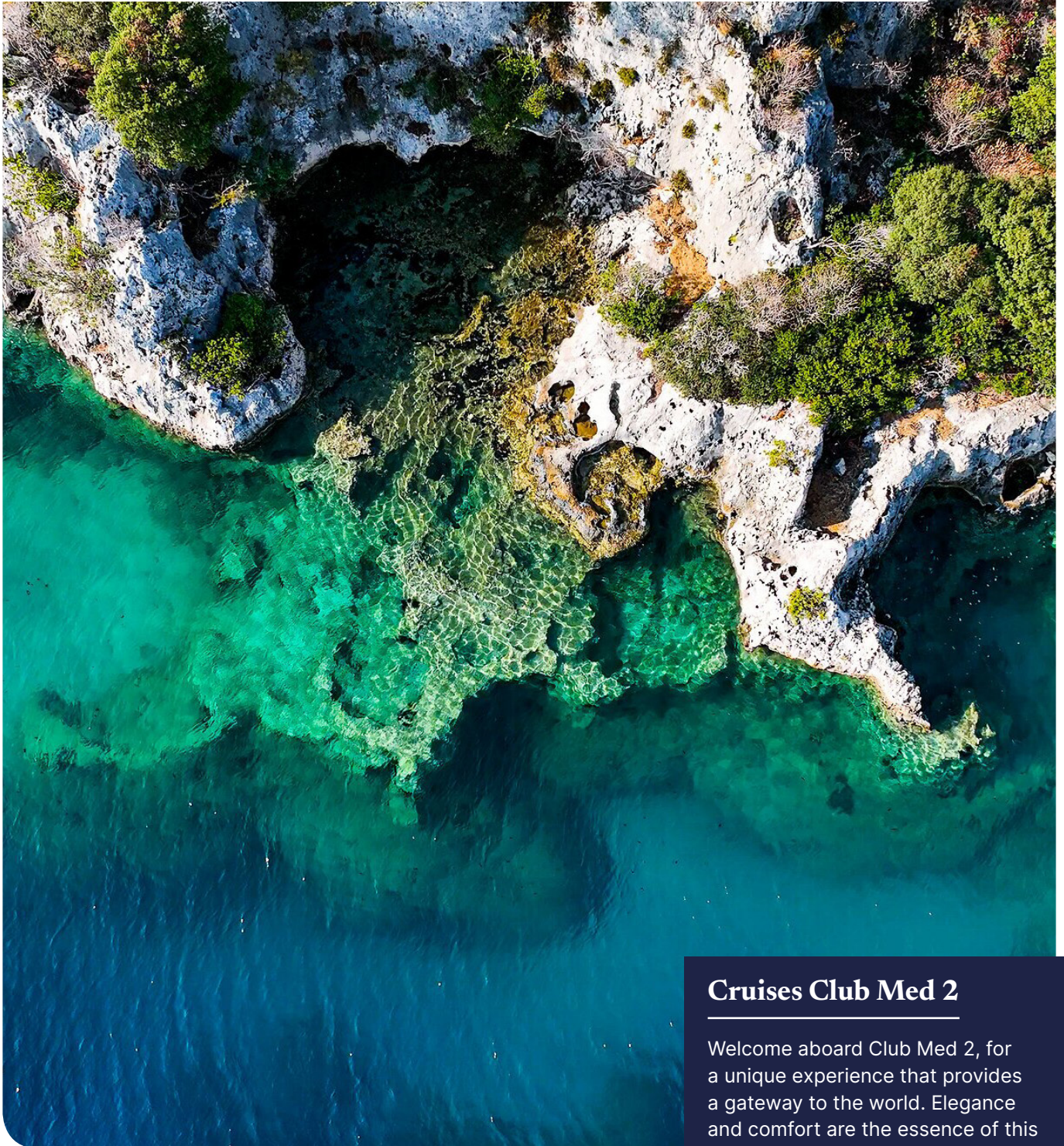

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## Itinerary of your cruise

<b>Day 1 - Saturday</b> ATHENS/LAVRIO	The Greek capital opens the pages of its age-old history. In the heart of modernity, the Acropolis and the narrow streets of the Plaka district reveal their splendour and charm. Boat docked in Lavrio, no water sports and no direct access to a beach. Passengers boarding and disembarking at this port of call.
<b>Day 2 - Sunday</b> NAUPLIA	The original capital of modern day Greece is a charming city that combines Neoclassical and Ottoman influences. Can be admired from the citadel and from the Venitian fort. Ship at anchor. Water sports.
<b>Day 3 - Monday</b> SERIFOS	A hidden treasure, this authentic Cycladic island has a charming, relaxed atmosphere that enchant visitors. Its capital Livadi, a sparkling white jewel standing out against a rocky landscape, is perched high on the mountain around a wide, lush bay. It is probably one of the most beautiful medieval villages in the Cyclades. Boat at anchor, dive locker open.
<b>Day 4 - Tuesday</b> CHANIA	The "Diamond of Crete" is an intertwining of architectures, as many testimonies of its long history. Its pristine and jagged shores sculpt bays and coves. Boats at anchor, water sports.
<b>Day 5 - Wednesday</b> AGIOS NIKOLAOS	This pretty little town has an enigmatic natural feature at its heart. As the town has grown around the lake, so have the legends and stories about this unusual body of water. It forms the perfect backdrop for a drink on the terrace of one of the many cafes.
<b>Day 6 - Thursday</b> RHODES	While it's the Colosseum that has made Rhodes famous, the jasmine-scented streets have much more to offer. Wander in the footsteps of the Knights of St John, explore the UNESCO World Heritage Site of the medieval city, or simply soak up the easygoing Rhodes way of life. Ship docked, no water sports and no direct access to a beach.
<b>Day 7 - Friday</b> FETHIYE	Once known as a city of fishermen and embroiderers, it is spread out around a bay enclosed by twelve little islands, creating a kind of lake. The place seems to bring a strange feeling of peace to visitors. Ship at anchor, water sports available.
<b>Day 8 - Saturday</b> ANTALYA	Nicknamed the "Turkish Riviera", this seaside resort, which is the most popular in the country, is home to an old city which contains fine examples of local architecture, beautifully carved woodwork, mosques, etc. Ship docked, no water sports. Boarding and disembarkation port of call.





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## Excursions of your cruise

<b>Day 2 - Sunday</b> NAFPLIO - MYCENAE AND EPIDAUROS (1/2 day)*	Mycenae: this is where the expedition against Troy set off from, and where Clytemnestra had her royal husband assassinated by her lover. You'll discover the famous Lion Gate, the palace with a most superb view and the tomb of Agamemnon. Epidaurus: the visit will focus on the theatre, but also on its exceptional natural beauty. It's not surprising that this is where Asclepius, the god of medicine, opened his first doctor's surgery.
<b>Day 2 - Sunday</b> NAFPLIO / CORINTH CANAL (1/2 day)*	The Corinth Canal is an artificial waterway channelled through the Isthmus of Corinth. This trip takes you along the canal by boat. An unforgettable experience!
<b>Day 4 - Tuesday</b> LA CANÉE (Chania) / AKROTIRI AND ITS MONASTERIES (1/2 day, morning)*	Come and discover the picturesque region of West Crete; first, you'll visit the heights of the Akrotiri peninsula, home to the Venizelos family's final resting place and a wonderful view of Chania. You will then visit the Chrysopigi Monastery, built in the 16th century and which houses remarkable religious treasures. Finally you will visit the monastery of Haghia Triada, founded in the 17th century, with its Renaissance church, and where you can try their local products.
<b>Day 5 - Wednesday</b> AGIOS NICOLAOS - SAIL IN SPINA LONGA*	Sail the turquoise waters off Crete to the island of Spinalonga. Due to its strategic position guarding the entry to the commercial port of Elounda, control of the island has often been disputed. Discover a rich history uncovered by archaeological digs, with fortifications and other remains left by Byzantine, Venetian, Ottoman and Greek societies over the last 8 centuries.
<b>Day 6 - Thursday</b> RHODES / FILERIMOS AND CITY TOUR (1/2 day, afternoon)*	Discover the stunning landscapes at the northern end of the island, travelling to Mount Filerimos to visit Ancient Ialysos, founded by knights. Then return to visit the medieval city of Rhodes on foot, taking the Street of the Knights, one of the most interesting sights in Rhodes. This cobbled road is lined with gothic "inns" from the 15th and 16th centuries, in which the knights lived with others who shared their "tongue" or language. Afterwards, visit the Grand Master's Palace, built in the 14th century. Return to the boat on foot at your leisure.
<b>Day 6 - Thursday</b> RHODES / THE BUTTERFLY VALLEY AND KAMIROS (1/2 day, morning)*	This panoramic coach tour takes in the new city of Rhodes, Mandraki port and the Agios Stefanos hill, offering a beautiful view over the city. Then you'll follow the coast to the ancient city of Kameiros, built on the side of a hill in the time of the Ancient Greeks. Next, the coast road will take you to the Valley of the Butterflies. This gorgeous forested valley has a calm, cool microclimate. Euplagia quadripunctaria butterflies live in the fresh air of the valley from May to September.
<b>Day 6 - Thursday</b> RHODES / THE SPLENDOR OF RHODES (1 day)*	Discover the Island of Roses, and two of its jems: Rhodes and Lindos! A panoramic tour will take you up to Mount Smith, with the remains of an ancient acropolis and a superb view over the sea and the old town. You'll then travel along the eastern coast of the island to the charming village of Lindos, where you'll visit the acropolis, an ancient fortress of the Knights of St John from which there is a stunning view. You'll be charmed by the little white streets and craft shops, and after lunch you'll walk round the Mediaeval city. You'll walk through the famous cobbled Street of the Knights, lined with 15th and 16th century Gothic "inns". You'll visit the 14th century Palace of the Grand Masters of the Knights of Rhodes, after which you'll have free time to visit the town centre before going back to the ship.
<b>Day 7 - Friday</b> FETHIYE / XANTHOS AND LETOON (1/2 day)*	This morning tour will take you inland to explore Xanthos and Letoon, two archaeological gems on the UNESCO list of World Heritage Sites that are often overlooked. The history of these two ancient cities dates back to 3000 BCE. At the time, Xanthos was the largest administrative centre and capital of Lycia, and Letoon, located 4km from Xanthos, was the religious centre.
<b>Day 8 - Saturday</b> ANTALYA / PERGÉ (1/2 day, morning)*	Located in the distant suburb of Antalya, come and explore the ancient city of Perga, a very impressive archaeological site. The site dates back to the Bronze Age, but the Hittites, Romans and Greeks also left their mark on Perga, making it one of the most beautiful and prosperous cities in the ancient world. You'll be able to see the imposing Roman gate opening onto the city, explore the complex of baths, and walk through the marketplace and shops.

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### Formalities

#### CUSTOMS FORMALITIES

For all UK citizens, a valid passport is essential when you travel abroad. A full 10-year passport is required for holidays to all countries featured on our website. The passport must be valid for at least 6 months beyond your return date with one blank visa page. Make sure your passport is valid and check with the embassy or the consulate of your destination country if you need a visa for your chosen destination prior to travel. It is vital that the name given when booking your holiday (printed on the ticket and itinerary) is exactly the same as written on your passport. Any child, however old, must have his/her own passport. Please note Club Med cannot be held responsible for any issue with regards to passport or visas.

#### HEALTH FORMALITIES

Safe Together.

Club Med has implemented new hygiene and safety measures to offer you peace of mind and a most joyful experience.

As part of the fight against Covid-19, health measures at the borders are being reinforced and may in particular require a virological screening test (for example PCR test) depending on your country of origin, transit or destination before your departure and/or before your return.

We suggest you obtain more information from the consular services of the countries concerned or on the website of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of your nationality and/or place of residence.

Recommended vaccinations: diphtheria, polio, tetanus, hepatitis A and B and typhoid.

Pregnant women who do not need constant medical supervision may come aboard, upon presentation of a medical certificate showing their due date and certifying that their pregnancy is compatible with the cruise.

The final day of the cruise must be before the end of the 26th week of pregnancy.

A doctor and a nurse are present on board.
