

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Itinerary of your cruise

Day 1 - Saturday ANTALYA	Nicknamed the "Turkish Riviera", this seaside resort, which is the most popular in the country, is home to an old city which contains fine examples of local architecture, beautifully carved woodwork, mosques, etc. Ship docked, no water sports. Boarding and disembarkation port of call.		
Day 2 - Sunday ALANYA	Surrounded by scented lemon groves, Alanya is a sun-soaked haven. Its sandy beach and glittering waters make it the perfect place to relax.		
Day 3 - Monday KEKOVA	At the edge of the perfectly clear waters lies a sleepy town. Experience the contrast of a tranquil swim in the sea followed by exploring the untamed mountains to find traces of the ancient region of Lycia. Ship at anchor, water sports available.		
Day 4 - Tuesday MARMARIS	A pretty seaside resort on the Turkish Riviera, its magnificent bay framed by pine-covered mountains is where the Mediterranean Sea meets the Aegean Sea. Boat at dock, nautical hall closed.		
Day 5 - Wednesday PATMOS	The Monastery of Saint John the Theologian, founded in 1088, is the most famous sight on Patmos. This island paradise also has long sandy beaches and picturesque villages, with houses in the traditional Dodecanese style. Ship at anchor, water sports available.		
Day 6 - Thursday DELOS & MYKONOS	Morning in Delos at anchor. The birthplace of Apollo and Artemis, with an archaeological site that is one of the most important in Greece. Short voyage to Mykonos in the middle of the day. The smallest island in the Cyclades owes its popularity to its row of windmills, its immaculate monasteric and its secret beaches. Late port of call. Ship at anchor, no water sports.		
Day 7 - Friday KITHNOS	Known for its thermal springs, its maze of streets lined with white and blue houses and cobbled streets give it an authentic, rural feel. Ship at anchowater sports available.		
Day 8 - Saturday ATHENS/LAVRIO	The Greek capital opens the pages of its age-old history. In the heart of modernity, the Acropolis and the narrow streets of the Plaka district reveal their splendour and charm. Boat docked in Lavrio, no water sports and no direct access to a beach. Passengers boarding and disembarking at this port of call.		





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Excursions of your cruise

Day 2 - Sunday ALANYA / SIDE (1/2 day - morning)*	Inhabited since the 7th century BC and a former pirate stronghold, Side was the largest port in Pamphylia. Ruined in the 10th century AD by Arab raids, it was reoccupied first by farmers in the 20th century, and then by tourist operators. Discover the charm of this ancient town and its impress seafront theatre. You will return via Alanya, visiting the highest point of the city's ramparts for a superb panoramic view.	
Day 3 - Monday KEKOVA / KALEKOY (half day)*	Take a gulet to the picturesque village of Kalekoy, built on the acropolis of the ancient city of Simena. From the top of its medieval castle, take in the magnificent view of the entire bay. A Lycian tomb sits solitary in the middle of the water, an emblematic image of this most charming part of the bay.	
Day 3 - Monday KEKOVA / MYRA (half day, morning)*	EKÓVA / MYRA (half beautiful troglodyte burial sites in Lycia, the Roman theatre and the Church of St Nicolas, patron saint of children and bishop of Myra in the 4

PATMOS / PATMOS, THE ISLAND OF THE APOCALYPSE (1/2 day, morning)*

The Jerusalem of the Aegean! Between Skala and Chora, see the sacred cave where St John is thought to have described his vision of the apocalypse. Then visit the St John monastery and museum in Chora. Founded in 1088, the monastery was a real Medieval fortress, and the museum contains a fragment of St Mark's gospel.

Day 6 - Thursday DELOS (1/2 day, morning)* The birthplace of Artemis and Apollo, Delos is the paradise of archeologists: its 5 sq km are full of ancient ruins, temples and Greco-Roman sanctuaries. With our guides you will learn about this "diamond" of the Cyclades, a true open-air museum with all the essentials of ancient life, in particular a large pan-Hellenic sanctuary along with a maritime and commercial city with its ports and shops.

Day 6 - Thursday MYKONOS / BETWEEN LAND AND SEA (1/2 day, morning)*

Enjoy a lovely morning exploring Mykonos. See some of the island's hidden gems and fall in love with the views.

Discover the village of Ano Mera and marvel at its monastery, particularly the cupola and iconostasis.

Relax on the sand at Kalafatis beach or similar. (deckchairs and parasols available on site at extra cost, subject to availability)

Day 8 - Saturday ATHENS/LAVRIO ACROPOLIS MUSEUM (1/2 day, morning)*

before your departure, we will offer you the chance to take an amazing tour of the latest discoveries made below the Acropolis Museum. You will be able to explore the remains of the private buildings, narrow streets and public places that made up this great city in ancient times, below the modern city of Athens

Next, you will see major pieces from the Golden Age of Athens, including the Caryatids and the Parthenon Frieze. Transfer back to the airport or CM2 depending of the flight tickets.

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Formalities

CUSTOMS FORMALITIES

For all UK citizens, a valid passport is essential when you travel abroad. A full 10-year passport is required for holidays to all countries featured on our website. The passport must be valid for at least 6 months beyond your return date with one blank visa page. Make sure your passport is valid and check with the embassy or the consulate of your destination country if you need a visa for your chosen destination prior to travel. It is vital that the name given when booking your holiday (printed on the ticket and itinerary) is exactly the same as written on your passport. Any child, however old, must have his/her own passport. Please note Club Med cannot be held responsible for any issue with regards to passport or visas.

HEALTH FORMALITIES

Safe Together.

Club Med has implemented new hygiene and safety measures to offer you peace of mind and a most joyful experience.

As part of the fight against Covid-19, health measures at the borders are being reinforced and may in particular require a virological screening test (for example PCR test) depending on your country of origin, transit or destination before your departure and/or before your return.

We suggest you obtain more information from the consular services of the countries concerned or on the website of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of your nationality

and/or place of residence.

Recommended vaccinations: diphtheria, polio, tetanus, hepatitis A and B and typhoid.

Pregnant women who do not need constant medical supervision may come aboard, upon presentation of a medical certificate

showing their due date and certifying that their pregnancy is compatible with the cruise.

The final day of the cruise must be before the end of the 26th week of pregnancy.

A doctor and a nurse are present on board.
