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# Itinerary of your cruise

Day 1 - Saturday ATHENS/LAVRIO	The Greek capital opens the pages of its age-old history. In the heart of modernity, the Acropolis and the narrow streets of the Plaka district reveal their splendour and charm. Boat docked in Lavrio, no water sports and no direct access to a beach. Passengers boarding and disembarking at this port of call.	
Day 2 - Sunday NAUPLIA	The original capital of modern day Greece is a charming city that combines Neoclassical and Ottoman influences. Can be admired from the citadel and from the Venitian fort. Ship at anchor. Water sports.	
Day 3 - Monday GYTHEON	Located at the southern tip of the Peloponnese, this small seaside town is reflected in the clear waters of the Mediterranean. A small, intimate and colourful port, Gytheon offers a variety of seafood specialities to be enjoyed by the water's edge. Boat at anchor.	
Day 4 - Tuesday SAILING ON THE OPEN SEA	A restorative day at sea. Choose from the range of inviting possibilities on our remarkable sailing ship. Lounge on chaise longues, cool off in one of ou two swimming pools, work out with a sea view in our Espace Fitness, find instant calm at the spa and enjoy the attentive company of our G.O <sup>®</sup> team and crew members.	
Day 5 - Wednesday LA VALETTE	Its deep natural port gave Malta its status as the crossroads of the Mediterranean, and a history that goes back to the dawn of humanity. Mystical and cultural, its blend of styles preserves its fascination intact. Ship docked.	
Day 6 - Thursday SOUSSE	Known as "the pearl of the Sahel", it is a typical example of a city from the first centuries of Islam, with a kasbah, ramparts, medina and Great Mosqu The UNESCO-listed Medina of Sousse is an architectural ensemble that reflects Arab-Muslim city planning. Boat at dock, hall nautique closed.	
Day 7 - Friday LA GOULETTE/TUNIS	Situated 10 km from Tunis, the picturesque port of La Goulette has suffered many attacks in the past, the most memorable of which was perpetrated by Barbarossa in 1534. Charles V, who then seized it, had a Spanish-Turkish fortress built at the entrance to the town, which was used as a prison for a long time. Boat at quay, no water sports.	
Day 8 - Saturday TRAPANI	Trapani, the westernmost province of Sicily and a true architectural gem, proudly bears the traces of the Orient. The small, oriental-style squares rub shoulders with centuries-old churches, and all bordered by vineyards. Boat docked, dive locker closed, no direct access to the beach.	
Day 9 - Sunday PALERMO	The historic centre holds an irresistible fascination for visitors. The civilisations that helped weave its history have left their mark on the sun-scorched stones and the shady little streets. Boat docked, no water sports and no direct access to a beach.	
Day 10 - Monday LIPARI	The island's volcanic origins have forged the most astonishing landscapes. Invaded time and again, its citadel reveals the island's multi-facetted personality through the multiple influences of its architure. Ship at anchor. No Water sports.	
Day 11 - Tuesday NAPLES	One of the finest bays in the world, dominated by Vesuvius, an emblem of romanticism. The city centre is a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Ship docke	
Day 12 - Wednesday SAILING ON THE OPEN SEA	A restorative day at sea and hoose from the range of inviting possibilities on our remarkable sailing ship.	
Day 13 - Thursday NICE	From markets to the uber famous Promenade, it cultivates a love of flowers and the arts. It is full of vitality with ambiances that range from neoclassical elegance to the up-beat tempo of the old quarter. Boat docked, no water sports. Boarding and disembarkation port of call.	





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# Excursions of your cruise

Day 2 - Sunday NAFPLIO - MYCENAE AND EPIDAURUS (1/2 day)*	Mycenae: this is where the expedition against Troy set off from, and where Clytemnestra had her royal husband assassinated by her lover. You'll discover the famous Lion Gate, the palace with a most superb view and the tomb of Agamemnon. Epidaurus: the visit will focus on the theatre, but also on its exceptional natural beauty. It's not surprising that this is where Asclepios, the god of medecine, opened his first doctor's surgery.	
Day 2 - Sunday NAFPLIO / CORINTH CANAL (1/2 day)*	The Corinth Canal is an artificial waterway channelled through the Isthmus of Corinth. This trip takes you along the canal by boat. An unforgettable experience!	
Day 3 - Monday GYTHEON - MISTRA (1/2 day)*	On an exceptional site in the foothills of Mount Taygetos, Mystras looks down over Sparta and the valley of the River Eurotas. Its ruined houses, churches, palaces and Byzantine monasteries decorated with superb mosaics illustrate the splendour of the former capital of the Despotate of the Morea. At an altitude of 621 metres, the fortress - built in 1248 - was never conquered. 4hrs return Bus and visit on foot - good walking shoes are essential.	
Day 3 - Monday GYTHEON - THE CAVES OF DIROS (1/2 day, afternoon)*	At the southernmost tip of the Peloponnese, Mani is a remote region that forms a rocky promontory betwen the Gulfs of Messenia and Laconia. On t western coast, the Caves of Diros are one of Greece's most spectacular natural features, Glifada being the most famous of the caves. A boat will take you on a 2-km ride along a subterranean river to admire stalactites, stalagmites and some fabulous crystals. Bus and boat. We recommend you wear good walking shoes and pullovers.	
Day 5 - Wednesday LA VALETTE ET SES MERVEILLES (1/2 journée - matin)*	Fortified by the Knights Hospitalier, then transformed into a baroque masterpiece with churches, palaces and museums, La Valette encapsulates Malta's history and artistic heritage. Your trip begins with the Upper Barrakka Gardens, which offer outstanding views of the Grand Harbour and Thre Cities. Then see the Grandmaster's Palace, where the richly decorated interior shows the power and prestige of the Knights of St John. At the end of the trip, enjoy some free time to wander the streets of this charming town. (St John's Cathedral is closed on Saturdays afternoon and sundays.)	
Day 6 - Thursday SOUSSE / BEST OF TUNISIA*	Enjoy an unforgettable day exploring Tunisia's Sahel region! Start your tour of Kairouan with a visit to the Great Mosque, one of the oldest and most important in the Muslim world. Built in the 7th century, it is renowned for its majestic architecture and impressive minaret. Then it's on to El Jem to admire the famous Colosseum, a true symbol of Tunisia's Roman heritage. Built in the 3rd century, it is one of the best-preserved monuments in the world, and could accommodate up to 35,000 spectators. Immerse yourself in the fascinating history of gladiators and the shows that took place her Finally, round off your day with a visit to the Medina of Sousse, a UNESCO World Heritage site. Stroll through its lively alleyways, discover its colorfu souks and let yourself be captivated by the vibrant atmosphere of this place rich in history. Admire the typical architecture and soak up the local culture. By bus 1h30.	
Day 6 - Thursday SOUSSE / EL JEM*	Discover El Jem's incredible historical heritage on this fascinating excursion. You'll start with a visit to the majestic Colosseum, a masterpiece of Roman architecture dating back to the 3rd century. This impressive monument, one of the best preserved in the world, will plunge you into the worl of gladiators and ancient shows. Next, head to the nearby El Jem Museum, where you can admire a remarkable collection of Roman mosaics and artifacts that tell the story of this region.	
Day 6 - Thursday SOUSSE / KAIROUAN (1/2 day)*	Come and explore Kairouan, an emblematic city in Tunisia's Sahel region. Start with a visit to the Great Mosque of Kairouan, an architectural masterpiece dating back to the 9th century. Built by the Caliph Abu Ibrahim, it is famous for its imposing minaret and rich décor. Next, take a stroll through the Medina, a UNESCO World Heritage site. Stroll through its narrow streets, where history reveals itself at every turn. Admire the colorful souks, where local crafts, spices and textiles thrill your senses. Take a break in a picturesque café for a delicious mint tea or refreshing lemonade. By bus 1h30. Please note that the Mosque will closed at 2.00pm.	
Day 6 - Thursday SOUSSE / SOUSSE & SA MÉDINA*	Immerse yourself in the cultural richness of Sousse with this captivating excursion. Start with a panoramic bus tour, giving you an overview of this historic city and its picturesque landscapes. Next, visit the Archaeological Museum, where you'll discover ancient treasures that bear witness to the region's fascinating history. Afterwards, take a stroll through the Medina, a veritable labyrinth of lively alleyways and colorful souks. On this walk, tak a break in a typical café, far from the tourist trails, to enjoy a delicious mint tea or refreshing local drink before returning to port.	
Day 7 - Friday TUNIS /CARTHAGE AND SIDI BOU SAID (1/2 day)*	Leave the modern city behind and travel to ancient Carthage. Your guide will show you around this historical site that is over 3000 years old, where you can marvel at the beautiful examples of Punic and Roman buildings, including the ruined amphitheatre. After your visit, you will continue to the Moorish village of Sidi Bou Said, with its bright blue and white painted houses. Your guide will walk you arour this village, perched on the cliffs overlooking the bay of Tunis.	
Day 7 - Friday TUNIS / MEDINA DE TUNIS (1/2 day)*	This guided tour through the winding streets of the old city of Tunis is an opportunity to discover the rich cultural heritage of the old walled city and discover the exquisite craftsmanship of Tunisian artisans.	
Day 7 - Friday TUNIS / SOUK AND MUSEUM (1/2 day)*	Come and discover the treasures of the Bardo Museum. This ancient palace, filled with treasures from Carthage and other important sites, tells the story of Tunisia through the ages, and is renowned for its fine collection of mosaics. You'll then move on to the UNESCO World Heritage Medina of Tunis, where you'll stroll through its unique architecture before enjoying some free time for shopping in the souk at the heart of the medina. Not available on Mondays, the museum's weekly closing day.	
Day 7 - Friday TUNIS / THE AMAZING UTHINA (1/2 day)*	Leave the Tunisian capital and visit the archaeological site of Oudna, open to the public only since 1999, formerly called Uthina. Set amidst grassy meadows overlooking a vast agricultural landscape, the site contains two main monuments, the Capitol and the Amphitheatre. Also discover its cisterns, its thermal baths, its villas, its mosaics and its theatre! Have fun getting lost in this still little-known Roman city with enormous potential.	
Day 8 - Saturday TRAPANI - SELINUNTE (1/2 day - morning)*	Spend a morning in Selinunte Archaeological Park, between the green hills and the dark blue sea, and dive into the island's tempestuous history. Founded in 650 BC by the Greeks and chosen for its proximity to the sea and its fertile soil, it was destroyed by the Carthaginians under Hannibal. Selinute's magnificent monuments and their breathtaking natural surroundings will etch themselves into your memory.

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Visit the little medieval village of Erice, built like a lookout post 752 metres above sea level. Known for its many churches and historic Porta Trapani, Erice is also famous for its special almond biscuits. The tour continues on to Trapani, a little seaside town founded by the Phoenicians that became a maritime hub during the Arab era.	
Your destination is Palermo, the city of contrasts. After travelling along the city's main streets, you'll discover the magnificent Baroque-Rococo church of Saint Caterine where almost every surface is covered with paintings, cherubim, decorative marbles and colors Martorana church, with its golden Byzantine mosaics and brightly coloured frescoes. Then you'll see the bustle of the old town as you wander through the local Ballar market. You'll really feel the contrasts as you pass noisy stalls laden down with produce before reaching a truly dignified palazzo. The owners themselves, descendants of an old noble family, will take you on a tour, guiding you through the reception rooms and corridors to show you the very best of Sic architecture and heritage. At the end of the tour, the owners we will invite you to try some of Palermo's specialities.	
Visit the breathtaking city of Palermo. Founded by the Phonecians, it was a Roman trade hub and a Muslim city before being conquered by the Normans. Later it became the capital of the Kingdom of the Two Sicilies until reunification with Italy. You'll visit the cathedral, dedicated to the Assumption and marked by the use of highly contrasting architectural styles, and wander through the old town to see its many churches and extravagant fountains. Then you'll head to Monreale to discover the jaw-dropping interior of its cathedral, with an incredible brightly coloured mosaic covering 6340 square metres, depicting scenes of Christ and the Apostles.(excursion requiring the European Covid/Green Pass digital certificate)	
You'll begin by a tour of the island by bus, with fabulous views of the other Aeolian Islands, and a huge pummice stone quarry. You'll then return to Lipari and walk up to the citadel where you'll visit the finest archeological museum in Europe (including some amphora and other objects discovered by Club Med divers). You'll walk back down steps to the ship where you can stroll through Marina Corta.	
After a wonderful trip from Lipari to Vulcano, you will have free time to enjoy exploring one of the villages on Vulcano (The springs are closed)	
Despite its lack of facilities, the city of Herculaneum attracted rich people from Campania and Rome thanks to its location and amazing views over th Bay of Naples. Life there stopped in AD 79 following the eruption of Vesuvius which covered the city in a layer of ash. Here, you can see the public buildings such as the baths and the shops including the bakery whose oven and millstones were preserved, but above all the many Roman houses, some which still feature splendid decorations. Marble paving, mosaics and paintings bring the city back to life.	
You'll begin the tour at Mergellina and Posillipo Hill, famous for their panoramic view over the Gulf of Naples. You'll then go on to Castel Nuovo, symb of the city's architecture. The bus will take you to the Royal Palace, the outside façade of which is studded with statues of the King of Naples. You'll pass via the Teatro San Carlo, one of the oldest opera houses in Europe, and have free time in the Piazza Plebiscito before going back to the ship.	
The town was a flourishing community with over 25,000 inhabitants when it met with catastrophe on 24 August in the year 79 CE. Its inhabitants we killed by the eruption of Vesuvius as they went about their everyday lives, and a shroud of cinders kept the site almost intact. As well as the incredit collection of monuments, homes, works of art and furnishings that the excavations have uncovered, the site reveals daily life in ancient times in stunning detail.	
After admiring the wonderful landscapes of the Riviera through the middle cornice, you will visit one of the most picturesque perched villages in the region. You will walk through the alleys of the small medieval village of Eze to discover all the hidden charm. You will then visit the exotic garden that fi the ruins of the medieval castle and contemplate the most beautiful view of the Côte d'Azur and the Bay of Beaulieu in particular.

#### **CUSTOMS FORMALITIES**

For all UK citizens, a valid passport is essential when you travel abroad. A full 10-year passport is required for holidays to all countries featured on our website. The passport must be valid for at least 6 months beyond your return date with one blank visa page. Make sure your passport is valid and check with the embassy or the consulate of your destination country if you need a visa for your chosen destination prior to travel. It is vital that the name given when booking your holiday (printed on the ticket and itinerary) is exactly the same as written on your passport. Any child, however old, must have his/her own passport. Please note Club Med cannot be held responsible for any issue with regards to passport or visas.

#### HEALTH FORMALITIES

Safe Together.

Club Med has implemented new hygiene and safety measures to offer you peace of mind and a most joyful experience.

As part of the fight against Covid-19, health measures at the borders are being reinforced and may in particular require a virological screening test (for example PCR test) depending on your country of origin, transit or destination before your departure and/or before your return. We suggest you obtain more information from the consular services of the countries concerned or on the website of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of your nationality

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Recommended vaccinations: diphtheria, polio, tetanus, hepatitis A and B and typhoid. Pregnant women who do not need constant medical supervision may come aboard, upon presentation of a medical certificate

showing their due date and certifying that their pregnancy is compatible with the cruise.

The final day of the cruise must be before the end of the 26th week of pregnancy.

A doctor and a nurse are present on board.
