| Day 1 - Monday NICE | From markets to the uber famous Promenade, it cultivates a love of flowers and the arts. It is full of vitality with ambiances that range from neoclassical elegance to the up-beat tempo of the old quarter. Boat docked, no water sports. Boarding and disembarkation port of call. |
| Day 2 - Tuesday MARSEILLE | Founded in 600 BCE by Greek sailors from Phocaea, the Old Port and its historic neighbourhoods, the Byzantine-style Notre-Dame-de-la-Garde basilica, its sunny corniche facing the sea and its wild rocky inlets make it a city of great contrasts. Ship docked, no water sports. |
| Day 3 - Wednesday SÈTE | Located between the Mediterranean and the Étang de Thau, famous for its oysters, Sète is also known as the "Venice of the Languedoc" because of its network of canals. It has retained its old world charm thanks to the ports located in the heart of the city. Boat docked, dive locker closed, stopover without beach. |
| Day 4 - Thursday COLLIOURE | Lapped by the waters of the Mediterranean, at the foot of the Pyrenees, Collioure has inspired painters such as Matisse and Chagall. Its narrow cobbled streets wind between two harbours, where brightly painted Catalan rowing boats bob on the waves. Ship at anchor, water sports available. |
| Day 5 - Friday ROSES | The Catalan citadel is an ancient Greek colony founded in the 4th century BC by settlers from Marseille, and sits in a picturesque bay that is home to 16th-century fortifications and megalithic tombs. Boat at dock, nautical hall closed. |
| Day 6 - Saturday BARCELONE | Barcelona is a vibrant cocktail of tradition and avant-garde, where culture and fun combine to ensure a fabulous stay. By night or day, the Ramblas and the barrios are a feast for the senses. Ship docked, no water sports and no direct access to a beach. Stopover for boarding and disembarking. |



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Excursions of your cruise

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| <p>Day 2 - Tuesday MARSEILLE / AIX EN PROVENCE, HOMETLAND OF CÉZANNE (1/2 day, morning)*</p> | <p>Let's go to Aix en Provence, former capital of Provence and homeland of the famous painter Paul Cézanne. Stroll along the Cours Mirabeau, built on the site of the medieval ramparts, admire the elegant facades of its mansions, explore the old Mazarin district and discover the magnificent Saint-Sauveur Cathedral with contrasting architectural styles. You will also enjoy some free time to shop or relax on the terrace of a café.</p> |
| <p>Day 2 - Tuesday MARSEILLE / CASSIS*</p> | <p>Take the Route des Crêtes to reach this little fishing port, a genuine natural gem, nestled between two incredible sites: Cap Canaille and the famous Massif des Calanques. The imposing cliffs and the sea stretching out as far as the eye can see constitute the breathtaking scenery. You will discover the secret charm of this charming village by walking through the narrow alleys and squares lined with colourful fishermen's houses, a postcard landscape !</p> |
| <p>Day 2 - Tuesday MARSEILLE / AIX-EN- PROVENCE CHEESE & WINE*</p> | <p>Drive to the charming old town of Aix. This was the capital of the Provence region and its attractions are numerous. First, you will embark on a walking tour of the Cours Mirabeau. This wide avenue is shaded by trees and was built in the 1600s on the site of the city's medieval ramparts; its verdant tunnel of foliage protects pedestrians from the heat of the Provençal sun. The aristocratic façades of the old mansions line the Cours and their wrought-iron balconies and finely carved doorways invite the visitor to explore. You will see a fountain dating back to 1743, particularly noteworthy for producing 93°F water which the Romans believed had healing properties. Note the different architectural styles of Saint Sauveur Cathedral with a Romanesque nave, a Merovingian baptistery and a Gothic section. These various styles date between the 5th and the 17th centuries. Whatever your interest, the ambiance of Aix en Provence makes for an enjoyable excursion into France. Your guide will then lead you to a local shop where you will enjoy a wine and cheese tasting in a relax setting, both will be cleverly matched to let you savour these French delicacies ! Get some free time in the city. After free time, drive back to the ship."</p> |
| <p>Day 3 - Wednesday SETE / THAU CANALS AND POND (2 hours)*</p> | <p>Come and see the city of Sète from another angle! Navigate the calm waters of the canals to the characteristic district of Pointe Courte and admire the different styles of facades that give the city its charm. This crossing via the maritime canal and the fixed and swing bridges will take you to the lake of Thau, a real inland sea of over 20 kilometres, to learn about the breeding of oysters and mussels.</p> |
| <p>Day 4 - Thursday COLLIOURE - PANORAMA OF COLLIOURE*</p> | <p>Travel through the Collioure vineyards to Fort Saint-Elme, which dominates the Côte Vermeille from the crest of a ridge. Explore the fort and its history (outside discovery) before taking the coastal route back to Collioure. Then take a guided walk around the town, spotting copies of works by Matisse and Derain positioned where the originals were painted.</p> |
| <p>Day 5 - Friday ROSAS - GERONA (1/2 day)*</p> | <p>After an hour, your trip begins in earnest with a walk along the old streets of Gerona. Each successive era (Roman, Gothic) has left the city with even more impressive architecture. You will visit the spectacular cathedral and cloisters, and the Call, one of the city's unmissable sights.</p> |
| <p>Day 5 - Friday ROSES / MAISON- MUSÉE SALVADOR DALÍ À FIGARES*</p> | <p>A charming Catalan town, Figueres is most famous for being the birthplace of Salvador Dalí. Right in the heart of the town is a veritable work of art designed by Dalí himself: the Dalí Theatre-Museum. It offers total immersion in the artist's surrealist universe, where every room, every work, every detail exudes the spirit of Dalí. Here you'll discover a vast collection of his creations, from paintings and drawings to sculptures and installations. A visit to this museum offers a fascinating insight into Salvador Dalí's boundless imagination and his lasting impact on the art world.</p> |
| <p>Day 5 - Friday ROSES / SAINT PERE DE RODES*</p> | <p>Discover the majestic Monastery of Sant Pere de Rodes, a true medieval treasure offering a fascinating immersion in history, art and breathtaking panoramas. Perched on the heights, it invites you to a unique exploration.</p> |
| <p>Day 6 - Saturday BARCELONA / BARCELONA: GUELL'S LEGACY (1/2 day - afternoon)*</p> | <p>This half-day tour will give you the opportunity to explore the architectural heritage of one of Barcelona's most famous architects: Antoni Gaudí (1852 - 1926). A visit to Paseo de Gràcia, this lively and trendy boulevard considered the centre of modernist Barcelona, is a visit to a real open-air museum, with architectural treasures from the 19th century that includes two of Gaudí's masterpieces: Casa Batlló (built in 1877) and La Pedrera (built between 1906 and 1910). You will marvel at the magnificence and originality of La Sagrada Família (Church of the Holy Family/ exterior visit) before finishing your tour in the heart of Guell Park overlooking the capital.</p> |

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Formalities

CUSTOMS FORMALITIES

For all UK citizens, a valid passport is essential when you travel abroad. A full 10-year passport is required for holidays to all countries featured on our website. The passport must be valid for at least 6 months beyond your return date with one blank visa page. Make sure your passport is valid and check with the embassy or the consulate of your destination country if you need a visa for your chosen destination prior to travel. It is vital that the name given when booking your holiday (printed on the ticket and itinerary) is exactly the same as written on your passport. Any child, however old, must have his/her own passport. Please note Club Med cannot be held responsible for any issue with regards to passport or visas.

HEALTH FORMALITIES

Safe Together.

Club Med has implemented new hygiene and safety measures to offer you peace of mind and a most joyful experience.

As part of the fight against Covid-19, health measures at the borders are being reinforced and may in particular require a virological screening test (for example PCR test) depending on your country of origin, transit or destination before your departure and/or before your return.

We suggest you obtain more information from the consular services of the countries concerned or on the website of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of your nationality and/or place of residence.

Recommended vaccinations: diphtheria, polio, tetanus, hepatitis A and B and typhoid.

Pregnant women who do not need constant medical supervision may come aboard, upon presentation of a medical certificate showing their due date and certifying that their pregnancy is compatible with the cruise.

The final day of the cruise must be before the end of the 26th week of pregnancy.

A doctor and a nurse are present on board.
