

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Itinerary of your cruise

Day 1 - Saturday BARCELONE	Barcelona is a vibrant cocktail of tradition and avant-garde, where culture and fun combine to ensure a fabulous stay. By night or day, the Ramblas and the barrios are a feast for the senses. Ship docked, no water sports and no direct access to a beach. Stopover for boarding and disembarking.	
Day 2 - Sunday PALMA DE MALLORCA	Dominated by its imposing cathedral, considered to be one of the most beautiful Gothic structures in Spain, the capital of the Balearic Islands has a twin identity, combining modernism and traditions. Ship docked, no water sports.	
Day 3 - Monday VALENCE	Covering 2,000 m ² , the gothic architecture of the Lonja de la Seda (Silk Exchange) has Unesco World Heritage status. It faces the Mercado Centrale, one of the most beautiful covered markets in Europe. Ship docked, no water sports and no direct access to a beach.	
Day 4 - Tuesday ALICANTE	The Greeks called it the white citadel and the Romans the city of light. Closely linked, the old town, the port and the beach make this a city with its face turned resolutely towards the sea. Ship docked, no water sports, beach.	
Day 5 - Wednesday CARTHAGÈNE	Brightly coloured Andalusian houses enliven Cartagena, an arid former mining city with a special Mediterranean charm. Many cultures have made Cartgena home over the centuries, leaving behind a rich artistic history that is still visible today. Ship docked, no water sports and no direct access a beach.	
Day 6 - Thursday PUERTO BANUS/ MARBELLA	This marina, located in the Andalusian city of Marbella, is now a go-to destination on the Costa del Sol, thanks to its old village filled with flowers. The city has kept its charm in spite of the massive development of hotels and modern buildings along its beautiful beaches. Ship docked, no water sports and no direct access to a beach.	
Day 7 - Friday GIBRALTAR	Claimed by both the UK and Spanish governments, Gibraltar is a slice of Englishness at the tip of Spain. With streets lined with varied architecture, market in the traditional Andalusian style and iconic red telephone boxes, Gibraltar is indisputably unique. Ship docked, no water sports and no dir access to a beach.	
Day 8 - Saturday MALAGA	Cosmopolitan Andalusia has 300 days of sunshine a year. It's also a major landmark in the history of Cubism - you can visit the house where Picasso was born and the museum with over 200 of his works. Ship docked in port.	





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Excursions of your cruise

Day 2 - Sunday PALMA DE MALLORCA / VALDEMOSSA, SOLLER (half day - morning)*	Come and explore the lovely village of Valdemossa, made famous by George Sand and Frédéric Chopin who stayed there in the winter of 1839. It is characterised by its traditional Majorcan houses and narrow streets, not wide enough for cars, decorated with pots of colourful flowers hanging everywhere and filling the village with fragrance. Next, you will discover the town of Soller that sits in the bottom of a deep valley. Its name comes from the main industry in the area, the growing of citrus fruit. For many years, the town was only accessible on foot, until the tramway was built to link it to the outside world.	
Day 3 - Monday VALENCE - HISTORICAL VALENCE (1/2 day)*	Come and discover the heart and soul of Valencia, one of the most dynamic and lively cities in Spain. We will guide you through its different neighbourhoods to explore the iconic monuments of Valencia: the Serrano Towers, the central market and Valencia's magnificent Gothic cathedral, symbol of its Moorish past.	
Day 3 - Monday VALENCE - VALENCE TAPAS TOUR (1/2 day - morning)	Stroll through the streets and squares of Valencia's old quarter and see some of its principal monuments. Make a pit-stop in a selection of the most popular bars and restaurants - some are quite traditional while others are quite avant-garde - and enjoy a variety of different tapas with some good wine and enjoy good conversation with our local guide.	
Day 4 - Tuesday ALICANTE / ALICANTE PANORAMIC AND GASTRONOMIC*	Discover the enchanting hinterland with a guided vineyard tour, where you'll taste some of the region's most renowned wines. You will enjoy, also, a scenic tour of Alicante. 1h by bus until the vineyard.	
Day 6 - Thursday MARBELLA/MIJAS (1/2 day, morning)*	This picturesque white village, clinging to the side of the mountain, will amaze you with the spectacular views it offers from the summits of Sierra de Mijas to the Meditarranean Coast. You will discover the sanctuary of the Virgin of La Peña, her secrets and legends.	
Day 7 - Friday GIBRALTAR*	First Stop is Europa Point, on a clear day you can see the North African coast on the other side of the Straits of Gibraltar. You can also see the Spani enclave of Ceuta, a Spanish occupied territory in Morocco. Along the way you have breathtaking views of the Bay of Gibraltar. The Second Stop is St. Michael's Cave, a very large cave with stalactites and stalagmites, dating back millions of years. Our Third Stop is the Apes Den. You will then go to the Upper Galleries, the Moorish Castle, Old Town Calpe and along Queensway. You will enjoy some free time for shopping a the Market Place.	
Day 8 - Saturday MALAGA / MALAGA AND PICASSO (1/2 day)*	You will take a trip around the historic and modern centre of Malaga. You will pass by the Cathedral, a very beautiful example of Spanish Renaissance architecture, before going to the Picasso museum which tells the story of 80 years the artist's work, who was a native of Malaga. Your guide will teach you how to understand his works, from the most famous to the most obscure.

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Formalities

CUSTOMS FORMALITIES

For all UK citizens, a valid passport is essential when you travel abroad. A full 10-year passport is required for holidays to all countries featured on our website. The passport must be valid for at least 6 months beyond your return date with one blank visa page. Make sure your passport is valid and check with the embassy or the consulate of your destination country if you need a visa for your chosen destination prior to travel. It is vital that the name given when booking your holiday (printed on the ticket and itinerary) is exactly the same as written on your passport. Any child, however old, must have his/her own passport. Please note Club Med cannot be held responsible for any issue with regards to passport or visas.

HEALTH FORMALITIES

Safe Together.

Club Med has implemented new hygiene and safety measures to offer you peace of mind and a most joyful experience.

As part of the fight against Covid-19, health measures at the borders are being reinforced and may in particular require a virological screening test (for example PCR test) depending on your country of origin, transit or destination before your departure and/or before your return. We suggest you obtain more information from the consular services of the countries concerned or on the website of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of your nationality

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Recommended vaccinations: diphtheria, polio, tetanus, hepatitis A and B and typhoid. Pregnant women who do not need constant medical supervision may come aboard, upon presentation of a medical certificate

showing their due date and certifying that their pregnancy is compatible with the cruise.

The final day of the cruise must be before the end of the 26th week of pregnancy.
