

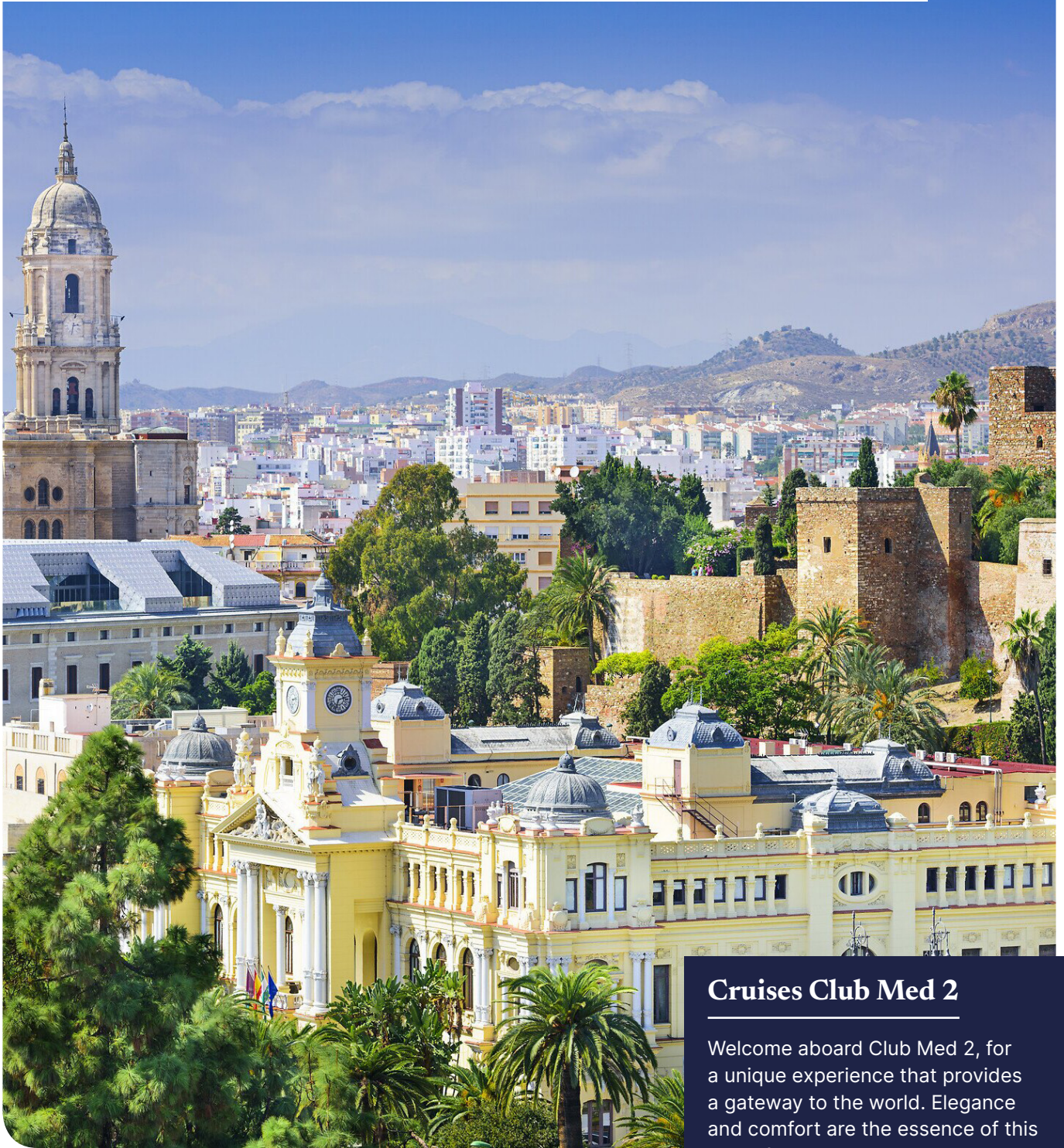

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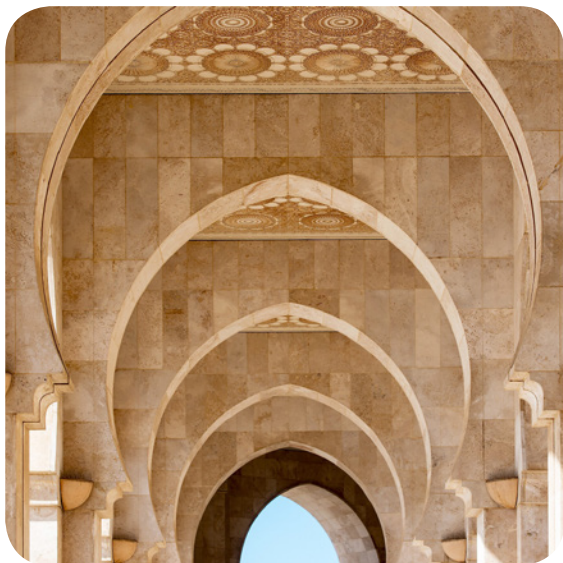

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## Itinerary of your cruise

<b>Day 1 - Saturday</b> <b>MALAGA</b>	Cosmopolitan Andalusia has 300 days of sunshine a year. It's also a major landmark in the history of Cubism - you can visit the house where Picasso was born and the museum with over 200 of his works. Ship docked in port.
<b>Day 2 - Sunday</b> <b>CEUTA</b>	An open city linking two continents, this Spanish enclave on the north coast of Africa is unique in that it brings together four cultures, in a harmonious combination of Christian, Muslim, Hebrew and Hindu traditions. Boat docked, nautical hall closed, no direct access to the beach.
<b>Day 3 - Monday</b> <b>CADIZ</b>	The oldest city in the West, boasting more than 3,000 years of history and prosperity, witnessed Christopher Columbus leave for the New World. Always cheerful and full of Andalusian character. Boat docked, dive locker closed, no direct access to the beach.
<b>Day 4 - Tuesday</b> <b>TANGER</b>	Tangier is where North meets South. White buildings sit like spectators in an amphitheatre, looking down to the sea. A magnet for artists, its striking beauty has inspired many a painter. Ship docked, no water sports.
<b>Day 5 - Wednesday</b> <b>SAFI</b>	Safi is situated on Morocco's Atlantic coast and boasts a rich architectural heritage. Minarets, bell towers and synagogues stand side by side with 16th-century Portuguese palaces and forts around a bustling medina. Stroll through the narrow streets of Morocco's capital of ceramics, leading to the potters' hill. Boat docked, nautical hall closed, no direct access to the beach.
<b>Day 6 - Thursday</b> <b>AGADIR</b>	Destroyed by an earthquake in 1960, the city has been reborn as the biggest seaside resort in Morocco. From the ancient casbah that overlooks the port, the big souk reveals the riches of this agricultural region and the diversity of its craftsmanship. Ship docked, no water sports, beach.
<b>Day 7 - Friday</b> <b>ARRECIFE</b>	Lanzarote's capital takes its name from the word for reef. The volcanic island is full of surprises, with green crops springing up from the black, cindery ground. Ship docked, no water sports.
<b>Day 8 - Saturday</b> <b>LAS PALMAS</b>	The historic centre with its cobbled streets, the many lively neighbourhoods and the long beach of fine sand make the biggest city in the Canary Islands an unmissable stopover. Ship docked, no water sports. Boarding and disembarkation port of call.





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## Excursions of your cruise

<b>Day 2 - Sunday</b> CEUTA / BEST OF CEUTA*	Discover the main sights of Ceuta, this autonomous city of Spain located on the African coast. Take the scenic route into the hills to Monte Hacho. Visit the Mediterranean Marine Park, this splendid leisure park made up of salt water swimming pools, palm trees and various restaurants. Admire the different views of Ceuta and the "strait". And finish with the discovery of the old town of Ceuta. The nerve center of this multicultural city is the majestic Plaza de Nuestra Señora de África.
<b>Day 2 - Sunday</b> CEUTA / PANORAMIC TOUR OF CEUTA*	Discover the main sights of Ceuta, this autonomous city of Spain located on the African coast. Take the scenic route into the hills to Monte Hacho. And finish with the discovery of the old town of Ceuta. The nerve center of this multicultural city is the majestic Plaza de Nuestra Señora de África.
<b>Day 3 - Monday</b> CADIZ ON FOOT (1/2 day, morning)*	Discover the oldest city in Europe and its fabulous historic monuments including the Piazza d'España and Calle Antonio Lopez, full of interesting architectural features. After a panoramic bus tour, you will visit the cathedral overlooking Campo del Sur. To conclude this guided tour, you will access Tavira Tower where a panoramic and amazing view of the city of Cadiz will reward you for your efforts.
<b>Day 4 - Tuesday</b> TANGIER / TANGIER AND THE CAVES OF HERCULES*	Before visiting the town, you'll travel to Cape Spartel, the most north-westerly point of Africa, from which you can see the Strait of Gibraltar. You'll visit the famous Caves of Hercules, where legend says Hercules separated Africa from Europe. At Cape Spartel, you can try traditional mint tea. Then you'll return to Tangiers, known as la Blanche, a source of inspiration for many artists and writers such as Matisse, Jean Genet and Joseph Kessel. You'll visit the Kasbah and the old Medina, with its bustling streets. At the end of the excursion, you'll have a little free time to buy souvenirs.
<b>Day 5 - Wednesday</b> SAFI / DÉCOUVERTE DE SAFI*	Discover Safi, one of the ancient cities of Morocco. Little is known about its foundation, but the city was inhabited by the Carthaginians who named it Asfi, then by the Romans, the Goths and finally by the Muslims. Start your visit with a walk in Sidi Bouzid and enjoy a magnificent view of the Atlantic Ocean, the port and part of the city. Walk the main avenues and head to Dar Sultan, a citadel dating from the 15th century, then explore the heart of the medina and the National Ceramics Museum. Before enjoying a refreshing mint tea, discover the pride of the city: Potter's Hill and the variety of ceramic crafts on display.
<b>Day 5 - Wednesday</b> SAFI / ESSAOUIRA*	Explore the rich history of the captivating city of Essaouira, once called Mogador during the Portuguese era. This ancient port of Phoenician origin transports you to a distant past. Your tour of Essaouira will begin from the traditional fishing port, bustling with activity, offering picturesque views of Mogador Island and the maritime fortifications. Next, explore the Medina, listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 2001, an exceptional and well-preserved example of European military architecture in North Africa. Enter the medina and immerse yourself in the heart of a lively life; stroll in the shade of its ramparts and explore the city's main market, where merchants display their wares under charming arcades.
<b>Day 6 - Thursday</b> AGADIR / MASSA EN 4X4*	Massa, located south of Agadir, opens onto an endless beach, like a desert bordering the ocean. Your 4x4 vehicle will take you through Berber villages and oases before reaching Tifnit beach. Continue following the sandy Atlantic coast and the dunes of Sidi Rbat to the Massa lagoon. A huge magical lagoon which has created an ideal habitat for birds. Discover the richness of the Massa reserve located near Agadir. In this Atlantic coastal region, there are a multitude of different habitats, ranging from argan trees to cultivated lands, from dry steppes to small traditional fishing villages, including dunes, cliffs and sandy beaches.
<b>Day 6 - Thursday</b> AGADIR / TAROUDANT*	The city of Taroudant is located in the interior of the country of Morocco, 80 km from Agadir, and is well worth the trip! Many Moroccans think of Taroudant as the "little sister of Marrakech" because of its 8-kilometre-long ramparts. The city of Taroudant is close to the Sous River and has a rich historical past. The ramparts were built in the 18th century. Today, they enclose many gardens, palm trees, orange and olive trees as well as a casbah. Unmissable!
<b>Day 7 - Friday</b> ARRECFE / CESAR MANRIQUE : HÉRITAGE ARCHITECTURAL DE LANZAROTE*	Come and discover the architectural heritage of César Manrique, the brilliant architect who decided to turn his native island into one of the most beautiful places in the world. His different architectural projects all have the main characteristic of the inclusion of rocks, stones and lava flows, resulting in living spaces in harmony with the island's mineral environment. You will also be able to explore the amazing "jameos del Agua" with its tunnels and panoramic terraces, as well as his foundation constructed on a lava flow where the architect's house was built.
<b>Day 7 - Friday</b> ARRECFE / THE FIRE MOUNTAIN (1/2 day - morning)*	The aptly named Fire Mountains still smoulder, sometimes at the surface. The volcanic formations have created incredible lunar landscapes, such as the Lagon at El Golfo. After crossing the Timanfaya National Park, you will see breathtakingly perfect lines of vines and fig trees.
<b>Day 8 - Saturday</b> LAS PALMAS : GRAN CANARIES LANDSCAPES (1/2 day)*	Your tour to the interior of Gran Canaria will take you first to visit the village of Agüimes; an old domain with pastel colours and pedestrian streets dotted with sculptures. You will then go to the natural park of Guayadeque. This 15-km stretch of winding ravine is fascinating with its wild landscape and verdant slopes covered with native vegetation. You will encounter the many natural caves, formerly used by the islanders as dwelling or burial places. This tour will end with an opportunity to taste the local cheese and wine.

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## Formalities

### CUSTOMS FORMALITIES

For all UK citizens, a valid passport is essential when you travel abroad. A full 10-year passport is required for holidays to all countries featured on our website. The passport must be valid for at least 6 months beyond your return date with one blank visa page. Make sure your passport is valid and check with the embassy or the consulate of your destination country if you need a visa for your chosen destination prior to travel. It is vital that the name given when booking your holiday (printed on the ticket and itinerary) is exactly the same as written on your passport. Any child, however old, must have his/her own passport. Please note Club Med cannot be held responsible for any issue with regards to passport or visas.

### HEALTH FORMALITIES

Safe Together.

Club Med has implemented new hygiene and safety measures to offer you peace of mind and a most joyful experience.

As part of the fight against Covid-19, health measures at the borders are being reinforced and may in particular require a virological screening test (for example PCR test) depending on your country of origin, transit or destination before your departure and/or before your return.

We suggest you obtain more information from the consular services of the countries concerned or on the website of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of your nationality and/or place of residence.

Recommended vaccinations: diphtheria, polio, tetanus, hepatitis A and B and typhoid.

Pregnant women who do not need constant medical supervision may come aboard, upon presentation of a medical certificate showing their due date and certifying that their pregnancy is compatible with the cruise.

The final day of the cruise must be before the end of the 26th week of pregnancy.

A doctor and a nurse are present on board.
