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Itinerary of your cruise

Day 1 - Saturday LAS PALMAS	The historic centre with its cobbled streets, the many lively neighbourhoods and the long beach of fine sand make the biggest city in the Canary Islands an unmissable stopover. Ship docked, no water sports. Boarding and disembarkation port of call.		
Day 2 - Sunday TENERIFE	The archipelago's largest island, dominated by Teide, a dormant volcano and Spain's highest peak, offers the perfect blend of tranquillity and outdoor adventure. On your return from a walk through these volcanic lands, you can enjoy the mild local climate while tasting fresh fish and local fruit in the port of Santa Cruz. Boats alongside the quay, no water sports.		
Day 3 - Monday FUERTEVENTURA	Considered the most African of the Canary Islands due to its proximity to the mainland, it is best known for its white sandy beaches bathed in turquoise water, its volcanic landscapes and its vast stretches of desert. Boats alongside, no water sports.		
Day 4 - Tuesday LANZAROTE	Lanzarote's capital takes its name from the word for reef. The volcanic island is full of surprises, with green crops springing up from the black, cindery ground. Ship docked, no water sports.		
Day 5 - Wednesday LA GOMERA	Preserved from mass tourism, this small island that was once used as a stopover by explorers on their way to the New World is captivating thank its lush vegetation and relief. Its legendary primary forest, landscapes, ravines and black sand beaches make it a unique island. Boats alongside th quay, no water sports.		
Day 6 - Thursday EL HIERO	A veritable paradise in the middle of the Atlantic, the beauty of the smallest of the seven Canary Islands lies in the richness of its abundant, green relatively unspoilt natural environment. Ship docked, no water sports.		
Day 7 - Friday LA PALMA	With a volcanic landscape as its backdrop, the island, with its rocky landscapes covered in forests of prehistoric vegetation, is a veritable little of paradise. Its capital, Santa Cruz de la Palma, which has been declared a Site of Cultural Interest in its entirety, boasts narrow cobbled streets houses with wooden balconies. Ship docked, no water sports.

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Excursions of your cruise

Day 2 - Sunday TENERIFE / LANDSAPES AND HERITAGE OF TENERIFE*	This historic tour of the island will take you to La Orotava, one of the oldest towns in the Canary Islands - founded in the early 16th century after the Spanish conquest - which retains a rich architectural heritage. You will then head for lood de los Vinos in north-eastern Tenerife, where you can see the Ancient Dragon Tree (Dracaena draco), which was declared a national monument in 1917 and is thought to be over 800 years old. Lastly, you will visit the village of Garachico on Tennerife's northern coast. As a port on an island at the crossroads of Europe and the New World, three hundred years ago, it was such a wealthy place that one of its streets was paved with marble. You can explore its ancient convents, monasteries and other historical colonial buildings. The tour of the island will come to a pleasant end with a glass of wine and some local cheese.
Day 4 - Tuesday ARRECIFE /CESAR MANRIQUE : HÉRITAGE ARCHITECTURAL DE LANZAROTE*	Come and discover the architectural heritage of César Manrique, the brilliant architect who decided to turn his native island into one of the most beautiful places in the world. His different architectural projects all have the main characteristic of the inclusion of rocks, stones and lava flows, resulting in living spaces in harmony with the island's mineral environment. You will also be able to explore the amazing "jameos del Aqua" with its tunnels and panoramic terraces, as well as his foundation constructed on a lava flow where the architect's house was built.
Day 4 - Tuesday ARRECIFE / THE FIRE MOUNTAIN (1/2 day - morning)*	The aptly named Fire Mountains still smoulder, sometimes at the surface. The volcanic formations have created incredible lunar landscapes, such as the Lagon at El Golfo. After crossing the Timanfaya National Park, you will see breathtakingly perfect lines of vines and fig trees.
Day 8 - Saturday LAS PALMAS : GRAN CANARIES LANDSCAPES (1/2 day)*	Your tour to the interior of Gran Canaria will take you first to visit the village of Agüimes; an old domain with pastel colours and pedestrian streets dotted with sculptures. You will then go to the natural park of Guayadeque. This 15-km stretch of winding ravine is fascinating with its wild landscape and verdant slopes covered with native vegetation. You will encounter the many natural caves, formerly used by the islanders as dwelling or burial places. This tour will end with an opportunity to taste the local cheese and wine.

HEALTH FORMALITIES

Recommended vaccinations: diphtheria, polio, tetanus, hepatitis A and B and typhoid. Pregnant women who do not need constant medical supervision may come aboard, upon presentation of a medical certificate showing their due date and certifying that their pregnancy is compatible with the cruise. The final day of the cruise must be before the end of the 26th week of pregnancy. A doctor and a nurse are present on board.
