



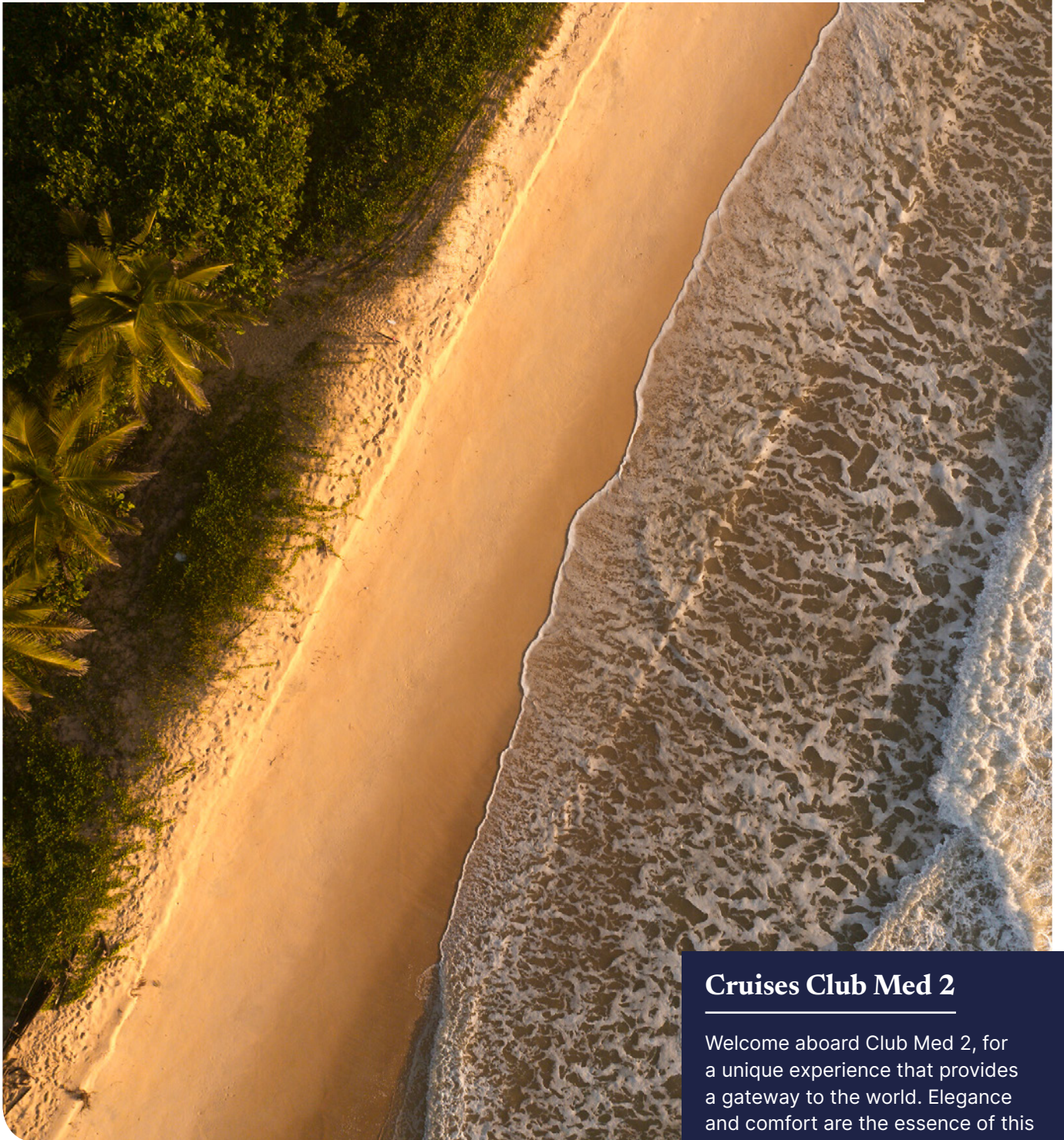

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Itinerary of your cruise

Day 1 - Wednesday CAYENNE	Around the palmists place, a favourite place for strolling, the remains of the island's colonial past are what makes Cayenne (capital of French Guiana) so charming. The market is bursting with colourful produce, reflecting the colours of the Creole houses. Boat docked in the industrial port area, 14 km from the centre of Cayenne, no water sports. Boarding and disembarkation port of call.
Day 2 - Thursday SALVATION'S ISLANDS	Nature is reasserting itself and covering the traces of the archipelago's notorious past as a brutal penal colony, with lush tropical vegetation. Now timeless and redeemed, the three little islands studded with coconut palms have a more heavenly feel. Boat at anchor, dive locker closed, no direct access to the beach.
Day 3 - Friday PARAMARIBO	Suriname, and its capital Paramaribo, is a champion of biodiversity, set in tropical rainforest. The magnificent architecture of the old town centre of this former Dutch town, with its wooden buildings and houses dating from the colonial era of the 17th and 18th centuries, is a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Boat at dock, nautical hall closed.
Day 4 - Saturday SAILING ON THE OPEN SEA	A restorative day at sea. Choose from the range of inviting possibilities on our remarkable sailing ship. Lounge on chaise longues, cool off in one of our two swimming pools, work out with a sea view in our Espace Fitness, find instant calm at the spa and enjoy the attentive company of our G.O® team and crew members.
Day 5 - Sunday TOBAGO	Along with Trinidad, the island forms part of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago. The port city of Scarborough in Rockly Bay is the island's capital. It is overlooked by the small Fort King George and was founded by the Dutch in 1667. Boat docked, dive locker closed, no direct access to the beach.
Day 6 - Monday GRENADE	This small island territory is home to fragrant nutmeg, cinnamon and vanilla. A succession of colonial influences has left a fascinating heritage of architectural curiosities. Ship at anchor, no water sports, no direct access to a beach.
Day 7 - Tuesday MAYREAU	The smallest of the Grenadine Islands has just one little village, surrounded by idyllic beaches with the finest sand, crystal clear waters and multicoloured tropical fish. Ship at anchor, water sports available (no water skiing), beach. Private beach for the Caribbean Beach Club.
Day 8 - Wednesday BEQUIA	The largest of the Grenadine islands boasts a surface area of 18 sq kms, and a major role in the history of whaling. Its winding roads reveal stunning views of the surrounding islands and tropical forest. Ship at anchor, water sports available (no water skiing), beach.
Day 9 - Thursday BARBADOS	The Atlantic Ocean and the Caribbean Sea make for a fascinating contrast on this small coral island: Its wild, green northern face contrasts with the azure blue waters of the south and their specific fauna and flora. Ship docked, no water sports and no direct access to a beach.
Day 10 - Friday FORT-DE-FRANCE	The largest of the French West Indian towns blends cosmopolitan style and local colour, with its urban lifestyle, colourful markets, metal architecture and charming old houses. Stopover for boarding and disembarking. Ship docked in port.



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Excursions of your cruise

Day 2 - Thursday
ILES DU SALUT /
PAPILLON ISLAND:
A JOURNEY TO THE
HEART OF HISTORY
AND NATURE (2 hours)*

During his visit in 1932, Albert Londres famously remarked, "Here, they've put hell in paradise." While hell is now but a memory, the remnants of the past still stand as a testament to the island's unique history. Today, nature has reclaimed its space, transforming what was once a place of suffering into a true haven of peace. This enchanting site now offers a visual feast and a perfect spot for relaxation. Accompanied by your guide, delve into the history of the penal colony as you explore its well-preserved ruins. Along the way, you'll also encounter a rich array of local wildlife, with each corner of the island offering surprises. A unique experience blending historical discovery and immersion in unspoiled nature.

Day 3 - Friday
SURINAME /
PARAMARIBO CITY*

Discover Paramaribo, known as "The Wooden City," a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Explore its remarkable cultural diversity through a Hindu temple, synagogue, basilica, mosque, and colonial architecture. Stroll through the beautiful Palm Garden and enjoy the relaxing views along the Waterfront. Visit Independence Square and uncover the historic remains of the old fort. A fascinating cultural immersion revealing the richness of Suriname's heritage. Shoulders and knees must be covered.

Day 5 - Sunday
SCARBOROUGH / THE
ARGYLE WATERFALLS
(1/2 day)*

Take the picturesque route to Roxborough and enter the oldest forest reserve in the western hemisphere. Your naturalist guide will lead you to the Argyle Falls where you will be able to dive into the natural pools before taking the same route back to the CM2.

Day 5 - Sunday
SCARBOROUGH /
BOTANICAL
RAINFOREST WALK
(1/2 day)*

You will cross the island and reach the virgin forest of Tobago - protected by law since 1776. During this easy hike your naturalist guide will take you through lush greenery highlighting interesting plants and trees, used for food or medicine. There you will also observe bird and insect life as diverse and fragile as the unique ecosystem in which they exist. Closed sports shoes compulsory, guide in English translated by a GO. this tour requires persons who can walk through rugged terrain for over 2 hours. Regarding wildlife sighting may not be guaranteed. Boots are available at extra cost of US \$ 4.00

Day 5 - Sunday
CHARLOTTEVILLE /
THE EMERALD COAST &
ANGEL REEF BY GLASS-
BOTTOM BOAT*

Discover the wild northeast of Tobago on an unforgettable excursion. Enjoy a scenic drive to Speyside before boarding a glass-bottom boat and cruising along the stunning Emerald Coast. Head to the famous Angel Reef, known for its crystal-clear waters and exceptional visibility. Admire ancient coral formations, giant sponges and vibrant marine life beneath the surface. Relax on board or take a refreshing swim, with cold drinks served during the cruise. A perfect blend of nature, sea and spectacular scenery before returning to your sailing yacht.

Day 6 - Monday
GRENADA / ISLAND
TOUR (day)*

The Spice Isle will captivate you with its lush landscapes and enchanting aromas. Discover the famous Diamond Chocolate Factory in Victoria, where Jouvay chocolate—ranked among the best in the world—is produced. Several stops along the way allow you to explore the island's authentic and thriving nature. The experience concludes with a delicious local lunch at Belmont Estate, an 18th-century cocoa plantation.

Day 6 - Monday
GRENADA / FORT AND
BEACHE BY LOCAL BUS
(1/2 day)*

You'll discover St Georges - the charming capital, known as the Little San Francisco of the West Indies - in a vintage truck. You'll stop at the Frederick Fort that look out over the town, and after a detour in the nearby hills, where you'll have a great view of the interior of the island, you'll have the chance to swim from one of Grenada's most beautiful beaches. Scenic island tour by open-roof, non-air-conditioned Creole bus with a local French-speaking guide, including a visit to Fort Frederick located on a hillside, followed by 1 hour of swimming with sunbed and drinks included: mineral water, juices, sodas, rum punch, and beer.

Day 6 - Monday
GRENADA / LA CAPIE
(1/2 day)*

You will begin this beautiful forest hike from Grand Étang, crossing a plantation where you can observe cocoa, nutmeg, and banana trees. You will then continue to the Bamboo Waterfall, perfect for a refreshing swim. Please note: the hike includes a river crossing, so be sure to wear appropriate footwear.

Day 6 - Monday
GRENADA /
WATERFALLS AND
CHOCOLATE (1/2 day)*

This aromatic island tour will allow you to get to know everything about the "Jouvay" organic chocolate production at the Diamond Chocolate Factory nestled in the village of Victoria on the west coast of Grenada. You'll find it in an 18th-century converted rum distillery, which was built by French monks. Nowadays, the factory's responsible for making 'Jouvay' - one of the world's top 10 chocolates, according to National Geographic. This chocolate's completely organic and you'll learn how it's made - from the harvest of the cocoa beans, to watching them dry on trays under the Caribbean sun. A visit to the garden of cocoa trees to see, cocoa, cloves, chili, nutmeg, flowers, fruits, followed by a delicious chocolate tasting, will conclude this pleasant visit to one of the most amazing sites in the Caribbean. On your way back, you make a detour to enjoy a swim (conditions permitting) in the natural lovely pool at the Concord Falls. Here the nutmeg and cocoa trees grow along the flanks of the hills in the tropical forest that is forever near. Please note: guests are advised to wear a swimsuit under a cover-up, bring sunscreen, a hat, sunglasses, and a towel. The order of the stops may vary. Long way by bus to discover the magnificence of the island.

Day 7 - Tuesday
MAYREAU /
CATAMARAN, THE
HEART OF THE
GRENADINES (1/2 day)*

his postcard morning accompanied by an atmosphere and a purely Caribbean cocktail on board will take you to the translucent anchorages around the island of Mayreau. The climate, always suitable for swimming, will encourage you to refresh yourself in the turquoise waters of the Grenadines unless you prefer to tread on the sparkling sand.

Day 8 - Wednesday
BEQUIA - CATAMARAN
(1/2 day)*

Discover an astonishing architectural surprise on your catamaran cruise. Sail along a stunning coastline where troglodyte homes emerge from the rocks amid a lush tropical setting: Moonhole, a unique collection of villas built during the hippie era. Two stops are included: one to explore the marine life (visibility depends on the whim of Mother Nature) and one to relax on a beautiful beach in Bequia. Enjoy a lively Creole atmosphere on board throughout this unforgettable experience

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Day 9 - Thursday BARBADOS / REMOTE BARBADOS IN A 4X4 (1/2 day)*	From sugar cane fields to tropical forest via the village of Bathsheba, you'll drive over dirt tracks through the most inaccessible parts of the island and see the finest views of the Atlantic coast. (bumpy road)
Day 9 - Thursday BARBADOS / SUBMARINE (1/2 day)*	A unique opportunity to admire the splendour of the tropical sea. Venture into this realm of silence, 50 metres down, on a high-tech submarine. Discover the coral reefs (sea fans, sponges) and fish (angel, butterfly, surgeon and boxfish, to name but a few). Visibility depending on weather.
Day 9 - Thursday BARBADOS / LITTLE ENGLAND (1/2 day)*	Don't miss this opportunity to discover the treasures of what we call "Little England" in the West Indies. First Farley Hill, a popular meeting place for Barbadians, then Bathsheba, a small fishing village beaten by the waves of the Atlantic and known to surfers from all over the world. Treat yourself to a refreshing drink at the new Hillcrest Community Center and finish with Codrington College. Long way by bus.
Day 9 - Thursday BARBADOS / HISTORIC PLANTATION & TRAIN (1/2 day)*	Embark on a magical train ride through the rolling hills of St. Nicholas Abbey. Discover the historic Jacobean mansion, its steam mill, and rum distillery. Enjoy breathtaking views after a scenic journey along Cherry Tree Avenue. On your way back, admire the wild beauty of the stunning East Coast.
Day 10 - Friday FORT DE FRANCE / HABITATION CLÉMENT (1/2 journée)*	Discover Habitation Clément, an exceptional rum distillery in many ways. It includes a colonial mansion that welcomed presidents Mitterrand and Bush after the Gulf War, botanical gardens, as well as a distillery that produces the most famous rums in the French Antilles. Your tour will end with a tasting of old rum. For reasons of airport security, all purchases of bottles of rum made at the plantation must be packed in a suitcase destined for the baggage hold before checking in for your flight.
Day 10 - Friday FORT DE FRANCE / CLUB MED BOUCANIERS (1journée)*	Relax in your Club Med Les Boucaniers village before heading to the airport for your return home. Established in this idyllic setting since 1969, the Village exudes the Creole spirit. Imagine succumbing to the charm of one of the most beautiful beaches in Martinique facing the Diamond Rock... strolling in the tropical garden or in the coconut grove... Water sports are reserved for hotel guests. Flight AF 8.45pm.
Day 10 - Friday MARTINIQUE - DÉCOUVERTE EN 4X4 (1/2 day)*	Explore the most beautiful scenery in the whole of "Flower Island". Your driver will take you on a stunning route, featuring rainforest, rivers and plantations. Your trip will end with a visit to a distillery.

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Formalities

HEALTH FORMALITIES

Recommended vaccinations: diphtheria, polio, tetanus, hepatitis A and B and typhoid. Some parasitic or viral diseases may be carried by mosquitoes during certain stopovers. Vaccination against yellow fever is essential, even if there is no administrative obligation to do so (at an approved center). Malaria risk: prophylactic treatment is recommended, and a doctor must be consulted for prescriptions. The use of skin and clothing repellents is recommended. Pregnant women, who do not require constant medical attention, may come on board on presentation of a medical certificate stating their due date and certifying that their pregnancy is compatible with the cruise. The cruise must end before the end of the 26th week of pregnancy. Nurse and doctor on board.
