

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# Itinerary of your cruise

Day 1 - Saturday FORT-DE-FRANCE	The largest of the French West Indian towns blends cosmopolitan style and local colour, with its urban lifestyle, colourful markets, metal architecture and charming old houses. Stopover for boarding and disembarking. Ship docked in port.		
Day 2 - Sunday THE SAINTS	One of the most beautiful bays in the world, studded with charming huts and red-roofed dolls' houses. This tiny archipelago is one of the world's exceptional beauty spots. At anchor. Water sports (except water skiing), no beach.		
Day 3 - Monday ANTIGUA	The jagged coast of this former British colony is studded with magnificent beaches. Its typical port, with lively pubs and inns, gives it reams of histocharm. Ship at anchor, water sports available, beach.		
Day 4 - Tuesday SAINT-KITTS	Its elegant Georgian style houses are a reminder of the island's British past. Known as "the fertile land", its underwater life is as fabulous as the wonderfully lush landscapes. Ship docked, no water sports, beach.		
Day 5 - Wednesday NEVIS	This tiny volcanic island, sister island to St Kitts, where the traditional sport of cricket remains a national game, is a fascinating world of hot water springs, archeological sites and forests inhabited by green monkies. AShip at anchor, water sports available, beach.		
Day 6 - Thursday SAINT-PIERRE	Known as the Little Paris of the French West Indies, the island was the capital of the aristocracy of the plantations until 1902, when at 7.50 on 8 M the volcano exploded and in 3 minutes St Pierre was buried under a carpet of lava. This is an emotional visit with a wealth of history. Ship at anch water sports available, beach.		
Day 7 - Friday ST LUCIA	This proud volcanic island is a pillar of ecology, with its two majestic rocky peaks swathed in green and its lovingly preserved surroundings. Ship at anchor, water sports available (no snorkelling), beach.		
Day 8 - Saturday MAYREAU	The smallest of the Grenadine Islands has just one little village, surrounded by idyllic beaches with the finest sand, crystal clear waters and multicoloured tropical fish. Ship at anchor, water sports available (no water skiing). Private beach for the Caribbean Beach Club.		
Day 9 - Sunday BARBADOS	The Atlantic Ocean and the Caribbean Sea make for a fascinating contrast on this small coral island: Its wild, green northern face contrasts with the azure blue waters of the south and their specific fauna and flora. Ship docked, no water sports and no direct access to a beach.		
Day 10 - Monday FORT-DE-FRANCE	The largest of the French West Indian towns blends cosmopolitan style and local colour, with its urban lifestyle, colourful markets, metal architecture and charming old houses. Stopover for boarding and disembarking. Ship docked in port.		





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#### Excursions of your cruise

Day 3 - Monday ANTIGUA / SWIM WITH THE RAYS*	Adrenalin guaranteed for a rendez-vous with pastenague rays. After a 30-minute bus ride and a ride in a speedboat, you'll get to Stingray City for a super, safe, sensory experience. Even non-swimmers can see these strange and gracious creatures twirling through the shallow water.		
Day 3 - Monday ANTIGUA - BALADE DÉCOUVERTE EN 4*4*	The discovery of the island off the beaten track is done in all-terrain vehicles. You will leave the English countryside in the tropics with its authentical charming hamlets and its remains of old refineries attesting to the intense sugar activity before crossing the luxuriant tropical forest. You will not miss the swimming break on the magnificent Caribbean coast.		
Day 4 - Tuesday SAINT KITTS / BEST OF ST KITTS*	Brimstone Hill fort rises some 250 metres above sea level. This "Gibralter of the West Indies" as it was called in the 17th century, is one of the best preserved forts in the Americas. You'll also see a batik demonstration by local craftsmen. English guide only.		
Day 5 - Wednesday NEVIS / ISLAND HIGHLIGHTS AND BOTANICAL GARDEN*	Visit this charming island - known as the Queen of the Caribees - its historic sites and its 8 acre Botanical Gardens. This highly popular tour includes a visit to Hamilton House, birthplace of Alexander Hamilton, one of the USA's founding fathers. Your tour will also take in the Botanical Gardens, where you can admire one of the biggest and most diverse botanical collections in any tropical region.		
Day 5 - Wednesday NEVIS / HIKING*	Enjoy a 2-hour hike to discover Nevis' lush greenery and natural heritage. You'll have the opportunity to walk through the Rainforest while appreciating the island's flora and fauna. The tour ends on Pinney beach, where a swim will round off this beautiful morning's hiking.		
Day 6 - Thursday ST PIERRE / MEMORIES OF TIMES GONE BY*	Walking tour of the town: discover its intriguing past and present. Then head to the Habitation Ceron, dating from the 18th century, for a guided tour of the land and the ruins of the former sugar and cassava refinery. Discover the magical outdoors, where you can see Albizia Saman, the rain tree, which won the tree of the year award in 2016.		
Day 7 - Friday ST LUCIA / ISLAND TOUR (1/2 day - afternoon)*	You'll discover the island's colonial past when we stop at St Mark's House in Castries. You'll have some amazing views of the island's lush vegetation we drive along the Caribbean coast.  We'll visit a former plantation, Morne Coubaril Estate, a gift from Louis XIV to the Deveaux family. To the present day the family's descendants produs sugar cane, copra, coconuts and manioc. And you'll discover La Soufrière with its fascinating geological activity, before getting back onto the boat Soufrière Bay.		
Day 8 - Saturday MAYREAU/ CATAMARAN, THE HEART OF THE GRENADINES (1/2 day)*	his postcard morning accompanied by an atmosphere and a purely Caribbean cocktail on board will take you to the translucent anchorages around the island of Mayreau. The climate, always suitable for swimming, will encourage you to refresh yourself in the turquoise waters of the Grenadines unless you prefer to tread on the sparkling sand.		
Day 9 - Sunday BARBADOS / REMOTE BARBADOS IN A 4X4 (1/2 day)*	From sugar cane fields to tropical forest via the village of Bathsheba, you'll drive over dirt tracks through the most inaccessible parts of the island as see the finest views of the Atlantic coast. (bumpy road)		
Day 9 - Sunday BARBADOS / SUBMARINE (1/2 day)*	A unique opportunity to admire the splendour of the tropical sea. Venture into this realm of silence, 50 metres down, on a high-tech submarine. Discover the coral reefs (sea fans, sponges) and fish (angel, butterfly, surgeon and boxfish, to name but a few). Visibility depending on weather.		
Day 10 - Monday FORT DE FRANCE / CLUB MED BOUCANIERS (1journée)*	Relax in your Club Med Les Boucaniers village before heading to the airport for your return home.  Established in this idyllic setting since 1969, the Village exudes the Creole spirit.  Imagine succumbing to the charm of one of the most beautiful beaches in Martinique facing the Diamond Rock strolling in the tropical garden of the coconut grove  Water sports are reserved for hotel guests.		
Day 10 - Monday FORT DE FRANCE / HABITATION CLÉMENT	Discover Habitation Clément, an exceptional rum distillery in many ways. It includes a colonial mansion that welcomed presidents Mitterrand and E after the Gulf War, botanical gardens, as well as a distillery that produces the most famous rums in the French Antilles. Your tour will end with a tas of old rum.


FORT DE FRANCE / HABITATION CLÉMENT (1/2 journée)\*

#### **HEALTH FORMALITIES**

Recommended vaccinations: diphtheria, polio, tetanus, hepatitis A and B and typhoid. Some parasitic or viral diseases can be carried by mosquitoes during certain stopovers. The use of skin and clothing repellents is therefore recommended. Pregnant women who do not need constant medical supervision may come aboard, upon presentation of a medical certificate showing their due date and certifying that their pregnancy is compatible with the cruise. The final day of the cruise must be before the end of the 26th week of pregnancy. A doctor and a nurse are present on board.
