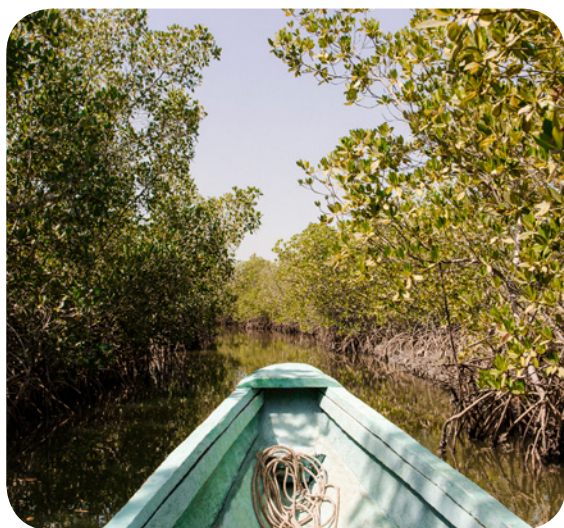

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Itinerary of your cruise

Day 1 - Monday FORT-DE-FRANCE	The largest of the French West Indian towns blends cosmopolitan style and local colour, with its urban lifestyle, colourful markets, metal architecture and charming old houses. Stopover for boarding and disembarking. Ship docked in port.
Day 2 - Tuesday ST LUCIA	This proud volcanic island is a pillar of ecology, with its two majestic rocky peaks swathed in green and its lovingly preserved surroundings. Ship at anchor, water sports available (no snorkelling), beach.
Day 3 - Wednesday LA BARBADE	The Atlantic Ocean and the Caribbean Sea make for a fascinating contrast on this small coral island: Its wild, green northern face contrasts with the azure blue waters of the south and their specific fauna and flora. Ship docked, no water sports and no direct access to a beach.
Day 4 - Thursday SAILING ON THE OPEN SEA	A restorative day at sea. Choose from the range of inviting possibilities on our remarkable sailing ship. Lounge on chaise longues, cool off in one of our two swimming pools, work out with a sea view in our Espace Fitness, find instant calm at the spa and enjoy the attentive company of our G.O® team and crew members.
Day 5 - Friday SALVATION'S ISLANDS	Nature is reasserting itself and covering the traces of the archipelago's notorious past as a brutal penal colony, with lush tropical vegetation. Now timeless and redeemed, the three little islands studded with coconut palms have a more heavenly feel. Boat at anchor, dive locker closed, no direct access to the beach.
Day 6 - Saturday CAYENNE	Around the palmists place, a favourite place for strolling, the remains of the island's colonial past are what makes Cayenne (capital of French Guiana) so charming. The market is bursting with colourful produce, reflecting the colours of the Creole houses. Boat docked in the industrial port area, 14 km from the centre of Cayenne, no water sports, no direct access to a beach.
Day 7 - Sunday CAYENNE	Around the palmists place, a favourite place for strolling, the remains of the island's colonial past are what makes Cayenne (capital of French Guiana) so charming. The market is bursting with colourful produce, reflecting the colours of the Creole houses. Boat docked in the industrial port area, 14 km from the centre of Cayenne, no water sports, no direct access to a beach.
Day 8 - Monday SAILING ON THE OPEN SEA	A restorative day at sea and choose from the range of inviting possibilities on our remarkable sailing ship.
Day 9 - Tuesday TOBAGO	Along with Trinidad, the island forms part of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago. The port city of Scarborough in Rockly Bay is the island's capital. It is overlooked by the small Fort King George and was founded by the Dutch in 1667. Boat docked, dive locker closed, no direct access to the beach.
Day 10 - Wednesday GRENADINE	This small island territory is home to fragrant nutmeg, cinnamon and vanilla. A succession of colonial influences has left a fascinating heritage of architectural curiosities. Ship at anchor, no water sports, no direct access to a beach.
Day 11 - Thursday BEQUIA	The largest of the Grenadine islands boasts a surface area of 18 sq kms, and a major role in the history of whaling. Its winding roads reveal stunning views of the surrounding islands and tropical forest. Ship at anchor, water sports available (no water skiing), beach.
Day 12 - Friday MAYREAU	The smallest of the Grenadine Islands has just one little village, surrounded by idyllic beaches with the finest sand, crystal clear waters and multicoloured tropical fish. Ship at anchor, water sports available (no water skiing), beach. Private beach for the Caribbean Beach Club.
Day 13 - Saturday FORT-DE-FRANCE	The largest of the French West Indian towns blends cosmopolitan style and local colour, with its urban lifestyle, colourful markets, metal architecture and charming old houses. Stopover for boarding and disembarking. Ship docked in port.



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Excursions of your cruise

Day 2 - Tuesday ST LUCIA / ISLAND TOUR (1/2 day - afternoon)*	<p>You'll discover the island's colonial past when we stop at St Mark's House in Castries. You'll have some amazing views of the island's lush vegetation as we drive along the Caribbean coast.</p> <p>We'll visit a former plantation, Morne Coubaril Estate, a gift from Louis XIV to the Deveaux family. To the present day the family's descendants produce sugar cane, copra, coconuts and manioc. And you'll discover La Soufrière with its fascinating geological activity, before getting back onto the boat in Soufrière Bay.</p>
Day 3 - Wednesday BARBADOS / LITTLE ENGLAND (1/2 day)*	<p>Don't miss this opportunity to discover the treasures of what we call "Little England" in the West Indies. First Farley Hill, a popular meeting place for Barbadians, then Bathsheba, a small fishing village beaten by the waves of the Atlantic and known to surfers from all over the world. Treat yourself to a refreshing drink at the new Hillcrest Community Center and finish with Codrington College. Long way by bus.</p>
Day 3 - Wednesday BARBADOS / REMOTE BARBADOS IN A 4X4 (1/2 day)*	<p>From sugar cane fields to tropical forest via the village of Bathsheba, you'll drive over dirt tracks through the most inaccessible parts of the island and see the finest views of the Atlantic coast. (bumpy road)</p>
Day 3 - Wednesday BARBADOS / SUBMARINE (1/2 day)*	<p>A unique opportunity to admire the splendour of the tropical sea. Venture into this realm of silence, 50 metres down, on a high-tech submarine. Discover the coral reefs (sea fans, sponges) and fish (angel, butterfly, surgeon and boxfish, to name but a few). Visibility depending on weather.</p>
Day 5 - Friday ILES DU SALUT / PAPILLON ISLAND: A JOURNEY TO THE HEART OF HISTORY AND NATURE (2 hours)*	<p>During his visit in 1932, Albert Londres famously remarked, "Here, they've put hell in paradise." While hell is now but a memory, the remnants of the past still stand as a testament to the island's unique history. Today, nature has reclaimed its space, transforming what was once a place of suffering into a true haven of peace. This enchanting site now offers a visual feast and a perfect spot for relaxation.</p> <p>Accompanied by your guide, delve into the history of the penal colony as you explore its well-preserved ruins. Along the way, you'll also encounter a rich array of local wildlife, with each corner of the island offering surprises. A unique experience blending historical discovery and immersion in unspoiled nature.</p>
Day 6 - Saturday CAYENNE / CAYENNE & KOUROU SPACE CENTER (1day)*	<p>Board the bus as soon as you arrive at the port of Dégrad des Cannes for a day of discovery! Enjoy a colorful city tour in Cayenne and its market, then head to Kourou. After the local lunch followed by a visit to the Guiana Space Center. The route you will follow will take you on a 3-hour journey through the disproportionate installations and infrastructure of the space center. Thus, you will discover the launch sites and the different locations of the space center. Prior registration required to obtain passes 72h before, please give your date of birth and country of birth for registration. This excursion involves 2 hours of round-trip driving by bus. The CSG reserves the right to cancel the visit for security reasons at any time.</p>
Day 6 - Saturday CAYENNE / MUSEUM & MARKET*	<p>The Cayenne market is a real melting pot cultural in Guyana, where different ethnic groups meet. Departure at 8:30 a.m. from Dégrad des Cannes by bus, stop at Franconia Museum for a guided tour, then exploration of the market. Free cane juice tasting, followed by a local soup and fresh juice premises in an air-conditioned restaurant opposite the market.</p> <p>Return to the port of Dégrad des Cannes at 12 p.m. by bus afterwards this enriching experience. French Guide.</p>
Day 6 - Saturday CAYENNE / GABRIEL'S COVE IN PYROGUE*	<p>Take a pirogue up the Mahury River to Gabriel Creek, an area of dense vegetation (orchids, bromeliads, palms) that sometimes forms a veritable tunnel in the heart of the Amazon. This is an opportunity to discover more about the river used by the Amerindians, and the creek once used by slaves. In this historic immersion in the Amazonian environment, you may be surprised by the legendary Morphos butterflies with their phosphorescent blue wings, as well as other specimens of the local fauna.</p>
Day 6 - Saturday CAYENNE / IMMERSION IN THE WORLD OF THE TOULOULOU*	<p>Immerse yourself in the authentic world of Guyanese Carnival and discover the mysteries of the Touloulous, mysterious characters in spectacular costumes. This immersion will help you understand the traditions, dances and symbols that make this carnival unique in the world. Accompanied by enthusiastic guides, you'll go behind the scenes of the masked ball! this colorful festival full of mystery. An unforgettable, immersive experience at the heart of Guyanese culture.</p>
Day 7 - Sunday CAYENNE / DISCOVERING THE VILLAGE OF CACAO : NATURE AND TRADITIONS*	<p>Embark on a captivating guided tour of the picturesque village of Cacao. Visit the local church, then immerse yourself in the authentic atmosphere of the artisan market, the pottery house, and the traditional local market. Enjoy a tasting of Mhong specialties for a complete immersion in the local culture and flavors. A unique experience, at the heart of French Guiana.</p>
Day 7 - Sunday CAYENNE / GABRIEL'S COVE IN PYROGUE*	<p>Take a pirogue up the Mahury River to Gabriel Creek, an area of dense vegetation (orchids, bromeliads, palms) that sometimes forms a veritable tunnel in the heart of the Amazon. This is an opportunity to discover more about the river used by the Amerindians, and the creek once used by slaves. In this historic immersion in the Amazonian environment, you may be surprised by the legendary Morphos butterflies with their phosphorescent blue wings, as well as other specimens of the local fauna.</p>
Day 9 - Tuesday SCARBOROUGH / BOTANICAL RAINFOREST WALK (1/2 day)*	<p>You will cross the island and reach the virgin forest of Tobago - protected by law since 1776. During this easy hike your naturalist guide will take you through lush greenery highlighting interesting plants and trees, used for food or medicine. There you will also observe bird and insect life as diverse and fragile as the unique ecosystem in which they exist. Closed sports shoes compulsory, guide in English translated by a GO.</p>
Day 10 - Wednesday GRENADA / LA CAPIJE (1/2 day)*	<p>You'll start this magnificent forest trekking at "Grand Etang". It'll take you through a plantation where you'll see cocoa, nutmeg and bananas, and then on to the bamboo waterfalls where you can enjoy a refreshing swim. Crossing the river : so wet sneakers</p>

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Day 10 - Wednesday GRENADA / WATERFALLS AND CHOCOLATE (1/2 day)*	This aromatic island tour will allow you to get to know everything about the "Jouvay" organic chocolate production at the Diamond Chocolate Factory nestled in the village of Victoria on the west coast of Grenada. You'll find it in an 18th-century converted rum distillery, which was built by French monks. Nowadays, the factory's responsible for making Jouvay' – one of the world's top 10 chocolates, according to National Geographic. This chocolate's completely organic and you'll learn how it's made – from the harvest of the cocoa beans, to watching them dry on trays under the Caribbean sun. A visit to the garden of cocoa trees to see, cocoa, cloves, chili, nutmeg, flowers, fruits, followed by a delicious chocolate tasting, will conclude this pleasant visit to one of the most amazing sites in the Caribbean. On your way back, you make a detour to enjoy a swim (conditions permitting) in the natural lovely pool at the Concord Falls. Here the nutmeg and cocoa trees grow along the flanks of the hills in the tropical forest that is forever near. Please note: guests are advised to wear a swimsuit under a cover-up, bring sunscreen, a hat, sunglasses, and a towel. The order of the stops may vary. Guests must be at least 5 years old to participate. Long way by bus to discover the magnificence of the island.
Day 10 - Wednesday GRENADA / FORT AND BEACHE BY LOCAL BUS (1/2 day)*	You'll discover St Georges - the charming capital, known as the Little San Francisco of the West Indies - in a vintage truck. You'll stop at the Frederick Fort that look out over the town, and after a detour in the nearby hills, where you'll have a great view of the interior of the island, you'll have the chance to swim from one of Grenada's most beautiful beaches.
Day 10 - Wednesday GRENADA / ISLAND TOUR (day)*	The Spice Island is as rich in aromas as in landscapes. You will visit the famous Diamond Chocolate factory in Victoria, which produces Jouvay chocolate, ranked among the best chocolates in the world. In addition, Different stops will allow you to discover the luxuriant nature of this authentic island Finally, you will enjoy a local lunch at the Belmont Estate in an 18th century cocoa plantation.
Day 11 - Thursday BEQUIA - CATAMARAN (1/2 day)*	You won't believe your eyes when you see the architectural curiosities of the Ile à Quatre. As you come alongside the coast, troglodyte-style buildings seem to spring forth from the rocks and tropical vegetation. This rock creation is called Moonhole, and is made up of a collection of homes created during the hippy era. The beautiful natural beach and the dives down to the corals beneath are simply heavenly.
Day 12 - Friday MAYREAU / CATAMARAN, THE HEART OF THE GRENADINES (1/2 day)*	his postcard morning accompanied by an atmosphere and a purely Caribbean cocktail on board will take you to the translucent anchorages around the island of Mayreau. The climate, always suitable for swimming, will encourage you to refresh yourself in the turquoise waters of the Grenadines unless you prefer to tread on the sparkling sand.
Day 13 - Saturday FORT DE FRANCE / CLUB MED BOUCANIERS (1journée)*	Relax in your Club Med Les Boucaniers village before heading to the airport for your return home. Established in this idyllic setting since 1969, the Village exudes the Creole spirit. Imagine succumbing to the charm of one of the most beautiful beaches in Martinique facing the Diamond Rock... strolling in the tropical garden or in the coconut grove... Water sports are reserved for hotel guests.
Day 13 - Saturday FORT DE FRANCE / HABITATION CLÉMENT (1/2 journée)*	Discover Habitation Clément, an exceptional rum distillery in many ways. It includes a colonial mansion that welcomed presidents Mitterrand and Bush after the Gulf War, botanical gardens, as well as a distillery that produces the most famous rums in the French Antilles. Your tour will end with a tasting of old rum. For reasons of airport security, all purchases of bottles of rum made at the plantation must be packed in a suitcase destined for the baggage hold before checking in for your flight.

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Formalities

HEALTH FORMALITIES

Recommended vaccinations: diphtheria, polio, tetanus, hepatitis A and B and typhoid. Some parasitic or viral diseases may be carried by mosquitoes during certain stopovers. Vaccination against yellow fever is essential, even if there is no administrative obligation to do so (at an approved center). Malaria risk: prophylactic treatment is recommended, and a doctor must be consulted for prescriptions. The use of skin and clothing repellents is recommended. Pregnant women, who do not require constant medical attention, may come on board on presentation of a medical certificate stating their due date and certifying that their pregnancy is compatible with the cruise. The cruise must end before the end of the 26th week of pregnancy. Nurse and doctor on board.
