Day 1 - Thursday FORT-DE-FRANCE	The largest of the French West Indian towns blends cosmopolitan style and local colour, with its urban lifestyle, colourful markets, metal architecture and charming old houses. Stopover for boarding and disembarking. Ship docked in port.		
Day 2 - Friday ST LUCIA	This proud volcanic island is a pillar of ecology, with its two majestic rocky peaks swathed in green and its lovingly preserved surroundings. Ship at anchor, water sports available (no snorkelling), beach.		
Day 3 - Saturday LA BARBADE	The Atlantic Ocean and the Caribbean Sea make for a fascinating contrast on this small coral island: Its wild, green northern face contrasts with the azure blue waters of the south and their specific fauna and flora. Ship docked, no water sports and no direct access to a beach.		
Day 4 - Sunday SAILING ON THE OPEN SEA	A restorative day at sea. Choose from the range of inviting possibilities on our remarkable sailing ship. Lounge on chaise longues, cool off in one of our two swimming pools, work out with a sea view in our Espace Fitness, find instant calm at the spa and enjoy the attentive company of our G.0® team and crew members.

Day 14 - Wednesday TENERIFE	The archipelago's largest island, dominated by Teide, a dormant volcano and Spain's highest peak, offers the perfect blend of tranquillity and outdoor adventure. On your return from a walk through these volcanic lands, you can enjoy the mild local climate while tasting fresh fish and local fruit in the port of Santa Cruz. Boats alongside the quay, no water sports.		
Day 15 - Thursday LAS PALMAS	The historic centre with its cobbled streets, the many lively neighbourhoods and the long beach of fine sand make the biggest city in the Canary Islands an unmissable stopover. Ship docked, no water sports. Boarding and disembarkation port of call.		





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Excursions of your cruise

Day 2 - Friday ST LUCIA / ISLAND TOUR (1/2 day - afternoon)* You'll discover the island's colonial past when we stop at St Mark's House in Castries. You'll have some amazing views of the island's lush vegetation as we drive along the Caribbean coast.

We'll visit a former plantation, Morne Coubaril Estate, a gift from Louis XIV to the Deveaux family. To the present day the family's descendants produce sugar cane, copra, coconuts and manioc. And you'll discover La Soufrière with its fascinating geological activity, before getting back onto the boat in Soufrière Bay.

Day 3 - Saturday BARBADOS / LITTLE ENGLAND (1/2 day)* Don't miss this opportunity to discover the treasures of what we call "Little England" in the West Indies. First Farley Hill, a popular meeting place for Barbadians, then Bathsheba, a small fishing village beaten by the waves of the Atlantic and known to surfers from all over the world. Treat yourself to a refreshing drink at the new Hillcrest Community Center and finish with Codrington College. Long way by bus.

Day 3 - Saturday BARBADOS / REMOTE BARBADOS IN A 4X4 (1/2 day)*

From sugar cane fields to tropical forest via the village of Bathsheba, you'll drive over dirt tracks through the most inaccessible parts of the island and see the finest views of the Atlantic coast. (bumpy road)

Day 3 - Saturday BARBADOS / SUBMARINE (1/2 day)*

A unique opportunity to admire the splendour of the tropical sea. Venture into this realm of silence, 50 metres down, on a high-tech submarine. Discover the coral reefs (sea fans, sponges) and fish (angel, butterfly, surgeon and boxfish, to name but a few). Visibility depending on weather.

Day 14 - Wednesday TENERIFE / LANDSAPES AND HERITAGE OF TENERIFE* This historic tour of the island will take you to La Orotava, one of the oldest towns in the Canary Islands - founded in the early 16th century after the Spanish conquest - which retains a rich architectural heritage.

You will then head for Icod de los Vinos in north-eastern Tenerife, where you can see the Ancient Dragon Tree (Dracaena draco), which was declared a national monument in 1917 and is thought to be over 800 years old.

Lastly, you will visit the village of Garachico on Tennerife's northern coast. As a port on an island at the crossroads of Europe and the New World, three hundred years ago, it was such a wealthy place that one of its streets was paved with marble. You can explore its ancient convents, monasteries and other historical colonial buildings.

The tour of the island will come to a pleasant end with a glass of wine and some local cheese.

Day 15 - Thursday LAS PALMAS: GRAN CANARIES LANDSCAPES (1/2 day)* Your tour to the interior of Gran Canaria will take you first to visit the village of Agüimes; an old domain with pastel colours and pedestrian streets dotted with sculptures


You will then go to the natural park of Guayadeque. This 15-km stretch of winding ravine is fascinating with its wild landscape and verdant slopes covered with native vegetation. You will encounter the many natural caves, formerly used by the islanders as dwelling or burial places. This tour will end with an opportunity to taste the local cheese and wine.

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Formalities

HEALTH FORMALITIES

Recommended vaccinations: diphtheria, polio, tetanus, hepatitis A and B and typhoid. Some parasitic or viral diseases can be carried by mosquitoes during certain stopovers. The use of skin and clothing repellents is therefore recommended. Pregnant women who do not need constant medical supervision may come aboard, upon presentation of a medical certificate showing their due date and certifying that their pregnancy is compatible with the cruise. The final day of the cruise must be before the end of the 26th week of pregnancy. A doctor and a nurse are present on board.

Port de Fort-de-France / Martinique. Gare maritime Fort-de-France - Quai des Tourelles, transfert aéroport Le Lamentin / Port Fort-de-France : 10 km (environ 25 minutes)
