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## Itinerary of your cruise

<b>Day 1 - Saturday</b> <b>POINTE-À-PITRE</b>	Pointe-à-Pitre is Guadeloupe's main town and showcases all the sensory pleasures of Caribbean island life. The market stalls are laden with spices, flowers, fish, and fruits for an authentic flavour and music-filled Creole vibe. A buzzing stopover, combining local traditions with a tropical atmosphere. Boat is docked, no nautical activities are planned. Boarding and disembarkation port of call.
<b>Day 2 - Sunday</b> <b>THE SAINTS</b>	Small huts and doll's houses gracefully line a bay considered to be one of the most beautiful in the world. This tiny archipelago has an astonishingly varied natural heritage — an enchanting, rare and precious place. Anchored boat, water sports available (excluding water skiing).
<b>Day 3 - Monday</b> <b>ST LUCIA</b>	Saint Lucia is an unspoiled volcanic island that combines incredible nature and ecological commitment. Its two majestic, deep green peaks soar above carefully protected landscapes. Anchored boat, with access to the beach and water sports (excluding water-skiing). No free diving activities planned.
<b>Day 4 - Tuesday</b> <b>BARBADOS</b>	Barbados is a small coral reef island with varied landscapes, from the lush, unspoiled north to the peaceful, azure southern coast. An alluring island where the Atlantic and the Caribbean meet, it boasts an incredible biodiversity, an easy-going lifestyle, and contrasting vistas. A stopover that blends unspoiled nature and island charm. Boat is docked, no nautical activities are planned.
<b>Day 5 - Wednesday</b> <b>GRENADE</b>	The island of spices: an evocative name for a destination imbued with the bewitching scents of nutmeg, cinnamon, and vanilla. A fascinating place to explore as you follow in the historic footprints of various colonial powers that once inhabited this land. Boat at anchor, dive locker closed.
<b>Day 6 - Thursday</b> <b>TOBAGO CAYS</b>	At the heart of the Grenadines archipelago, Tobago Cays reveals a spectacular mosaic of blues, sculpted by the region's most beautiful coral reef. Shoals of colourful fish glide through its crystal-clear waters, offering a fascinating natural spectacle. Ship at anchor. Beach access, water sports available (except water skiing).
<b>Day 7 - Friday</b> <b>MAYREAU</b>	The smallest island in the Grenadines has maintained its charming sense of privacy and is home to a single village. It defines idyllic beaches: fine sand, crystal-clear waters, and reefs swarming with multicoloured fish. A real natural treasure, that is discreet and beautifully preserved. The beach will be privatised for an exclusive 'Caribbean Beach Club' day, perfect for a luxurious, relaxing break in a superb natural setting. Anchored boat, water sports at the beach (excluding water-skiing).
<b>Day 8 - Saturday</b> <b>FORT-DE-FRANCE</b>	Fort-de-France is the largest town in the French West Indies, famous for its cosmopolitan vibe and tropical lifestyle. With its colourful markets, quaint houses and metallic architecture, the town showcases a buzzing Creole lifestyle that is both urban and welcoming. A colourful stopover that blends tradition with the contemporary. Boat is docked, no nautical activities are planned. Boarding and disembarkation port of call.



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## Excursions of your cruise

<b>Day 2 - Sunday</b> <b>LES SAINTES EN</b> <b>CATAMARAN*</b>	Welcome to one of the most beautiful bays in the world! Les Saintes is an archipelago made up of 9 islets. You will board a sailing catamaran to sail along this magnificent bay. A swimming stop near Pain de Sucre will allow you to appreciate the warm, clear waters of this magnificent stopover.
<b>Day 2 - Sunday</b> <b>LES SAINTES /</b> <b>DISCOVER LES SAINTES</b> <b>BY SPEEDBOAT: A</b> <b>NATURAL AQUARIUM</b> <b>EXPERIENCE*</b>	Set off on an unforgettable 2.5-hour cruise aboard a speedboat and explore the crystal-clear waters of the Les Saintes archipelago. Led by a local captain, enjoy two exceptional swimming stops: Terre-de-Bas, where you can observe peaceful sea turtles, and the Pain de Sucre, a true natural aquarium with vibrant marine life. Marvel at colorful corals, tropical fish, and an incredible underwater world in a breathtaking setting. Masks, snorkels, and local snacks are provided on board. Relax, swim freely, and enjoy a unique moment at the heart of one of the most beautiful bays in the Caribbean. Swimming is free and unsupervised.
<b>Day 2 - Sunday</b> <b>LES SAINTES /</b> <b>TRADITIONAL LES</b> <b>SAINTES*</b>	Discover one of the Caribbean's hidden gems with an authentic immersion into the heart of Les Saintes. Upon arrival, a minibus will take you up to the famous Fort Napoleon, perched high above the bay and offering breathtaking views of one of the most beautiful harbors in the world. Accompanied by a passionate local guide, you'll explore this iconic historic site during a 1-hour visit. From captivating stories to cultural treasures and lush gardens home to iguanas, Fort Napoleon will reveal all its secrets. To top off your experience, enjoy a delightful Saintois aperitif featuring local flavors in an exceptional setting. A perfect excursion combining history, stunning landscapes, and the rich traditions of Les Saintes!
<b>Day 3 - Monday</b> <b>ST LUCIA / ISLAND</b> <b>TOUR (1/2 day</b> <b>- afternoon)*</b>	You'll discover the island's colonial past when we stop at St Mark's House in Castries. You'll have some amazing views of the island's lush vegetation as we drive along the Caribbean coast. We'll visit a former plantation, Morne Coubaril Estate, a gift from Louis XIV to the Deveaux family. To the present day the family's descendants produce sugar cane, copra, coconuts and manioc. And you'll discover La Soufrière with its fascinating geological activity, before getting back onto the boat in Soufrière Bay. Hilly road and long bus ride.
<b>Day 4 - Tuesday</b> <b>BARBADOS / REMOTE</b> <b>BARBADOS IN A 4X4</b> <b>(1/2 day)*</b>	From sugar cane fields to tropical forest via the village of Bathsheba, you'll drive over dirt tracks through the most inaccessible parts of the island and see the finest views of the Atlantic coast. (bumpy road)
<b>Day 4 - Tuesday</b> <b>BARBADOS /</b> <b>SUBMARINE (1/2 day)*</b>	A unique opportunity to admire the splendour of the tropical sea. Venture into this realm of silence, 50 metres down, on a high-tech submarine. Discover the coral reefs (sea fans, sponges) and fish (angel, butterfly, surgeon and boxfish, to name but a few). Visibility depending on weather.
<b>Day 4 - Tuesday</b> <b>BARBADOS / LITTLE</b> <b>ENGLAND (1/2 day)*</b>	Don't miss this opportunity to discover the treasures of what we call "Little England" in the West Indies. First Farley Hill, a popular meeting place for Barbadians, then Bathsheba, a small fishing village beaten by the waves of the Atlantic and known to surfers from all over the world. Treat yourself to a refreshing drink at the new Hillcrest Community Center and finish with Codrington College. Long way by bus.
<b>Day 4 - Tuesday</b> <b>BARBADOS / HISTORIC</b> <b>PLANTATION &amp; TRAIN</b> <b>(1/2 day)*</b>	Embark on a magical train ride through the rolling hills of St. Nicholas Abbey. Discover the historic Jacobean mansion, its steam mill, and rum distillery. Enjoy breathtaking views after a scenic journey along Cherry Tree Avenue. On your way back, admire the wild beauty of the stunning East Coast.
<b>Day 5 - Wednesday</b> <b>GRENADA / ISLAND</b> <b>TOUR (day)*</b>	The Spice Isle will captivate you with its lush landscapes and enchanting aromas. Discover the famous Diamond Chocolate Factory in Victoria, where Jouvay chocolate—ranked among the best in the world—is produced. Several stops along the way allow you to explore the island's authentic and thriving nature. The experience concludes with a delicious local lunch at Belmont Estate, an 18th-century cocoa plantation.
<b>Day 5 - Wednesday</b> <b>GRENADA / FORT AND</b> <b>BEACHE BY LOCAL BUS</b> <b>(1/2 day)*</b>	You'll discover St Georges - the charming capital, known as the Little San Francisco of the West Indies - in a vintage truck. You'll stop at the Frederick Fort that look out over the town, and after a detour in the nearby hills, where you'll have a great view of the interior of the island, you'll have the chance to swim from one of Grenada's most beautiful beaches. Scenic island tour by open-roof, non-air-conditioned Creole bus with a local French-speaking guide, including a visit to Fort Frederick located on a hillside, followed by 1 hour of swimming with sunbed and drinks included: mineral water, juices, sodas, rum punch, and beer.
<b>Day 5 - Wednesday</b> <b>GRENADA / LA CAPIJE</b> <b>(1/2 day)*</b>	You will begin this beautiful forest hike from Grand Étang, crossing a plantation where you can observe cocoa, nutmeg, and banana trees. You will then continue to the Bamboo Waterfall, perfect for a refreshing swim. Please note: the hike includes a river crossing, so be sure to wear appropriate footwear.
<b>Day 5 - Wednesday</b> <b>GRENADA /</b> <b>WATERFALLS AND</b> <b>CHOCOLATE (1/2 day)*</b>	This aromatic island tour will allow you to get to know everything about the "Jouvay" organic chocolate production at the Diamond Chocolate Factory nestled in the village of Victoria on the west coast of Grenada. You'll find it in an 18th-century converted rum distillery, which was built by French monks. Nowadays, the factory's responsible for making 'Jouvay' - one of the world's top 10 chocolates, according to National Geographic. This chocolate's completely organic and you'll learn how it's made - from the harvest of the cocoa beans, to watching them dry on trays under the Caribbean sun. A visit to the garden of cocoa trees to see, cocoa, cloves, chili, nutmeg, flowers, fruits, followed by a delicious chocolate tasting, will conclude this pleasant visit to one of the most amazing sites in the Caribbean. On your way back, you make a detour to enjoy a swim (conditions permitting) in the natural lovely pool at the Concord Falls. Here the nutmeg and cocoa trees grow along the flanks of the hills in the tropical forest that is forever near. Please note: guests are advised to wear a swimsuit under a cover-up, bring sunscreen, a hat, sunglasses, and a towel. The order of the stops may vary. Long way by bus to discover the magnificence of the island.

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<b>Day 6 - Thursday</b> TOBAGO CAYS / CATAMARAN MORPION ISLAND (1/2 day)*	Morpion - also known as Mopio - will make your paradise island dream come true! A tiny white sand island with a straw hut and palm tree leaf roof, the main function of this speck of paradise is to indicate the way to sailors. This highly photogenic spot has featured in magazines worldwide: today, it's all yours!
<b>Day 8 - Saturday</b> FORT DE FRANCE / CLUB MED BOUCANIERS (1journée)*	Relax in your Club Med Les Boucaniers village before heading to the airport for your return home. Established in this idyllic setting since 1969, the Village exudes the Creole spirit. Imagine succumbing to the charm of one of the most beautiful beaches in Martinique facing the Diamond Rock... strolling in the tropical garden or in the coconut grove... Water sports are reserved for hotel guests. Flight AF 8.45pm.
<b>Day 8 - Saturday</b> FORT DE FRANCE / HABITATION CLÉMENT (1/2 journée)*	Discover Habitation Clément, an exceptional rum distillery in many ways. It includes a colonial mansion that welcomed presidents Mitterrand and Bush after the Gulf War, botanical gardens, as well as a distillery that produces the most famous rums in the French Antilles. Your tour will end with a tasting of old rum. For reasons of airport security, all purchases of bottles of rum made at the plantation must be packed in a suitcase destined for the baggage hold before checking in for your flight.
<b>Day 8 - Saturday</b> MARTINIQUE - DÉCOUVERTE EN 4X4 (1/2 day)*	Explore the most beautiful scenery in the whole of "Flower Island". Your driver will take you on a stunning route, featuring rainforest, rivers and plantations. Your trip will end with a visit to a distillery.

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## Formalities

### HEALTH FORMALITIES

Recommended vaccinations: diphtheria, polio, tetanus, hepatitis A and B and typhoid. Some parasitic or viral diseases can be carried by mosquitoes during certain stopovers. The use of skin and clothing repellents is therefore recommended. Pregnant women who do not need constant medical supervision may come aboard, upon presentation of a medical certificate showing their due date and certifying that their pregnancy is compatible with the cruise. The final day of the cruise must be before the end of the 26th week of pregnancy. A doctor and a nurse are present on board.
