





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## Itinerary of your cruise

<b>Day 1 - Monday</b> LA ROMANA	Officially founded in 1897, this southern Dominican Republic port town owes its development to the installation of a large sugar cane mill built by Italian immigrants some twenty years later. It was first established in 1851 to facilitate maritime traffic, meaning the port has played a key role in the region's economic development. Boat is docked, no nautical activities are planned. Boarding and disembarkation port of call.
<b>Day 2 - Tuesday</b> SANTO DOMINGO	The capital of the Dominican Republic and the oldest city in the New World, founded at the end of the 15th century, with a historic centre home to incredible UNESCO-listed colonial architecture. The earliest Spanish buildings in the Americas bear witness to a rich historical past. With its cobbled streets, centuries-old buildings, and authentic atmosphere, the city offers a unique immersion in Caribbean history. Boat is docked, no nautical activities are planned.
<b>Day 3 - Wednesday</b> CABO ROJO	Located in the province of Pedernales, Cabo Rojo is an unspoiled stopover in south-west Dominica. Between pristine beaches, lagoons, mangroves, and spectacular mountains, this still largely undiscovered area offers an authentic experience in the heart of untouched nature. Boat is docked, no nautical activities are planned.
<b>Day 4 - Thursday</b> SAILING ON THE OPEN SEA	Let yourself be lulled by the soothing rhythm of the waves and savour every moment aboard our exceptional sailboat. Relax on the decks' sun loungers, enjoy a refreshing dip in one of our two pools, work up a sweat in the Fitness Centre or treat yourself to wellness break at the spa... Live life at your own pace. Our friendly and attentive GO team and crew will be on hand to make your day as fun as it is unforgettable.
<b>Day 5 - Friday</b> MONTEGO BAY	The enchanting and vibrant Montego Bay is a stopover that lives to a sunny rhythm, thanks to its colonial heritage and relaxed tropical vibe. Jamaica's second-largest town, it has an unspoiled historical charm, incredible beaches by a turquoise Caribbean Sea, and majestic plantation residences nestled in leafy surroundings. Boat is docked, no nautical activities are planned.
<b>Day 6 - Saturday</b> OCHO RIOS	Nestled between the turquoise sea and lush green hills, Ocho Rios's tropical surroundings are captivating. Jamaica's iconic seaside resort is in a lush natural setting, where the sunny climate caresses its waterfalls, botanical gardens, and idyllic beaches — the ultimate change of scenery. Boat is docked, no nautical activities are planned.
<b>Day 7 - Sunday</b> PORT ANTONIO	Port Antonio showcases a buzzing side to Jamaica, where life follows a reggae rhythm and the hospitality is sincere. From the fast waters of the Rio Grande to the deep blue lagoons, nature displays all its glory in a setting that could be straight out of a film. An exclusive stopover blending authenticity and tropical splendour. Boat is docked, no nautical activities are planned.
<b>Day 8 - Monday</b> SAILING ON THE OPEN SEA	Live the dream thanks to a wealth of onboard experiences on our incredible sailboat. Whether you choose some relaxing downtime or a buzzing activity, every moment is about pleasure and freedom.
<b>Day 9 - Tuesday</b> PUERTO PLATA	This town was founded by Christopher Columbus in 1493 at foot of Mount Isabel de Torres before being rebuilt in the 19th century in a Victorian and neoclassical style. Its UNESCO-listed historic centre, pastel-coloured houses and colonial atmosphere make it a charming stopover. Boat is docked, no nautical activities are planned.
<b>Day 10 - Wednesday</b> SAMANA BAY	Set in the heart of the Dominican Republic, the Samaná peninsula reveals a more secret and unspoiled side to the country. Far removed from the traditional tourist trail, this stretch of land bordered by the Caribbean Sea has an authentic charm. Deserted beaches with fine sand, lush vegetation and a vibrant local culture provide an exceptional natural setting. Boat at anchor, dive locker closed.
<b>Day 11 - Thursday</b> ÎLE CATALINA	Catalina Island is a UNESCO World Heritage Site, home to white sandy beaches and unspoiled coral reefs. Its turquoise waters are ideal for dives to admire the multicoloured marine life. The beach will be privatised for an exclusive 'Caribbean Beach Club' day, perfect for a luxurious, relaxing break in a superb natural setting. Anchored boat, water sports at the beach (excluding water skiing).

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### Excursions of your cruise

**Day 2 - Tuesday**  
SANTO DOMINGO /  
SANTO DOMINGO\*

Discover America's first capital aboard the Chuchu colonial train. Visit the MUSEO KAH KOW, where the hologram of Christopher Columbus will tell you how he introduced cocoa to the kings of Spain, and taste with your 5 senses the different cocoas produced by the finca Esmeralda, which produces some of the finest organic cocoa in the world. Their customers include LINDT and VALHRONA. Continue on to the MUSEO DEL RON DOMINICANO, the Rum and Sugar Cane Museum, an interesting source of information on part of Dominican history and the various tools used over the centuries to extract the cane juice needed to make our famous rum. The museum captivates all visitors who enter the various rooms, going back in time to discover this ancient history. And, of course, finish off with a rum tasting!

**Day 5 - Friday**  
MONTEGO BAY -  
GREENWOOD GREAT  
HOUSE AND BEACH  
(1/2 day, morning)\*

After travelling through the verdant surroundings of Ironshore and Roshall, we will visit Greenwood Great House. Dating from the 18th century, the house boasts authentic furniture, a stunning view and a pretty garden, and you can learn all about its history and the daily life of its former owners. Then it's time for a swim at the famous Doctor's Cave beach (entry & deckchair included). Be sure to bring your swimming things and a towel.

**Day 5 - Friday**  
MONTEGO BAY / ROSE  
HALL GREAT HOUSE  
(1/2 day, morning)\*

This trip takes in Rose Hall, an immense Georgian manor house at the top of a hill, with an unbeatable panoramic view of the Jamaican coastline. Built in the 1770s and restored in the 1960s, you will learn about the business of this enormous sugar cane plantation, as well as seeing the magnificent decor and period furniture. Free time in Montego Bay town centre if enough time.

**Day 6 - Saturday**  
OCHO RIOS / BOB  
MARLEY MAUSOLEUM\*

From Ocho Rios, your excursion begins with a scenic 1.5 to 2-hour drive to Nine Mile, nestled in the lush hills of the island. Within the first few kilometers, the landscape transforms: the beaches and coastal bustle give way to winding roads, verdant valleys, and charming villages where local life unfolds in vibrant colors and warmth. The journey itself becomes a discovery, punctuated by stunning viewpoints and glimpses of traditional Jamaican culture. Upon arrival in Nine Mile, you will step into the world of Bob Marley. Visit his mausoleum and birthplace, and explore his life story, music, and the enduring cultural legacy he left behind. This visit offers an emotional and inspiring experience, set against the tranquil backdrop of Jamaica's hills. The return drive to Ocho Rios takes place in the afternoon, offering once again breathtaking views of the countryside and a relaxing journey back to your ship.

**Day 7 - Sunday**  
PORT ANTONIO /  
CRUISING ON THE RIO  
GRANDE (1/2 day)\*

Come and discover the unspoilt green landscapes of Jamaica as you gently float down the Rio Grande, at the heart of a region that's recently been awarded Unesco World Heritage status. Relaxing comfortably on a two-person bamboo raft, 7 metres long, this mini-cruise is your chance to appreciate the extraordinary beauty of the river as it winds between the Blue Mountains. Listen to the birdsong and follow the meandering curves of the river through the verdant tropical vegetation... and why not enjoy a refreshing swim?

**Day 9 - Tuesday**  
PUERTO PLATA /  
CHOCOLAT EL CHOCAL\*

Come meet this community of courageous women who have set up their own artisanal chocolate workshop. They will explain to you the different stages of chocolate manufacturing and what products they offer. The reputation of their "chocolate bar" is well established. You will discover the sumptuous landscapes of the Cordillera Central, the highest mountain range in the Caribbean with its Pico Duarte reaching 3175m. A beautiful moment of sharing that will leave you with a sweet taste!

**Day 9 - Tuesday**  
PUERTO PLATA / CITY  
TOUR\*

Stop at Fort San Felipe, built in 1577 to protect the port from pirates, visit a cigar factory, an amber and larimar museum where you can carry information about these ancient stones. You will have the opportunity to see the street of umbrellas and the famous pink street in honor of Doña Blanca.

**Day 10 - Wednesday**  
SAMANA BAY / WHALES  
OBSERVATION SEAFARI\*

Head off in a boat exclusively chartered for Club Med to meet humpback whales. During the mating season, hundreds of humpback whales come to the warm waters of the bay to breed. You will witness the amazing spectacle of the males leaping out of the water and the young whale calves swimming beside their mothers. On the way back, you'll have time to swim and enjoy the fine sandy beach at Cavo Levantado if wanted.

**Day 12 - Friday**  
LA ROMANA / ONE  
DAY TO PUNTA CANA  
RESORT (1day)\*

Before your flight, enjoy a wonderful day at the Punta Cana Resort, relax on its magnificent coconut palm beach and enjoy the Dominican atmosphere. Day pass from 10.30am to 4pm. Return directly to the airport of Punta Cana.

**Day 12 - Friday**  
LA ROMANA / CAVE

Explore the amazing 240 square metres of the Cave of Wonders. In the midst of stalactites, columns and other rock formations, you will discover ancient drawings left behind by the first indigenous people of the Caribbean. On your way back, you will stop off at La Romana where you can do a spot of shopping at the village market.

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### Formalities

#### HEALTH FORMALITIES

Recommended vaccinations: diphtheria, polio, tetanus, hepatitis A and B and typhoid. Some parasitic or viral diseases can be carried by mosquitoes during certain stopovers. The use of skin and clothing repellents is therefore recommended. Pregnant women who do not need constant medical supervision may come aboard, upon presentation of a medical certificate showing their due date and certifying that their pregnancy is compatible with the cruise. The final day of the cruise must be before the end of the 26th week of pregnancy. A doctor and a nurse are present on board.
