



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## Itinerary of your cruise

<b>Day 1 - Sunday</b> LA ROMANA	Officially founded in 1897, this southern Dominican Republic port town owes its development to the installation of a large sugar cane mill built by Italian immigrants some twenty years later. It was first established in 1851 to facilitate maritime traffic, meaning the port has played a key role in the region's economic development. Boat is docked, no nautical activities are planned. Boarding and disembarkation port of call.
<b>Day 2 - Monday</b> SAMANA BAY	Set in the heart of the Dominican Republic, the Samaná peninsula reveals a more secret and unspoiled side to the country. Far removed from the traditional tourist trail, this stretch of land bordered by the Caribbean Sea has an authentic charm. Deserted beaches with fine sand, lush vegetation and a vibrant local culture provide an exceptional natural setting. Boat at anchor, dive locker closed.
<b>Day 3 - Tuesday</b> PUERTO PLATA	This town was founded by Christopher Columbus in 1493 at foot of Mount Isabel de Torres before being rebuilt in the 19th century in a Victorian and neoclassical style. Its UNESCO-listed historic centre, pastel-coloured houses and colonial atmosphere make it a charming stopover. Boat is docked, no nautical activities are planned.
<b>Day 4 - Wednesday</b> SAILING ON THE OPEN SEA	Live the dream thanks to a wealth of onboard experiences on our incredible sailboat. Whether you choose some relaxing downtime or a buzzing activity, every moment is about pleasure and freedom.
<b>Day 5 - Thursday</b> SAN SALVADOR	It was on this Bahamas island that Christopher Columbus set foot in 1492 and discovered 'The New World'. San Salvador still has fascinating traces of its early years: historic monuments, colonial remains, mysterious ruins and submerged shipwrecks bear witness to a rich and eventful past. Boat at anchor, dive locker closed.
<b>Day 6 - Friday</b> ELEUTHERA	Almost 180 kilometres long yet mostly less than 3 kilometres wide, Eleuthera reveals an extraordinary landscape. Crossed by a single winding road, the island invites you to peacefully explore fields of pineapples as far as the eye can see, pristine beaches with white and pink sands, and hidden away coves beside a turquoise sea. This captivating Bahamas island with its stunning preserved shoreline is authentic and discreetly charming. Boat at anchor, dive locker closed.
<b>Day 7 - Saturday</b> EXUMAS	An archipelago of 365 limestone islands and islets surrounded by sapphire-blue waters, the Exumas are about discreet luxury and unspoiled nature. Fringed by coral reefs and deserted beaches, each island is like a pearl on the ocean, inviting you to relax, explore the marine life and enjoy a moment when time seems to stand still. A private paradise for an exceptional stopover. Boat at anchor, dive locker closed.
<b>Day 8 - Sunday</b> LONG ISLAND	Long Island is a pure natural wonder, where striking contrasts create a spectacular backdrop. On the east coast, towering cliffs and coral reefs plunge into the Atlantic, offering spectacular views. To the west, beaches of white and pink sand lead down to calm turquoise waters, ideal for swimming and switching off from the world. Boat at anchor, dive locker closed.
<b>Day 9 - Monday</b> SAILING ON THE OPEN SEA	Live the dream thanks to a wealth of onboard experiences on our incredible sailboat. Whether you choose some relaxing downtime or a buzzing activity, every moment is about pleasure and freedom.
<b>Day 10 - Tuesday</b> CABO ROJO	Located in the province of Pedernales, Cabo Rojo is an unspoiled stopover in south-west Dominica. Between pristine beaches, lagoons, mangroves, and spectacular mountains, this still largely undiscovered area offers an authentic experience in the heart of untouched nature. Boat is docked, no nautical activities are planned.
<b>Day 11 - Wednesday</b> SAILING ON THE OPEN SEA	Live the dream thanks to a wealth of onboard experiences on our incredible sailboat. Whether you choose some relaxing downtime or a buzzing activity, every moment is about pleasure and freedom.
<b>Day 12 - Thursday</b> CABO DE LA VELA	In the heart of La Guajira, Cabo de la Vela's desert landscape and sea provide a striking contrast. This traditional Wayuu coastal village is home to unspoiled beaches, ochre cliffs and spectacular sunsets. A preserved destination, ideal for discovering a new culture while enjoying a complete change of scenery. Boat at anchor, dive locker closed.
<b>Day 13 - Friday</b> SANTA MARTA	A charming Caribbean coastal town, Santa Marta is one of Colombia's oldest cities and the country's first Spanish colony. With its tropical beaches, colonial heritage and access to the Sierra Nevada, it offers a perfect balance of history, nature and relaxation. Boat is docked, no nautical activities are planned.
<b>Day 14 - Saturday</b> SAN BLAS	An archipelago made up of countless tiny islands, reminiscent of Robinson Crusoe's dreams. Only a small portion, about ten percent, is inhabited by the Kuna people, who fiercely protect their environment and ancestral way of life. Boat at anchor, dive locker closed.
<b>Day 15 - Sunday</b> COLÓN	75 km from Panama City, Colón is the Atlantic entrance to the Panama Canal. Founded in the 19th century around the Transisthmian railway, the city quickly established itself as a strategic maritime trade hub. Today, it is home to the world's second largest free trade zone. Boat is docked, no nautical activities are planned. Boarding and disembarkation port of call.



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## Excursions of your cruise

<b>Day 2 - Monday</b> SAMANA BAY / WHALES OBSERVATION SEAFARI*	Head off in a boat exclusively chartered for Club Med to meet humpback whales. During the mating season, hundreds of humpback whales come to the warm waters of the bay to breed. You will witness the amazing spectacle of the males leaping out of the water and the young whale calves swimming beside their mothers. On the way back, you'll have time to swim and enjoy the fine sandy beach at Cavo Levantado if wanted.
<b>Day 3 - Tuesday</b> PUERTO PLATA / CHOCOLAT EL CHOCAL*	Come meet this community of courageous women who have set up their own artisanal chocolate workshop. They will explain to you the different stages of chocolate manufacturing and what products they offer. The reputation of their "chocolate bar" is well established. You will discover the sumptuous landscapes of the Cordillera Central, the highest mountain range in the Caribbean with its Pico Duarte reaching 3175m. A beautiful moment of sharing that will leave you with a sweet taste!
<b>Day 3 - Tuesday</b> PUERTO PLATA / CITY TOUR*	Stop at Fort San Felipe, built in 1577 to protect the port from pirates, visit a cigar factory, an amber and larimar museum where you can carry information about these ancient stones. You will have the opportunity to see the street of umbrellas and the famous pink street in honor of Doña Blanca.
<b>Day 5 - Thursday</b> SAN SALVADOR - ESCAPADE À PINK SAND BEACH*	Immerse yourself in the incredible natural beauty of San Salvador's charming lagoon. Cross the island by minivan, then sail aboard a motorboat, crossing the mangroves, to the "pink sand beach", where you will enjoy a picnic on the beach with locally caught fish during this beautiful getaway!
<b>Day 5 - Thursday</b> SAN SALVADOR - ISLAND TOUR*	Set off on a half-day minibus tour to discover San Salvador Island. Admire the paradise beaches and the island's spectacular landscapes. Visit the historic sites, including the location of Christopher Columbus' first landing. Explore the villages and iconic viewpoints of the island. Enjoy a comfortable, guided tour with commentary from your local guide. Please note: guides speak English only; French-speaking guides are not available.
<b>Day 5 - Thursday</b> SAN SALVADOR - ESCAP TO CLUB MED COLUMBUS RESORT*	Enjoy an unforgettable day at Club Med Columbus during your San Salvador stopover. Relax on the resort's stunning beach and by the pool in a serene and luxurious setting. Make the most of your all-inclusive day pass, with meals and drinks included. A short minibus transfer from the Marina brings you straight to paradise. Sun, comfort, and ultimate relaxation await for a truly unique Bahamian experience.
<b>Day 7 - Saturday</b> BAHAMAS - EXUMA - EXTRAORDINAIRE EXUMA	Discover the crystal clear waters of this extraordinary place! You will appreciate its treasures and be surprised by unlikely encounters... The celebrities of Les Cays, the world famous swimming pigs. An experience full of adventures including: the beach with pigs, the harbor with sharks, snorkeling for the good swimmers and the magnificent sandbar!
<b>Day 8 - Sunday</b> LONG ISLAND - ISLAND TOUR*	Our tour begins at Gordon's Beach with a 45-minute drive to the first stop: the Long Island Museum which showcases local culture, customs and history. Then head to Hamilton's Cave – After the English-guided tour of one of the largest cave systems in the Bahamas, discover Dean's Blue Hole, one of the great wonders of the Bahamas. The Dean Blue Hole is the deepest in the world (202 meters) and also considered one of the most beautiful. End your tour in Clarence Town, the capital of Long Island and home to the beautiful twin churches. Transfer by minivan with English-speaking driver/guide.
<b>Day 8 - Sunday</b> LONG ISLAND - SUNBED & UMBRELLA*	For person who may wish to stay at Gordon's Beach and enjoy the day at the beach. Sunbed and one umbrella for 2 persons can be made available for rent. Advance booking only
<b>Day 13 - Friday</b> SANTA MARTA / SANTA MARTA CITY TOUR (1/2 day, morning)*	Come and explore the jewels of Santa Marta, the oldest city in Colombia, founded by the conquistadors in their search for El Dorado. Visit the Museo d'arte Bolivarino. You will visit the cathedral built in 1529 and see some of the stunning monuments that most represent the city, before heading to the Quinta de San Pedro, where the great liberator Simon Bolivar lived, which dates back to the 17th century. You will also get a chance to discover Colombian culture with a presentation of traditional songs and dances.
<b>Day 15 - Sunday</b> COLON / THE EMBERA INDIANS (1/2 day)*	Just a short distance from "civilisation" lies the Embera community, who still live entirely by tradition, building with natural fiber and palm leaves, wearing multicolored loinclothes and painting their bodies. You will travel by bus to the river, then take a 45-minute ride in a pirogue up a river that leads to their village. As you sit on the ground, you will observe their daily routines and learn about their way of life and culture, which mesh perfectly and sustainably with their environment.
<b>Day 15 - Sunday</b> COLON / PANAMA, BRIDGE OVER AMERICA (1 day)*	After an hour's drive, you'll arrive at the Miraflores Locks, where a visitor centre helps you to understand the impressive 20th century engineering. Then you'll explore Panama's colonial quarter, Casco Antiguo, and have lunch there. This lovely area was awarded Unesco World Heritage status in 1997. In the afternoon, wander the side streets of this stunning district, and discover the various colonial era churches, the Plaza de Francia and Plaza Bolivar. Take a look at the shops and craft stalls. This tour involves 3 hours of driving. The ship passage schedule is subject to last minute changes due to Panama Canal operations. The excursion itinerary may be changed. Return to Club Med 2 or transfer to the airport according to your flight schedule
<b>Day 15 - Sunday</b> COLON / NEW LOCKS AND SAN LORENZO*	Come and see the Agua Clara locks. The watchtower, which stands 60 m above sea level, offers an unbeatable view over Lake Gatún and the new Panama Canal locks. Passing over the Canal via the recent Atlantic Bridge to reach San Lorenzo. Visit by the forts of the time of pirates. There in the middle of the exuberant nature, between old stones and cannons you will find the atmosphere of pirates, filibusters and other privateers of the Old Continent! This tour is a 2 hours of driving.

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**Day 15 - Sunday**  
**COLON / GAMBOA (Lac**  
**Gatún) (journée complète)\***

Set off on an unforgettable adventure in Gamboa, where nature and engineering meet in harmony. Start your day with a stroll along the Panama Canal. Admire the lush flora and fauna: exotic birds, capuchin monkeys, and other animals hidden in the dense foliage. Then hop aboard a local cable car for a unique aerial experience above the jungle. Admire the spectacular panorama of rainforest, sparkling rivers and verdant hills. Discover the grandeur and diverse biodiversity of this unique region. Local buffet lunch included. Return transfer to the airport for your departure

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## Formalities

### HEALTH FORMALITIES

Recommended vaccinations: diphtheria, polio, tetanus, hepatitis A and B and typhoid. Some parasitic or viral diseases can be carried by mosquitoes during certain stopovers. The use of skin and clothing repellents is therefore recommended. Pregnant women who do not need constant medical supervision may come aboard, upon presentation of a medical certificate showing their due date and certifying that their pregnancy is compatible with the cruise. The final day of the cruise must be before the end of the 26th week of pregnancy. A doctor and a nurse are present on board.
