



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

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## Itinerary of your cruise

<b>Day 1 - Friday</b> MÁLAGA	Nestled on the Costa del Sol, Málaga beautifully combines a Mediterranean climate and a rich cultural heritage. As the birthplace of Pablo Picasso, visitors interested in Cubism can tour the artist's childhood home and a museum that houses over 200 of his works. Its historic centre, buzzing alleyways and urban beaches ensure the perfect balance between art, relaxation and an easy-going lifestyle. Boat is docked, no nautical activities are planned. Boarding and disembarkation port of call.
<b>Day 2 - Saturday</b> PUERTO BANUS/ MARBELLA	Located in Marbella, Puerto Banús is an iconic Andalusian marina. Famous for its glam vibe, it combines the charm of an old flower-lined town with the buzz of a modern destination. Bordered by chic beaches, the town has managed to preserve its authentic charm despite the development of hotels and modern residences. A stopover that combines luxury, Andalusian tradition, and an easy-going seaside lifestyle. Boat is docked, no nautical activities are planned.
<b>Day 3 - Sunday</b> TANGIER	At the crossroads of North and South, Tangier stretches in an amphitheatre above the sea, revealing its white facades bathed in light. A city of inspiration, it seduces with its magnetic charm, striking beauty and artistic atmosphere. A stopover between East and West, where the soul of Morocco is revealed with elegance. Boat at dock, no water activities planned.
<b>Day 4 - Monday</b> CEUTA	Located on the North African coast, the Spanish enclave of Ceuta is a unique destination where Europe and Africa meet. It is an eclectic melting pot with a rare cultural wealth that harmoniously blends Christian, Muslim, Hebrew, and Hindu traditions. Ceuta's multifaceted identity is captivating thanks to its mixed heritage and cosmopolitan atmosphere; it is a stopover that genuinely celebrates diversity. Boat is docked, no nautical activities are planned.
<b>Day 5 - Tuesday</b> GIBRALTAR	Gibraltar is a cultural crossroads for a unique experience that combines a British territory with the charm of Southern Spain. Eclectic architecture lines its narrow streets, the market showcases Andalusian traditions, and its famous red telephone boxes complete this Brit-meets-Med setting. It is an unusual stopover with bags of character, blending history and two cultural identities. Boat is docked, no nautical activities are planned.
<b>Day 6 - Wednesday</b> MOTRIL	The city's historic centre showcases traditional Hispano-Arab urban design, where every landmark is a chapter in Andalusian history. The Encarnación Church, built on the foundations of an ancient mosque, rubs shoulders with the elegant Baroque town hall. The Virgen de la Cabeza Sanctuary is on the site where King Boabdil's mother once lived, completing this discovery-packed cultural journey. Motril is the capital of the Tropical Coast, blending fascinating heritage, spirituality, and architecture. Boat is docked, no nautical activities are planned.
<b>Day 7 - Thursday</b> CARTAGENA	Cartagena is a former mining town with brightly-coloured Andalusian houses and arid landscapes that only add to the charm and authenticity of this Mediterranean destination. A culturally diverse town with a unique artistic heritage that will whisk you back in time. Boat is docked, no nautical activities are planned.
<b>Day 8 - Friday</b> ALICANTE	Nicknamed the White Citadel by the Greeks and the City of Light by the Romans, this destination combines history and Mediterranean charm. Its historic quarter, bustling port, and sunny beaches showcase its deep connection with the sea. Boat is docked, no nautical activities are planned. Boarding and disembarkation port of call.



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## Excursions of your cruise

<p><b>Day 2 - Saturday</b>  <b>PUERTO BANUS / MIJAS</b>                      (1/2 day)*</p>	<p>This picturesque white village, clinging to the side of the mountain, will amaze you with the spectacular views it offers from the summits of Sierra de Mijas to the Mediterranean Coast. You will discover the sanctuary of the Virgin of La Peña, her secrets and legends,</p>
<p><b>Day 4 - Monday</b>  <b>CEUTA / PANORAMIC</b>  <b>TOUR OF CEUTA*</b></p>	<p>Discover the main sights of Ceuta, this autonomous city of Spain located on the African coast. Take the scenic route into the hills to Monte Hacho. And finish with the discovery of the old town of Ceuta. The nerve center of this multicultural city is the majestic Plaza de Nuestra Señora de África.</p>
<p><b>Day 5 - Tuesday</b>  <b>GIBRALTAR*</b></p>	<p>First Stop is Europa Point, on a clear day you can see the North African coast on the other side of the Straits of Gibraltar. You can also see the Spanish enclave of Ceuta, a Spanish occupied territory in Morocco. Along the way you have breathtaking views of the Bay of Gibraltar. The Second Stop is St. Michael's Cave, a very large cave with stalactites and stalagmites, dating back millions of years. Our Third Stop is the Apes Den. You will then go to the Upper Galleries, the Moorish Castle, Old Town Calpe and along Queensway. You will enjoy some free time for shopping at the Market Place.</p>
<p><b>Day 6 - Wednesday</b>  <b>MOTRIL / GRANADA</b>                      (1 day)*</p>	<p>Granada's Islamic history has bequeathed a marvel of Muslim art, the Alhambra. Dominating the modern city, Andalusia's most emblematic monument is at once a royal city, a fortress and a palace dating back to the 13th century. Near the palace, you'll also discover the marvellous Andalusian gardens of the Generalife, former country residence of the emirs (2h by bus return). Passport number required for registration and PI required for entry to the Alhambra. Places limited to 20 people and non-refundable. French guide.</p>
<p><b>Day 6 - Wednesday</b>  <b>MOTRIL / WALKING</b>  <b>TOUR OF GRANADA*</b></p>	<p>Departing from Motril, you will travel to Granada for a guided walking tour of the historic city center. You will admire the Cathedral and the Royal Chapel (outside views), key landmarks of Spanish history. Stroll through lively streets filled with charming squares and historic façades. The tour continues in the iconic Albaicín district, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. From its whitewashed lanes, enjoy beautiful views over the city and the Sierra Nevada. After some free time, you will return to Motril.</p>
<p><b>Day 7 - Thursday</b>  <b>CARTAGENA /</b>  <b>CARTAGENA (1/2 day)*</b></p>	<p>Discover Cartagena from a new perspective with an unforgettable excursion! Take the panoramic elevator for stunning views, immerse yourself in history at the Roman theater, and explore the fascinating Roman Museum. Travel through the centuries!</p>

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## Formalities

### CUSTOMS FORMALITIES

For all UK citizens, a valid passport is essential when you travel abroad. A full 10-year passport is required for holidays to all countries featured on our website. The passport must be valid for at least 6 months beyond your return date with one blank visa page. Make sure your passport is valid and check with the embassy or the consulate of your destination country if you need a visa for your chosen destination prior to travel. It is vital that the name given when booking your holiday (printed on the ticket and itinerary) is exactly the same as written on your passport. Any child, however old, must have his/her own passport. Please note Club Med cannot be held responsible for any issue with regards to passport or visas.

### HEALTH FORMALITIES

Safe Together.

Club Med has implemented new hygiene and safety measures to offer you peace of mind and a most joyful experience.

As part of the fight against Covid-19, health measures at the borders are being reinforced and may in particular require a virological screening test (for example PCR test) depending on your country of origin, transit or destination before your departure and/or before your return.

We suggest you obtain more information from the consular services of the countries concerned or on the website of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of your nationality and/or place of residence.

Recommended vaccinations: diphtheria, polio, tetanus, hepatitis A and B and typhoid.

Pregnant women who do not need constant medical supervision may come aboard, upon presentation of a medical certificate showing their due date and certifying that their pregnancy is compatible with the cruise.

The final day of the cruise must be before the end of the 26th week of pregnancy.

A doctor and a nurse are present on board.
